SEE BEYOND OUTWARD APPEARANCES

The phrase "Sunday best" has lost much of its meaning in our society today. Some lament the loss of people dressing up for church on Sunday; others think it's a healthy sign that we're as casual in attire gathered before the Lord as we are elsewhere. No matter which school of thought on this topic we belong to, James would probably chastise us. In either case, we are still focused on external appearance, mistaking it for some sort of favored position before God. True, James criticizes the community that favors the rich and well-dressed while ostracizing the poorly clothed, but even more he criticizes the making of distinctions, making choices based on criteria that having nothing to do with the reign of God. James might turn our attention to the reign of God described by Isaiah, in which people are healed and the earth becomes ripe to bear fruit. Jesus today is focused on this reign of God, healing a Gentile man in a region hostile to his Jewish faith, not mindful of the man's origins or clothing or status or ability to repay. Isaiah, James, and Jesus in Mark's Gospel all call us to look more deeply to find where the will of God needs to be done, and has been done, on earth as in heaven.

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Next weekend is Catechetical Sunday and the official start of a new year of faith formation in our parish. We will bless all of our catechists and school teachers at the 9am Mass (September 16th). I am so grateful for their willingness to take on this important role in helping form our children in our Catholic faith and I hope you will join me in thanking them next week as we ask God to bless and inspire them at Mass.

In more formation news, our OLP Bible Study of the Gospel of John starts this week on Tuesday and Wednesday. It is not too late to register for this great opportunity to dive deeper into the deepest gospel in the Bible. I will be the speaker at both sessions this week and look forward to giving an introduction to this great book. I also want to thank our Bible Study Core Team who does such a great job in organizing the "best Bible Study in Erie" (I may be a little biased!). The core team members are Sylvia Bosner, Michelle Coppola, Christine Beaver, Mary Beth Whitman, Sarah Fleek, Denise Gaines and Mary Margaret Malue. On behalf of the whole parish, I thank them for the great job they do!

Lastly on the faith formation front, I have talked to our parish staff as well as our Faith Formation Committee, and we all agree that we would like to purchase a parish subscription to FORMED. FORMED is the revolutionary digital platform that would give us unprecedented access to video-based study programs, feature films, audio presentations, and eBooks from the Church's foremost presenters. It is the Catholic version of ON DEMAND that many of us have with our cable or internet providers and once we get a password for the parish, all parishioners could use the account on their computers and in their homes. The challenge is that we were not able to include FORMED in our 2018-19 budget and it costs \$1,850 per year for a parish. We already have one generous donor who committed to one fourth of the cost so I would like to see if we have three other donors who would be willing to cover the other 3 quarters at \$450 each. This will be a valuable asset in our Religious Education and Faith Formation classes and will also allow us to empower our parents to bring faith formation right into their homes with their children. Let me know if you are interested in helping make this happen for OLP and I will let everyone know our login information as soon as we have received the donations and have registered.

May God bless our year of parish faith formation ahead!

****OLP Faithful to the Finish 5K** Our 4th Annual 5K is next **Saturday, September 15th at 8am at Presque Isle**. It is not too late to register for this event although you are not guaranteed a t-shirt at this point. This year we are splitting the proceeds

between our OLP Parish Needy Fund and our OLP School Tuition Angel Program. This is a great community event for our parish and opportunity to meet new people so please stop by even if you do not walk or run. See the back cover for more details.

****Prayer Opportunities for healing of abuse victims and for renewal of the Church**

On September 15th, the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, all Catholic Churches in the Diocese of Erie will be open from 7am-7pm as invitation to everyone to stop by and say a prayer for the healing of victims and renewal in the church, for however long and in whatever manner you are inclined. Also, our Holy Hours of Eucharistic Adoration the next two months (September 17th and October 15th) will be offered for the specific intention for healing of victims of abuse (particularly those abused by members of the church) and for the renewal of the Catholic Church in all the diocese of Pennsylvania. I also repeat my offer to meet with you to discuss your concerns, hurts or struggles with all of this. And please see below for other guidance on what to do if you or anyone you know has experienced abuse through the church.

****Anointing of the Sick Mass**

Last spring we had a special Mass during which we administered the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and over 70 people received the grace of the anointing. Due to this response and in consultation with the staff and liturgy committee we have decided to have two such Masses a year. Our next one will be **Sunday, September 23rd at 11am Mass**. Remember that this sacrament is **NOT FOR EVERYONE** but for those who fit in one of the following categories:

- those who are dangerously ill through sickness or old age (physical or psychological)
- a sick person...before surgery whenever the surgery is necessitated by a dangerous illness
- elderly people...if they are weak, though not dangerously ill
- sick children...sufficiently mature to be comforted by the sacrament
- sick people who have lost consciousness or who have lost the use of reason...if ...they would have requested it if they had been in possession of their faculties

Of course, if a sick person who received this anointing recovers his/her health, he/she can in the case of another serious illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated as well. So if this applies to you or someone you know, please join us at this special Mass of healing and grace. Please arrive early so you can sign in and find your seats.

Your Pastoral Council is back to work! The council met on August 27th for its first meeting of the new OLP fiscal year. The seven parishioners who are continuing their service on the council – Greg Bosner, Greg Galdon, Joe Bello, Joanne Bello, Nancy Milkowski, Tim Tassick, and Liz Nee – welcomed five new members to our group. The new council members are Lori Dever, Donna Griffin, Tom Sargent, Cathy Kuzma, and Anne Rutkowski. All of us are committed to doing our best to contribute to the overall OLP Pastoral Planning process. With your help, we can provide solid recommendations to our pastor, Father Toohey, and do our part to develop well-thought-out pastoral goals.

There were, of course, many topics we reviewed at the August meeting, but a few deserve to be highlighted. First, one of the initiatives that the council undertook during the previous term was the re-establishment of a **“Ministry Fair”** to help our parish ministries highlight their activities and recruit new members. This event will occur after all Masses during the weekend of October 27-28. Please plan on taking advantage of the Fair and committing a few minutes after Mass to explore the ways that **you** can contribute to making OLP a strong, active parish. The ceremony commemorates the apparition of the Virgin Mary to Juan Diego on December 9, 1531.

As proof of her apparition, The Lady provided a miraculous garden of roses to give to Bishop Juan de Zumarraga to provide the sign that He had requested. In addition to the roses, The Lady had imprinted a remarkable portrait of herself on the fabric of his cloak, which had contained the roses. The image and the cloak are displayed for veneration of the faithful currently at the Cathedral of Mexico City.

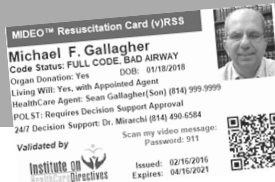
