Rwanda is a small country situated in the heart of Africa that in 1994 experienced a horrific genocide that was politically motivated during which one million people were murdered in approximately 100 days. The genocide left behind many broken hearted like orphans, widows, traumatized..., and many destroyed infrastructures like schools, medical centers, even churches. The good news is that now there is peace in the country. The challenge is to rebuild the Church and nation and to help people to recover from genocide.

Pastorally, in the years since the genocide, the Diocese of Butare has focused its mission on the catholic education for the youth who are the future of Rwanda, impressing upon them the themes of unconditional love, peace and reconciliation so that the country may heal and experience a brighter tomorrow. Catholic education plays a great role not only in teaching the youth sciences but also in teaching them Catholic faith which help them to form their moral conscience based on Christian values. This effort has made a great difference and has contributed tremendously to the building of a new Church and the nation we see today.



The Church in Rwanda is flourishing. Today, 60% of the country's population is Catholic. Many young men and women respond to God's call to priestly and religious life. There is a brighter future for the Church in Rwanda.

We want to carry on this mission, but we have limited resources. Through your support we can build more classrooms and train our seminarians and carry on the mission of making the love Christ known. Thank you for your generous sacrifice for our mission. We thank your Pastor and your Bishop for inviting me to share our mission.

**Please pray this week for the priests and deacons of the Diocese of Erie who will be gathering for our annual Emmaus Convocation in Latrobe, PA. The Emmaus prayer is included in the bulletin. This is a chance for the clergy to join in prayer, fellowship, recreation and learning so as to strengthen our priestly fraternity and zeal. Please note that there will be NO Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and there will be a Communion Service held at 12:10pm each day. Thank you for your prayers and know that Father Kyle and I will be praying for all of you!

- **Congratulations to the 5 newest members of the OLP Pastoral Council! See the Council Corner for who they are and other information. I also want to thank Skip Christenson, Kathy Grieser and Liz Swantek who just ended their time on the council. Skip and Liz served for 6 years and Kathy for 5. The other two council members that our newly selected replace are Sean Calhoun and Dominic Sisinni who both moved away from Erie this past year. Sean had served for several years and Dominic moved right after he was selected last year. On behalf of our whole parish family, I thank all of them for their willingness to lead and serve our community in this important role.
- **OLP Welcome Committee A new Welcome Committee is being established here at OLP at the initiative of the Pastoral Council. This committee will oversee all activity in this area which will include (but is not limited to) reaching out to new parishioners, new parishioner welcome events, new parishioner mentoring, outreach at

baptisms, and identifying potential new parish members. Please contact me at the office if you are interested in being a part of this committee or if you have any questions.

- **Fortnight for Freedom The Fortnight for Freedom is from June 21-the vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More- to July 4, Independence Day. Since 2010, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have encouraged dioceses around the country to highlight the importance of defending religious freedom as we approach Independence Day. "Religion [cannot] be relegated to the inner sanctum of personal life, without influence on societal and national life." -Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium, 183. If religious liberty is not respected, all people suffer and are deprived of the essential contribution to the common good, be it in education, health care, feeding the hungry, civil rights, and social services that the Church and other people of faith make every day, both here at home and overseas. This will be a special intention at our daily Masses during this stretch and I encourage you to find ways to incorporate this intention in your daily prayers. Also, our daily parish rosary at 11:35am will include this intention. For more information on this important initiative of the US Bishops, I encourage you to check out their website at www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/religiousliberty/index.cfm
- **Properties Update There will be a lot of construction and renovation activity on the parish and school grounds over the next 3 months. Here is a quick overview- One, we are replacing the boilers in the school (paid by the parish); **Two**, there will be a new entrance created for the school so that all visitors will have to enter through the office (paid by ECSS). It will include a ramp which will make the main floor of our school handicap accessible for the first time; Three- the second floor science lab will renovated which will include asbestos remediation in all rooms involved (paid by ECSS); Four-a new sign will be installed on Pacific Avenue for the new Erie Catholic School System of which our school is now apart (paid by ECSS); **Five**- the church/office hallway will get a facelift (paid by parish CSA 2018) which will include the restrooms (more for the men's since it has not been touched in years), new carpet and painting in the hallway and new painting in the parish offices; Six- a new picnic pavilion will be erected by the playground at the initiative of the Knights of Columbus. For this last project I want to thank the Knights and all the other parish groups who have committed to fund it. They are- the Knights (\$12,000); the Rosary Society (\$5,000); the Athletic Board (\$2,000) and the Boy Scouts ((\$1,000). Please be patient if any of these renovations cause inconvenience to our normal routine and let's be grateful for the new life and generosity they represent!


Men's Faith Sharing Group Conformed to Christ
