BEARING THE RIGHT KIND OF FRUIT

Today's readings focus our attention on vineyards. Isaiah's song concerning his friend's vineyard begins with inspiring and poetic images of an idyllic vineyard where the choicest harvest is expected. Instead, the vineyard yields wild grapes, which causes the owner to abandon it. The psalmist cries out to God, asking that God once again take care of the vineyard, which is the house of Israel. The parable told in today's Gospel offers a stern warning that those who commit treachery in the hopes of attaining personal wealth will be "put . . . to a wretched death" (Matthew 21:41). Jesus warns his listeners not to act like the murderous tenants in the vineyard. Instead he exhorts them to produce the kind of fruit that will lead them to the kingdom of God.

From Fr. Kyle...

Well, it has been almost four months since my ordination to the priesthood and almost three months now since I first arrived here at Our Lady of Peace Church. I just wanted to take a moment to tell you a little about my experience here so far and to thank you all for how good you have been to me. These first few months in the priesthood have been extraordinary in many ways. Offering the Sacrifice of the Mass every day has been more amazingly profound than I had ever dreamt it would be. Hearing confessions has been both intimidating and exhilarating. Offering the Lord's pardon and peace in this sacrament is an incredible privilege and gift that I enjoy exercising for all of you.

I have had numerous visits to the hospitals and nursing homes, where I have been present to people in their hour of suffering and have given them the healing of Anointing of the Sick, as well as the Lord Himself in the Blessed Sacrament. Several people have told me afterwards about what these visits and sacraments meant to them in their time of need.

Preaching every day has been difficult, but what another awesome and joyful part of my ministry it is. In addition to these central parts of my sacred ministry, I have also been filled with joy at all the encounters I have had already with so many of you in other settings. Visiting the students over at the school and having fun with them in gym class has been a great joy, and the various parish events, like the bonfires and the parish picnic, have been a blast.

The adjustment I have faced in entering the life and ministry of a priest, especially in coming here to this very large parish, has not been easy. In fact, sometimes I have felt a bit overwhelmed by it all, as you can probably imagine. Not only am I being immersed in many things for the first time, but I have never been part of this large of a parish before. For me, it has been comparable to a goldfish being taken out of the fish bowl and thrown into the ocean. I can also say, however, that this ocean is full of many excellent fish. All the people here have given me an incomparable welcome, and the Lord has been causing my love for you to grow with each passing day. You have been so kind and generous to me during this major transition in my life, as I have been striving to settle into the rhythm of priestly life here at Our Lady of Peace Church. I cannot be thankful enough for all the support that you have shown me through your kind words, gestures, and prayers. I am so blessed and happy to be here with all of you in my first priestly assignment, and I look forward to all the time that I will have with you in the years ahead.

Please continue to pray for me because I am a poor, young rookie priest, who desires to get to know all of you and serve you in the best way I can in this awesome vocation the Lord has given me. Be assured that all of you are always in my prayers as well.






