

Second Reading - Do everything for the glory of God (1 Corinthians 10:31 - 11:1).

Gospel - The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean (Mark 1:40-45).

GIVE GOD THE GLORY

A curious feature of the first half of Mark's Gospel is the pattern of Jesus working a miracle, then telling the recipient of the miracle to keep still about it. Many theories have been offered: Mark is setting the stage for the great "secret" revealed when Peter will proclaim Jesus the Messiah at Caesarea Philippi; more skeptical commentators offer that Jesus, fully aware of human nature, knew that the way to spread the news was to tell people to keep it secret. The insight into this secret-keeping that serves us well, however, is that Jesus was initiating his public ministry according to the pattern that Paul describes. He was doing it for the glory of God—not for his own benefit, but for that of all. Paul would later write in Philippians that Jesus "humbled" himself to become like us. And we see this humility at work in today's healing of the leper. Jesus is trying to reveal the presence of God's reign among the people, not so that he himself might receive the glory, but so that God would be glorified through him. Imitating this pattern, which Paul encourages the Jewish and Greek Christian factions in Corinth to do, still serves us well today.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

It is hard to believe that Lent, our "great annual Catholic retreat," is already upon us. This is a special time we set apart as Catholics to recommit to the basic Christian disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving in order to grow in our relationship with God and make more room for Him in our hearts and in our lives. We begin that journey this **Ash Wednesday when we will have Masses at 7am, 9am (school Mass), 12:10pm, and 7pm. There will also be a Service for Distribution of Ashes at 5:30pm.** Recall that this is not a holy day of obligation but Mass is still a noble way to start this great season of grace. It is also a day of abstinence from meat for Catholics 14 years and older (as are all the Fridays in Lent), and a day of fasting for Catholics age 18-59. Those obligated to fast may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain one's strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

I cannot encourage you enough to make a plan NOW for your Lenten commitments in those areas of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (giving to the poor). Here are some opportunities at OLP to consider to intensify your spiritual commitment during Lent: **DAILY MASS** (it has been a powerful Catholic tradition to commit to this prayer more regularly during Lent); **Daily Rosary** is said at 11:35am in the main church from Monday through Friday; **Stations of the Cross** at 7pm on all Fridays during Lent; **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** on Friday, March 2nd from 7:30am-3pm and Holy Hours on Sundays, February 25th and March 11th from 7-8pm; "**24 Hours for the Lord**" at St. Peter Cathedral on March 9th at 5pm thru the 10th til 5pm with Adoration and Confessions available; **Operation Rice Bowl** (given to all parish children and stapled into this bulletin) to support Catholic Relief Services; **The Bible and the Sacraments Sessions** on Tuesdays in Lent from 7-9pm (see elsewhere for full schedule); and our local **Lenten Penance Services**- Blessed Sacrament, Tuesday, March 13th at 7pm; St. Jude, Thursday, March 15th at 7pm; **OLP, Sunday, March 18th at 6pm**; and St. George, Sunday, March 25th at 7pm.

In addition to these communal opportunities, there are many personal spiritual commitments to explore and consider. Whatever you decide, Lent should look different for us as Catholics so let's get ready to begin to renew our spiritual health... may God bless our week and Lent ahead!

**** 125th Anniversary of St. Peter Cathedral** Bishop Persico has invited all parishes in the Northern Vicariate (Region) of our Diocese to join him in **celebrating the 125th Anniversary of St. Peter Cathedral on Sunday, February 11th at the 11am Mass.** I will be there to concelebrate and you are encouraged to attend this Mass

at St. Peters with our bishop (obviously you would not be expected to attend Mass at OLP that weekend as well).

****Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2018 Commitment Sunday**

To summarize our CSA 2018- our parish goal is \$220,000 with \$172,559 designated for our diocesan assessment and the remainder going to our parish projects- which include renovation of the church restrooms, repainting and re-carpeting the parish office hallway and offices and the replacement of the outdoor mushroom lights around the church. Ideally you are asked to bring your pledge envelope to Mass this weekend and include it in the offertory (to symbolically reinforce that this is part of your offering to God at Mass). Remember that if you are not able to make a financial pledge, that your spiritual pledge of prayer and fasting are just as important and it let's me know that you are committed to our mission so please still hand in a pledge envelope. Envelopes are also available at Mass if you do not bring yours. If you are not prepared to make your pledge this weekend, then you are welcome to include it in the offertory at Mass over the next month or mail it to or drop it off at the office. One way or the other, make sure you get it to us and it would be great if we all could make our pledge by the end of February to see where we stand with our goal. Thank you for your support!

****Community Gatherings Coming Soon**

I received a lot of great feedback on the Appreciation Diner we had back in January. One of the main comments was how great it was to gather with others in the parish and reconnect with old friends or to meet new ones. We have two more opportunities for this same type of community building in the next two months. We will have our annual **Mardi Gras Party on Tuesday, February 13th from 5-7pm.** And our **St. Joseph Table (which we have celebrated the last three years) will take place on Monday, March 19th after a 5:30pm Mass for the feast of St. Joseph.** Look elsewhere in the bulletin for details on Mardi Gras and keep an eye out for more information on the St. Joseph Table in the next month. Mark your calendars and be a part of strengthening our parish family's bond.

****OLP School Registration for 2018/19**

It is not too late to consider Our Lady of Peace School as an option for your children or to encourage your family or friends to consider our school for their children. There are great things happening at our school and I/we need your help to get the word out! I also want to make it clear that there are financial aids available to families for whom the cost of tuition is prohibitive. Please do not presume you cannot afford it. Come see me or our principal, Lisa Panighetti, or our Director of Advancement Kathy Grisier to see what options may be available to you before you decide you cannot send your child/children there. I ask all parents in our parish with school aged children to seriously discern Our Lady of Peace School for your children.

As our Bible Study of the Gospel of St. Mark comes to a conclusion, I want to encourage you to participate in our next adult formation Lenten Series called "The Bible and the Sacraments." It will take place on the **Tuesdays of Lent starting on February 20th from 7-9pm in the main church.** It will include video presentations and does require registration or homework. You are welcome to come for one or all of the presentations. There will be fellowship after all the sessions. See elsewhere in the bulletin for more details and please consider incorporating this adult formation opportunity in your Lenten plan.


2018 Catholic Services Appeal



OLP Casserole Club

Maria House Project has received about 20-25 **casseroles** or food items a month for over seven years through the "**casserole network.**" This is an informal network of folks who prepare, freeze and bring them to Our Lady of Peace.



Maria House Project is a home mission in the Diocese of Erie, founded by Fr. James Peterson (Fr. Pete) in 1971 that provides small group living for 30-35 men needing community to heal from alcohol and drug addiction, isolation, and mental and emotional problems. Some are on parole, some are war veterans, some are homeless. All are working at recovery! Since Maria House Project is not government funded, it is impossible to exist without volunteers. The OLP "**Casserole Club**" provides a way to volunteer with an occasional or monthly **casserole**.

The February **casseroles** can be delivered to the **OLP Social Room (downstairs) on Saturday, February 17th, from 3:30 to 4:30PM.** **Casseroles** should be cooked, frozen in a disposable container, with directions for re-heating attached.
