
Men's Faith Sharing Group Conformed to Christ

LISTENING AND RESPONDING

There are three interwoven themes in today's readings: listening to God, faith vs. good works, and losing our life in order to find it. How are they related?

The Suffering Servant of Isaiah undergoes much distress and ridicule, but is able to bear it because he has listened to the promptings of God day after day. The psalm tells us that God listens, too. God hears our prayers for help and is always ready to save us. As our faith deepens, so does our desire to do the works of justice and charity that build up the reign of God. God directs our actions in ways we often cannot see, and we don't always see the results. We are called upon in faith to trust that what we do is enough, and that willingness to listen to God's promptings will lead us in the right way.



From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

A blessed Catechetical Sunday to you! This weekend is the official start of a new year of faith formation in our parish. There is a second collection which is split between the diocesan Catholic Schools Office and our parish faith formation program. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. Also we will bless all of our catechists and school teachers at the 9am Mass (September 16th). I am so grateful for their willingness to take on this important role in helping form our children in our Catholic faith and I hope you will join me in thanking them as we ask God to bless and inspire them at Mass.

One great instrument of faith formation over the past 50 years in our parish and the Diocese of Erie is Cursillo. Cursillo is a three day weekend retreat and servers as a "short course" in Catholic belief and spirituality and a wonderful and authentic experience of Christian community. Every parish I have been assigned to over my 17 years of priesthood has been impacted significantly from Cursillo so the fruit of this retreat is very evident. Also, it has had a big impact on the spirituality of my family as my parents made the retreat back in the 1970s and have been on teams and a part of Group Reunions for years.

I will be one of the spiritual directors for Women's Cursillo 253 from October 18-21 held at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. It would be a great blessing to be able to experience Cursillo with a group of women from OLP and would like to try to get 6-8 individuals. I am hoping that this can help renew our overall parish participation in Cursillo and the community that has experienced it here at OLP. **Prayer Opportunities for healing of abuse victims and for renewal of the Church

Our Holy Hours of Eucharistic

Adoration the next two months (September 17th and October 15th) will be offered for the specific intention for healing of victims of abuse (particularly those abused by members of the church) and for the renewal of the Catholic Church in all the diocese of Pennsylvania. I also repeat my offer to meet with you to discuss your concerns, hurts or struggles with all of this. And please see below for other guidance on what to do if you or anyone you know has experienced abuse through the church.

Victim Assistance

The diocese, along with the whole church, continues to reach out to

those who have been abused and hurt by priests, religious or others involved with the church. If you are a victim of abuse, the Diocese wants to help. We aid with counseling, spiritual direction and referrals to other supportive services. For information contact our Victim Assistance Coordinator at 814-451-1521.

**Anointing of the Sick Mass

Last spring we had a special Mass during which we administered the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and over 70 people received the grace of the anointing. Due to this response and in consultation with the staff and liturgy committee we have decided to have two such Masses a year. Our next one will be Sunday, September 23rd at 1 lam Mass.

Remember that this sacrament is NOT FOR EVERYONE but for those who fit in one of the following categories:

 -those who are dangerously ill through sickness or old age (physical or psychological)

-a sick person...before surgery whenever the surgery is necessitated by a dangerous illness

-elderly people...if they are weak, though not dangerously ill

-sick children...sufficiently mature to be comforted by the sacrament

-sick people who have lost consciousness or who have lost the use of reason...if ...they would have requested it if they had been in possession of their faculties

Of course, if a sick person who received this anointing recovers his/her health, he/she can in the case of another serious illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated as well. So if this applies to you or someone you know, please join us at this special Mass of healing and grace. *Please arrive early so you can sign in and find your seats*.

**Hearing Enhancement available at all Masses Hearing devices are available for those in need. See any usher at Mass and let them know you need one.

**Wish List-FORMED, Catholic ON DEMAND I am very grateful to the donors who have donated towards 50 of the social room chairs that we asked for recently! As mentioned last week, I have talked to our parish staff as well as our Faith Formation Committee, and we all agree that we would like to purchase a parish subscription to FORMED. FORMED is the revolutionary digital platform that would give us unprecedented access to video-based study programs, feature films, audio presentations, and eBooks from the Church's foremost presenters. It is the Catholic version of ON DEMAND that many of us have with our cable or internet providers and once we get a parish password, all parishioners could use the account on their computers and in their homes. The challenge is that we were not able to include FORMED in our 2018 -19 budget and the yearly parish cost is \$1,850. We have one generous donor who committed to one fourth of the cost so I would like to see if we have three other donors who would be willing to cover the other 3 quarters at \$450 each. This will be a valuable asset in our Religious Education and Faith Formation classes and will also allow us to empower our parents to bring faith formation right into their homes with their children. Let me know if you are interested in helping make this happen for OLP and I will let everyone know our login info once we are able to register.



Litary of Healing and Renewal

OPENING PRAYER

Almighty and most loving God, through your Son you brought compassion, healing and hope to our world. In this time of pain and confusion, we ask you to receive these petitions from your people. In these words, we renew our faith in your power to heal victims, to heal the wounds of your Church, and to draw all of us into a new era of safety and trust. We need you. We trust you. We place our needs before you:

For those who have been abused: that they may experience healing from shame, isolation, anger, and despair; that they may be listened to with compassion, treated with dignity, and supported in the healing process. We pray,

Have mercy on us, Lord.

For those who counsel victims: That their words of wisdom and compassion may be instruments of healing for those they accompany. We pray,

Have mercy on us, Lord.

For the perpetrators of abuse: That they may experience sincere remorse for their crimes, approach God with sorrow, and be prepared to make reparation for the damage they have caused. We pray, *Have mercy on us, Lord.*

For those who failed to protect children, those who, in any way, betrayed the trust placed in them: May they humbly acknowledge their responsibility for harm done to children. We pray, Have mercy on us, Lord.

For the faithful who are angry, scandalized, discouraged: That they may come to recognize the real presence of Christ in His Church despite the tragic failures of Church members and leaders. We pray, *Have mercy on us, Lord.*

For all the faithful: That our response to this dark episode will result in even stronger faith that Christ will rebuild His Church and not allow evil to prevail; may we grow in our conviction that where sin abounds, grace abounds all the more; and may we renew our commitment to participate in the sacraments, learn the faith, join our parish communities, and serve the poor and marginalized. We pray, *Have mercy on us, Lord.*

For our priests: that they may be protected from discouragement and that they may experience a renewal of authentic priestly identity, intimate union with Christ, joyful zeal for souls, liberating chastity, and humble charity. We pray, *Have mercy on us, Lord.*

For young people discerning a religious vocation to priesthood or consecrated life: That the tragic failures of some may not blind them to the heroic virtue of many. We pray, *Have mercy on us, Lord.*

For our bishops: That they may take initiatives which: protect the flock entrusted to their care, restore trust, are transparent and free of self-interest, and unite the flock with the Heart of the Shepherd. We pray, *Have mercy on us, Lord.*

For non-Catholics who may be tempted to disparage Catholics, the Catholic faith, and the Catholic Church because of these scandals: May they be blessed to encounter the witness of faithful Catholics. We pray,

Have mercy on us, Lord.

For law enforcement officials, legislators and judges: That they may carefully weigh all aspects of the scourge of child abuse in our society as they pursue justice. We pray, Have mercy on us. Lord.

For all professionals in the news media and communications: That they may adhere to the highest ethical standards, seeking the truth as they bring to light the extent of this scandal and the ways the Church is responding. We pray,

Have mercy on us, Lord.

For all who work with children, especially teachers, coaches, and youth ministers: That they might experience a renewed commitment to their treasured service, and find ways to protect and enhance the dignity of each child. We pray, *Have mercy on us, Lord.*

For all parents: that they may foster family life rooted in love, prayer, faith, and mercy; homes filled with joy and consecrated to God which form children in virtue and mature faith. We pray,

Have mercy on us, Lord.

For all children: That they may be loved by their family, protected in home and school, and learn about the goodness of God so that they can develop a personal relationship with Jesus. We pray,

Have mercy on us, Lord.
