Sunday's Readings:

First Reading - When the people grumbled to Moses for water in the desert, the LORD heard and brought forth water from the rock for all to drink (Exodus 17:3-7).

Psalm - If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts (Psalm 95).

Second Reading - God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:1-2, 5-8).

Gospel - Ask, and you will be given living water so that you will never thirst again (John 4:5-42 [5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42]).

THIRSTING FOR LIFE-GIVING WATERS

Especially during the Lenten, Holy Week, and Easter seasons, the prayer texts of the Eastern Church revel in paradoxical images of Christ: the eternal life who is put to death, the host of the supper who is also its meal, the thirsty crucified one with living water streaming from his side. These images flow from the evangelists' portrayals of Jesus and from his very ministry, during which he often upset or reversed people's expectations about him or the ways of God. This "reversal" is at play in today's Gospel, as Jesus speaks to an enemy foreigner who is also a woman beneath his status. In addition he, the thirsting one, shows the woman to be the one truly thirsting. He—whose parched lips will say "I thirst" before he dies—is the source of life and life-giving water. Lent calls upon us to dwell on how each of us is thirsting for Christ, and it leads us, ultimately, back to the life-giving waters of our baptism into his Body.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To My Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace,

This weekend is Promotion Sunday for the Catholic Services Appeal 2017. We will be showing a video before all the Masses from Bishop Persico which will explain this appeal in more detail. Hopefully you have received in the mail a copy of the special Catholic Services Appeal edition of *Faith Magazine* and have taken the time to read it as well as the letter I sent this week to all parishioners.

Here is quote from the Bishop's letter found in the Faith Magazine- "The theme we selected for this year's Catholic Services Appeal, With Open Hearts, was chosen because we are in a moment of significant transition. Change means challenges — it tests our generosity and our readiness to adjust. But the heart pictured on our cover reminds us that at the center of our lives as Catholics is love. The Catholic Services Appeal gives us a concrete way to live out our faith and to express our love for those in need. Please consider making a sacrificial gift to the Catholic Services Appeal this year. Through your ongoing generosity, the services we offer together, as a diocese, will not only strengthen our parishes, but also help more people experience God's abundant love for them, always offered in the name of his Son." I would add that the key principle to remember is that we all make up the Diocese of Erie and are not separate from it. This appeal reinforces our connection.

However, as I mentioned in my letter, our parish also benefits each year from the CSA. Every dollar raised over our assessment from the Diocese (this year is \$172,715) stays in our parish to fund a different project. This year the projects identified by our parish Properties Committee in conjunction with our Finance Council are the Parish Office Roof and an automated front door of the church for accessibility. The estimated cost of these projects is \$37,825. In order to fund these projects our overall financial goal for CSA 2017 is \$210,000. Below is a summary of the numbers for CSA 2017:

Last year, the parish pledged \$196,151 and we were able to update the sound system in the church (that is being finished this week!). I am aware that this is an increase from the last few years but I am also aware that our capital needs are substantial and I believe Our Lady of Peace is capable of reaching, if not exceeding, this ambitious goal.

There are pledge envelopes in the pews-you can take one with you or use the one received in the mail or just wait to fill one out next weekend. The key is to prayerfully consider your response this year and be ready to make your pledge on Commitment Sunday (next weekend- March 25/26).

If you are not able to financially support the CSA this year, please still consider a spiritual sacrifice of prayer and fasting. We all need to do our part and the spiritual "coverage" is essential as well. Please send in or drop off your pledge card whether or not you are making a financial pledge to let me know you received it and are invested in our spiritual family one way or the other. Please know that I truly appreciate all the sacrifices you and your family

make for our parish and Diocese. Be assured of my constant prayers.

May God bless our Lent and our week ahead!
