THE DEMANDS OF DISCIPLESHIP

Today we encounter readings that already have a Lenten feel about them. Nineveh undergoes a forty-day fast, the psalmist reminds us that God alone can show sinners the way, Paul shows us how fleeting the things and events of this world are, and Jesus cries out "Repent!" before he calls his new followers. "Come after me," Jesus says, but if we are to truly live out the commands and demands of our discipleship through baptism, we must first know our need for conversion, our repentance, our need to believe in the gospel fully. Today's Gospel opens with the stark reminder of what befell John the Baptist for completely living out his vocation as the herald of Christ and the gospel: he was arrested, imprisoned, and martyred. Though few of us will experience consequences that extreme, we must all be ready to risk some sort of rejection as, heeding the call of Jesus, we live out the kingdom of God at hand, repent of our sins, and believe in the good news of salvation.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Last Friday, Fr. Kyle, Kathleen Peterson and I joined over fifty other youth and adults from Our Lady of Peace and St. George in making a pilgrimage to Washington DC to participate in the March for Life. We joined hundreds of other youth and adults from our Diocese (as well as the hundreds of thousands of people from the whole country) in peacefully and prayerfully marching for the protection of unborn life.

Here's a little history on the March... late in October 1973, grassroots pro-life leaders became concerned that January 22, 1974, might come and go without properly memorializing the Supreme Court's infamous abortion decision Roe v. Wade, that legalized abortion in the United States, and without petitioning Congress for redress. So about thirty pro-life veterans resolved themselves into a committee and began making grassroots plans for the first March for Life. On January 22, 1974, the first March for Life was held on the West Steps of the Capitol. An estimated 20,000 committed pro-life Americans rallied that day on behalf of our pre-born brothers and sisters. The numbers of marchers grew over the years to a point where now the average is 200-300,000 marchers.

We have a moral responsibility to stand and pray for life as Catholic-Christians, and not to rest until the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court Decision to legalize abortion federally is overturned. We emphasize this social justice issue not in silence of other social injustices, but as THE foundational social justice issue. We desire a society and nation that first and foremost respects and protects the right to life of all human beings from conception and then builds on respecting and protecting life at all stages. A moral system that does not grant this most fundamental right to life is distorted and not sustainable. In February 2002, the Catholic Church established that throughout the United States, January 22nd would be observed as a day of prayer and penance against abortion: *"In all the dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life... General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 373."* This January 22nd is the 45th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade.

With that purpose in mind, we will have a holy hour of Eucharistic Adoration on **Monday, January 22nd from 7-8pm to pray for the legal protection of the unborn.** I encourage you to join in this prayer or find another way to engage in special prayer and fasting for this important intention.

May God bless all the unborn and our week ahead!

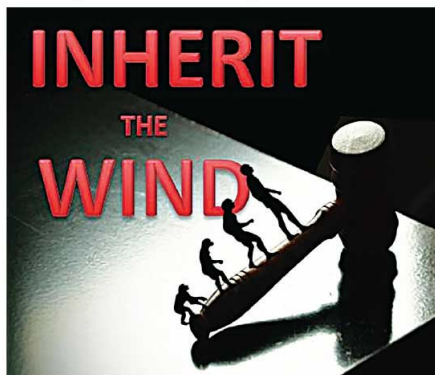

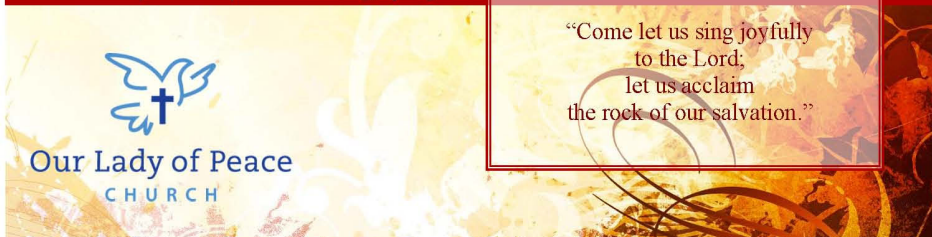
