ON THE ROAD

One central metaphor employed to describe the Christian life is a journey. In today's second reading, Peter addresses the early Christian community: "Conduct yourselves with reverence during the time of your sojourning" (1 Peter 1:17). When we think of a journey, we normally think of some kind of movement from point A to point B. The Christian journey, begun in the waters of baptism (point A) has as its ultimate destination eternal life with God in heaven (point B). Unfortunately we find ourselves on all kinds of detours along the way. Because of sin, we make foolish turns and sometimes seem unable to detect the presence of the Lord. Today's story of the two disciples on their way to Emmaus illustrates for us the fact that, even when we are dejected or on one of our many detours, the Lord is there, walking right beside us.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To My Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace,

Congratulations to our young parishioners who are receiving the great gift of the Eucharist for the first time this weekend and next! Every year I pray that our celebration with them and their eagerness to receive Holy Communion can be a source of renewal for all of us in our appreciation and hunger for God's spiritual nourishment offered in the Eucharist.

It is also a good time to review the rubrics on how to receive Communion, which reinforce the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and therefore the special care and reverence we should display when doing so. Recall that we are asked to make a simple gesture of reverence as we come before the minister and are presented with the Sacred Host or Precious Blood as a way to honor Jesus' special presence there (a slight bow at the waist is appropriate). When the host or precious blood is offered by the minister, we respond with a heartfelt "Amen." This response means "so be it" or "I believe" and is a way of affirming our belief that Jesus is truly, substantially present there in the Eucharist. It is not as appropriate to say "I am" or some other option. Yes we are all part of the Body of Christ but at this moment in receiving Holy Communion we are focusing on the real presence in the Eucharist. We are affirming our belief in Him, not on the eventual result of Mass which is that we become more fully the Body of Christ through our participation.

Then we are invited to receive the Sacred Host on the tongue or in the hand. Those receiving on the tongue are asked to open their mouths wide and to offer their tongues so that the minister does not need to stick their fingers in the communicant's mouth. Those receiving in the hand consider what St. Cyril of Jerusalem said: "When you approach Holy Communion, make the left hand into a throne for the right, which will receive the king." Pope Paul VI added, "Then, with your lower hand, take the consecrated host and place it in your mouth." For those who receive Communion on the hand, please be sure and follow this practice (for those who are left-handed like me, it would be the opposite). Receiving one-handed or cupping the hand or grabbing with our fingers are not the right way to receive and leads to mishandling or flopping the Eucharist around which is not appropriate. After receiving the host, we are expected to place it in our mouths immediately and consume it. It is not acceptable to take the host with you back to your seat or elsewhere. There is not a set rubric for the moment after reception other than you are asked to step off to the side right away if you prefer to make the sign of the cross or any other personal gestures. That allows the procession to continue in a timely fashion.

I know this is quite detailed but hopefully it reinforces the importance of this moment and that it should not be taken lightly. I would not get into such detail if we were all following these expectations and I hope you know my overall goal is to help us all grow in our devotion to the Eucharist and the God who is incredibly present there!

May God bless our First Communicants and our week ahead!

****40th Anniversary of the Dedication of Our Lady of Peace Church**
On **Monday, May 15th** we will be celebrating the 40th anniversary of the dedication of our church building with a **Mass at 6:30pm and a reception afterward**. Bishop Persico will be the main celebrant and Msgr. Charles Kaza, who was the parochial vicar when the church was dedicated in 1977, will be the homilist. Please mark your calendars now and plan on being a part of this special celebration for our parish.

****Pastoral Council Nominations** There is an insert in today's bulletin soliciting nominations for the Pastoral Council here at OLP to replace the 4 members who are completing their terms. It also explains the purpose of the council as well as indicating the present members. This is a new process for selecting new members to allow for a broader representation of the parish. You are asked to **write a letter to the council outlining your reasons for nominating** your candidate (or yourself) and then **your nominee is asked to sign it as an indication that they accept** the nomination. The letters of nomination are to be **turned into the parish office by Monday, May 21st**. Please be praying about this and take the time to consider nominating someone to the Pastoral Council as they lead our parish forward in the years ahead.

****Eucharistic Adoration Opportunities** First Friday Adoration is this week from 7:30am-3pm. Also the next Holy Hour of Adoration for Youth and Vocations is Monday, May 8th at 7pm.

****Catholic Service Appeal 2017** We have had a great response to our CSA so far with 559 pledges at \$219,363. That means that we have reached both our Diocesan assessment of \$172,000 and our parish goal of \$210,000! This allows our Diocesan Church to continue its important leadership and ministries throughout Northwest PA as well as our parish to put a new handicap accessible door at the main entrance of our church and replace the roof of our offices. I thank everyone who has generously responded so far. If you have not yet contributed to the CSA, please still consider a pledge. The additional funds we raise will be directed toward a permanent solution to handicap accessibility for the basement social room.

****The Easter Season** We continue to celebrate Easter until Pentecost Sunday (June 4th). The fifty days of the Easter Season (recall that Pentecost is a word meaning fifty) is longer than the forty days of Lent. It reminds us that for those who are Christian the joy and hope of the resurrection trumps the suffering and struggle of the cross. We keep the decorations up in church and look forward to some great celebrations for our parish during this great season- First Communion on April 30th and May 7th, Confirmation on May 12th, the 40th Anniversary of the dedication of our church on May 15th and Ascension Thursday on May 25th to name a few. We have much to be grateful for at Our Lady of Peace so let us keep the Easter Momentum going..... now and forever.

****Canada Pilgrimage** I am excited to announce that I will be leading a pilgrimage to **Montreal and Quebec** from **September 29-October 5, 2017**. The **cost is \$1,979** and includes bus transportation, six nights stay at hotels, nine meals, and entrance fees to shrines. Highlights include the Canadian North American Martyrs Shrine in Midland, ON; St. Joseph Oratory in Montreal; the Saint Kateri Tekakwitha Shrine in Montreal; & the National Shrine of Sainte Anne-de-Beaupre in Quebec.
