HOUSEHOLDS IN GOD'S SERVICE

In the ancient world, "household" was a wide-reaching concept. When Joshua today speaks of his household serving the Lord, he meant not just those people who lived inside his walls or those related to him by blood or marriage; he meant slaves or servants and their families, and anyone indebted to him in any way. Even his livestock and other possessions would be consecrated to service of God. In our world, we value allowing individuals their freedom to choose how they live, and wouldn't think of offering our pets to the service of God. But, as we discern our vocation as disciples baptized into Christ, we can come to realize how far-ranging the "households" of our lives still are: how we act toward our spouses, children, roommates or anyone we live with; our behavior with neighbors; or in public as we encounter many "strangers" every day in stores or traffic who suddenly are "next door" to us. How can we use our time, our resources, or gifts for selfless reasons rather than personal gain? No matter what life our witness to the Good News calls us to, we all have a "household" that must be consecrated to service of the Lord our God.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

As I have said repeatedly at Masses over the last few weeks, I continue to be inspired by your faithful presence at church and your support and encouragement over these difficult days of the Pennsylvania grand jury report on child abuse in the Church. I again emphasize that we need to face this issue (as Bishop Persico is leading us) and to pray for healing for all victims, as well as mercy and grace for our church. I hope as we confront this evil that has been a part of our church that we can also recognize that it does not define the Catholic Church nor negate all the blessings and grace that God has and will continue to provide through the church.

On September 15th, the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, all Catholic Churches in the Diocese of Erie will be open from 7am-7pm as invitation to everyone to stop by and say a prayer for the healing of victims and renewal in the church, for however long and in whatever manner you are inclined. Also, our Holy Hours of Eucharistic Adoration the next two months (September 17th and October 15th) will be offered for the specific intention for healing of victims of abuse (particularly those abused by members of the church) and for the renewal of the Catholic Church in all the diocese of Pennsylvania. I also repeat my offer to meet with you to discuss your concerns, hurts or struggles with all of this. And please see below for other guidance on what to do if you or anyone you know has experienced abuse through the church.


May God bless all those affected by the grand jury report and our week ahead.

****Baptismal Font Cover** I thank Chuck Rohrbach for making and donating a beautiful new cover for our portable baptismal font that we use for the Easter Season. The font will remain in the niche to the left of the altar when we are not using it. I also thank Rick Lopez and Charlie Rutkowski who helped fix the font so we could use it last Easter and allow us to be able to depend on using it for years to come.

****Take Me to Worship** The Unified Erie's Religiosity Committee has again initiated a county-wide publicity campaign called "Take Me to Worship." The concept behind this initiative is that data shows that those who participate in religious activities for at least one hour per week are less likely to be involved in violence, abuse drugs or alcohol, commit suicide, and experience depression. So "Take Me to Worship" encourages regular, weekly participation in organized religious institutions. The theme is from a child's perspective- asking their parents to take them to worship so as to give them a better chance to avoid these evils that are plaguing our society. Obviously, this is not a new concept to us Catholics but it is a great opportunity to join with other religious communities to promote what is something central to all of us... and to reinforce the serious responsibility that our parents have in getting their children to Mass because it makes a big impact on their the human formation of their children. Please take a car decal to promote this important initiative (at the office or doors of the church) and also consider encouraging someone in your family, a friend or your neighbor to take their children to worship.

Annual Compliance Audits: Did you know that an independent auditing company audits the Diocese of Erie and in turn, all parishes and catholic schools each year for compliance with the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*? Our 2016-2017 audit found the Diocese of Erie to be in full compliance with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Charter. Even though many found the teachings of Jesus "difficult," He did not back down. In our families, it is important to say what is difficult to hear, to speak the truth with kindness, to correct with love and guide with understanding.

our doors have a feeling of belonging; no matter what race, gender, ethnic background, political party or sexual identity, we love everyone who joins us in worship, service, community-building, learning, and growing in our love of each other. St. Paul reminds us to be loving to each other in his letter to the Colossians, "and over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection" (Col 3:14). In growing as a community of love, we seek to help each other to increase our love of God. In Jesus Christ we see the ultimate revelation of God's love and example of how to love God and our neighbor. Jesus came to literally teach and show the world how to love. We recognize in our baptismal call as a church, that we are now a part of the mission of Christ to continue to be the manifestation of God's love in the world and to show the world how to love each other.

I believe that everyone would whole-heartedly agree with all that I have said so far. Challenges arise when we recognize that part of that mission of Christ to teach the world how to love God and our neighbor requires him to reveal what mature, healthy love is (and by necessity what mature healthy love is not). Jesus had to reinforce that he came not to abolish the law (the Old Testament) but to fulfill it. Jesus reinforced that there were parameters for loving God as reflected in his statement "if you love me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). In the commandments and tradition of the church, we believe that Jesus continues to guide us how to best love God and each other.

When it comes to same sex attractions, the church is rooted in the long standing tradition that we are called to not act on them. However, with ongoing psychological and medical research and study, we now know this is a very complex issue. I believe that is why Pope Francis is inviting us to dialogue about how we pastorally respond to this issue and avoid condemnation; that is why I would like our parish to have an open gathering in the fall to facilitate a conversation about this topic as well as other gender issues and how we as a Catholic community can respond to these topics in a loving way that keeps in mind our Catholic tradition. When I have more details on that I will be sure to communicate them to you.

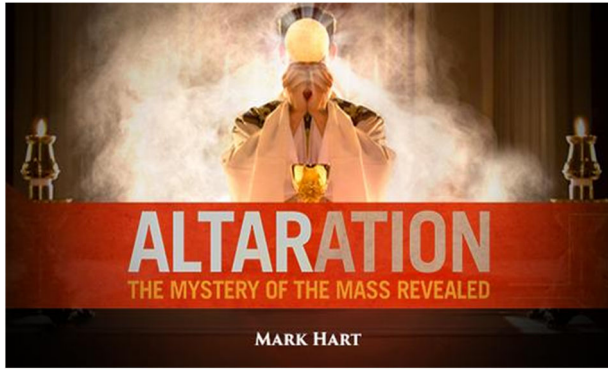

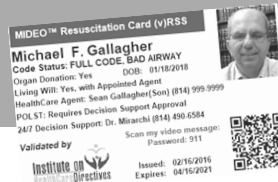
