THE CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP

The core vocation in the Gospel of Mark is the vocation, or call, to discipleship. Today's Gospel passage provides us with one last example of what the vocation to discipleship means, and one example of what it doesn't mean. A destitute widow shows us that discipleship means following Jesus' way of service, even if it requires giving one's livelihood (or life). The scribes show us by their bad example that discipleship should entail a vocation to extend God's care to those who are most in need.

In our reading from the book of Kings another widow and her son are close to death. They too give what little they have, but they are rewarded by Elijah with food enough for a year. And the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that Jesus sacrificed his life "to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him" (Hebrews 9:28). Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

This past summer the need for a discussion on sexual orientation came to the forefront after a particular homily. The pastoral staff received many comments expressing numerous viewpoints of the issue ranging from concerns about pastoral insensitivity to upholding Catholic moral teaching. I addressed the issue in the bulletin and an apology was published. Feedback from the parish continued from those who wanted to share their personal feelings; many expressed a desire that this issue be addressed more directly by the church, which very often on the local level has remained silent.

In response, I wrote a significant letter to the parish in the August I 9th edition of the bulletin which I read at all Masses that weekend and can be found on the parish website. In that letter I expressed the challenge we face as Catholics - we are called to welcome, love, and accept all people while remaining a prophetic voice in our society which is faithful to our moral tradition. Throughout our history tension has existed between cultural norms and Catholic teaching. I expressed my hope that we could have a gathering in the fall to address this issue and allow our parish family to come together in charitable conversation. I have gathered a team to help lead us in this dialogue and am pleased to say that we are finally ready to have that conversation as part of a new series that we are introducing at OLP called "The Church in Dialogue."

Our first session in this new parish series will therefore be on Sexual Orientation and will be held on Tuesday, November 27th at 6:30pm in the church. I am very grateful to the following people who agreed to be on our team to help lead the dialogue and answer questions: Glenn Bailey, an OLP Parishioner and wellrespected local Psychologist who is in formation for the permanent diaconate for the Erie Diocese, will present the most recent scientific/psychological dimensions on sexual orientation; Kate Whiteford, the Director of Chastity Education and Curriculum Assistant for the Diocese of Erie, will present on the moral dimensions of this issue from our Catholic Tradition; Eric Dart, an OLP Parishioner who teaches courses on Theology and Pastoral Studies and is chairman of the Theology Department at Gannon University, will present the theological dimensions on this issue; and Joe Haas, the Executive Director of Catholic Charities Counseling and Adoption Services for the Diocese of Erie, will be presenting on the pastoral perspective and challenge in bringing all these dimensions together.

We are very blessed to have this team lead us in this important dialogue so please consider joining us. Please come with a charitable attitude, openness to other people's perspectives, and the humility to recognize that none of us has the entire truth or answer

May God bless our church in dialogue, our Veterans and our week ahead!

**Veterans Day: Officially November 11th but observed November 12th Veterans Day is a time for us to pay our respects to those who have served our country through the military. For one day, we stand united in respect for our veterans. This holiday started as a day to reflect upon the heroism of those who died in our country's service and was originally called Armistice Day. It fell on November 11th because that is the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. However, in 1954, the holiday was changed to "Veterans Day" in order to account for all veterans in all wars. We celebrate and honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good. As Catholics we also honor them by praying for them- for those who have finished their service (and may be struggling with wounds from their service- physical, emotional and psychological) and for protection and safety for those still serving.

The lights of the candles on the Advent wreath break through the darkness, reminding us of the Light of Christ that we anticipate during this holy season.

The Advent Wreath serves as a powerful visual reminder of the holiness of the season. The light of the candles invites us to quiet ourselves during this busy time and reflect on the true meaning of Christmas. Whether at home or at Church, it provides an invitation to wait and pray in hopeful anticipation for the coming of Christ. We are called to welcome the light of Christ into our lives.

Our tradition here at OLP has included offering all parishioners the opportunity to assist with the wreath lighting during the weekend Masses throughout the four Sundays of Advent. We will be continuing that tradition this year and invite you to prayerfully consider volunteering.

Sign-up sheets are in the vestibule now through Sunday, November 25th.

The candle lighting is a very simple, yet significant, part of our Advent journey. Please consider being a part of this OLP tradition.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Veterans Day began with the signing of a symbolic treaty between the Allies and Germany ending World War I (then called the "Great War") on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. The auspicious date was actually a well-established religious holiday, the feast of Saint Martin of Tours, a beloved soldier saint of the army of Rome. After World War II, Armistice Day was changed to Veterans Day in the United States and Remembrance Day in Britain, but of course the feast of Saint Martin endures.

Martin was named after Mars, the god of war, and against the advice of his parents he went on his own to church. He became a catechumen at the age of ten. By fifteen he was enlisted in the cavalry in France. Coming across a poor man, Martin had an

impulse to divide his bright red soldier's cape and clothe him. He later had the insight that he had served Christ, and the other half of his cape became a lifelong sign to him of his duty to serve the poor. Housed in a tiny church capella or "chapel," the cape became a great object of pilgrimage on the way to Compostella, and a favored place for the prayers of soldiers. Martin was not so eager to



serve as bishop as he had been as a soldier, and legend says that he hid in a barn filled with geese to avoid episcopal election. To this day, the customary meal for November 11 is goose! Traditionally, this is the last feast day before winter closes in, and begins a period of fasting once known as "Saint Martin's Lent" or "Martinmas," that later developed into the season of Advent.

Council's Corner

Your Pastoral Council met for its normal monthly meeting on October 22nd. The focus of this meeting was on **outreach** – outreach through service to our parish and to the broader community through our ministries here at OLP.

We opened by conducting a final review of our plans for hosting the Ministry Fair that was conducted on the weekend of October 28-29. The Fair turned out, as we hoped it would, to be a real celebration of the generosity and commitment of OLP parishioners. More than 30 ministries were represented; the Fair demonstrated that OLP is clearly a very vibrant, giving parish.

The second focus of our October meeting was to learn from the Pastoral Council members who serve as Ministry Liaisons how things were going in some of the critical pastoral ministries. This review is accomplished every six months. What the Council saw at this meeting was determined commitment to strengthening the mission of our parish.

Finally, we used this meeting to begin to develop the goals for the Pastoral Council to pursue this year. As it turned out, these goals center on outreach. The Council decided that we should review how the parish identifies, manages, and accomplishes activities which focus on reaching out -- first, to members of the parish and, second, to members of the broader Erie community. We plan to develop some clear recommendations to Father Rich regarding broadening and deepening our parish's commitment to outreach.




