From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

This Monday, October 15th we will have a Holy Hour for Healing from 7-8pm at the church. There are two layers to the focus of our prayer. When creating the parish calendar for the year back in June, we had established this holy hour of healing as a compliment to the Anointing of the Sick Mass in September. The idea was, and still is, that anyone who was not eligible for the Sacrament of Anointing is encouraged to come to this holy hour and be individually prayed over. More specifically, at a designated time during the hour of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, individuals will be invited to come forward and either Fr. Kyle or myself will pray over them after asking them what healing they are seeking for themselves or for others in their life. This is a common practice in Catholic charismatic spirituality for centuries. It involves the laying on of hands and usually silent or audible prayer.

Once the Grand Jury Report came out in August, we decided to also designate this Holy Hour for Healing for Abuse Victims and renewal in the church. So with this purpose in mind, we will again pray our diocesan litany for healing and renewal that we prayed in its entirety last month at Mass and holy hour, and partially at subsequent Masses.

I will be away next weekend for the Women's Cursillo. Please keep us in your prayers (especially Jean Verdecchia and Cindy Toland from OLP who are making the retreat) and know that you are in my prayers as well (as always!).

May God bless our week ahead!

**October-Respect Life Month The Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month to proclaim the immeasurable value of every person from conception to natural death. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops assists parishes, schools and other Catholic ministries by creating resources to help people "understand, value and become engaged with supporting the God-given dignity of every person - which naturally leads to protecting the gift of every person's life" through its Respect Life Program. The theme for the 2018-19 Respect Life Program is "Every Life: Cherished, Chosen, Sent" and highlights the call to build a culture of life as missionary disciples. Immediately after the march there is adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Cathedral at which I will be the guest homilist. The entire event should be complete by 4pm or so.


- 5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish.


