**THE EMMAUS PRAYER**

Lord Jesus. Hear our prayer for the spiritual renewal of priests.

We praise you for giving their ministry to the Church.

In these days, renew them with the gifts of your Spirit.

You once opened the Scriptures to the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Now renew your ordained ministers with the truth and power of your Word.

In Eucharist, you gave the Emmaus disciples renewed life and hope. Nourish priests with your own Body and Blood. Help them to imitate in their lives the death and resurrection they celebrate at your altar.

Give priests enthusiasm for the Gospel, zeal for the salvation of all, courage in leadership, humility in service, fellowship with one another and with all their brothers and sisters in You.

For you love them, Lord Jesus, and we love and pray for them in Your Name.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ and is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." This feast originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264.

On this feast we are called to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. The opening prayer at Mass calls our attention to Jesus' suffering and death and our worship of Him, especially in the Eucharist. At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body where He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serve as a sign of common faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and as an expression of adoration of God. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others. In following with this tradition, we will have a brief procession with the Blessed Sacrament here at Our Lady of Peace after the 11am Mass. The procession will be led through the church and conclude in the chapel where Adoration will continue until 4pm. At 4pm we will have Benediction (a special blessing given with the Eucharist).

If you have never experienced Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, this is a great invitation to do so on the feast in which the church throughout the world celebrates the gift of the Eucharist in an intensified way. I hope you will take advantage of this great opportunity to give thanks to God for the gift of the Eucharist as the true source and summit of our Christian life!

May God bless our week ahead!

**\*\*Fortnight for Freedom** The Fortnight for Freedom is from June 21—the vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More—to July 4, Independence Day. Since 2010, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have encouraged dioceses around the country to highlight the importance of defending religious freedom as we approach Independence Day. "Religion [cannot] be relegated to the inner sanctum of personal life, without influence on societal and national life." -Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, 183. If religious liberty is not respected, all people suffer and are deprived of the essential contribution to the common good, be it in education, health care, feeding the hungry, civil rights, and social services that the Church and other people of faith make every day, both here at home and overseas. This will be a special intention at our daily Masses during this stretch and I encourage you to find ways to incorporate this intention in your daily prayers. Also, our daily parish rosary at 11:40am will include this intention. 




