**JOHN THE BAPTIST**

Since June 24 falls on a Sunday this year, the Church has the opportunity for a more intense celebration of the birth of John the Baptist, who is often described as the last of the Old Testament prophets and the bridge between Judaism and Christianity. More commonly, John is known as the "precursor" of our Lord Jesus Christ. All the Gospels report John's basic message: Repent, the kingdom is near at hand. One greater than I is coming.

Though he was a wandering preacher who dressed in camel skins and ate grasshoppers, John's legacy is one of true royalty. His origins are similar to those foretold by God through the prophet Isaiah: "You are my servant, he said to me, Israel through whom I show my glory" (Isaiah 49:3). John's humility—"I am not he"—was surpassed only by that of his Lord Jesus, the humble servant who followed.

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Happy Nativity of St. John the Baptist! Today's feast is one of the few that still gets celebrated even when it falls on a Sunday which reinforces the importance of St. John the Baptist and his role of preparing the people for Jesus. So let's honor him this weekend and embrace his message of preparation through repentance and mercy as well as imitating his example of pointing others to the "Lamb of God" who is Jesus Christ.

On another note, thank you for your prayers last week while the priests and deacons of the Erie Diocese were away for our Emmaus Convocation. I continue to be impressed with the morale of our clergy AND laity of our Diocesan Church despite all that has been going on with the Pennsylvania Grand Jury regarding child abuse. I am grateful for all of you who have expressed support as well as asking how I am doing with all of this. As I have expressed to you in the past, I continue to be hopeful that God will bring new life and growth from this darkness. In communicating to all of you, I have tried to find a fine line of not ignoring the issue but also not obsessing/overstating it.

With that goal in mind, I do want to warn you that the final Grand Jury Report will be made public soon. I believe this will be the lowest point of this whole process, with much media coverage and details of abuses from the past. It will be hard but we will persevere. I always tell you to focus your energy on what you know and not what might or could happen so I do not want to say much more about this. But I also know that forewarning can help absorb some of the shock that can come from difficult news. So let's pray for the grace to absorb this news with dignity and grace and then wait to see what we have to deal with.

**\*\*Fr. Kyle's First Anniversary of Ordination** Congratulations to Fr. Kyle who celebrated his first anniversary of ordination on June 9<sup>th</sup>! Let's keep him in our prayers and thank God for his ministry here at OLP. Also, Fr. Kyle has been away for 3

weekends of ordinations of friends from the seminary over the last month and a half in case you have been wondering about his absence. I thank Fr. Shane for taking on extra Masses (and Fr. Jamie Power a few weeks ago) to allow Fr. Kyle to do this. It is a great blessing to be able to join your brother seminarians for their ordination weekends in other diocese so thank you for your support and understanding.

**\*\*Fortnight for Freedom** The Fortnight for Freedom is from June 21—the vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More—to July 4, Independence Day. Since 2010, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have encouraged dioceses around the country to highlight the importance of defending religious freedom as we approach Independence Day. "Religion [cannot] be relegated to the inner sanctum of personal life, without influence on societal and national life." -Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, 183. If religious liberty is not respected, all people suffer and are deprived of the essential contribution to the common good, be it in education, health care, feeding the hungry, civil rights, and social services that the Church and other people of faith make every day, both here at home and overseas. This will be a special intention at our daily Masses during this stretch and I encourage you to find ways to incorporate this intention in your daily prayers. Also, our daily parish rosary at 11:35am will include this intention.
