From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

A blessed Christmas Octave and Feast of the Holy Family to you! We pray for all families in our parish in a special way on this feast, that Jesus, Mary and Joseph can help inspire them to be the reflection of the Trinity as communities of persons in love that God created them to be. We also seek the Holy Family's intercession for this purpose as well and pray for all families throughout the world who are in need of healing, reconciliation and renewal.

Another group of families that we pray for are those who are dealing with poverty. I am very grateful for the many ways that our community at Our Lady of Peace has helped people and families in need during this holiday season. I am sure that I do not know all the ways members of our parish have helped those in need but a few to highlight: our whole parish community who helped provide winter coats and clothing to Bethany Ministries; the weekly food collection for the Millcreek Food Pantry; the OLP school community and their Advent Service Projects that helped the following charities: Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Erie, Kids' Café, Highmark Caring Place, Erie Dawn, SSJ Neighborhood Network, Mercy Center for Women, and St. Patrick's Haven; the Rosary Society who had collections for Erie Dawn and Lakefront Hospice recently; OLP Seniors who collected toys for the military's "Toys for Tots" program; the OLP Bible Study who collected toys for St. Martin Center; the 7am Mass Group who donated \$400 each to 5 different charities including the First Presbyterian Church of Girard where there was a fire over the summer; our youth group who helped deliver furniture to needy families through "A Hand Up" Ministry as well as volunteering and baking for Emmaus Soup Kitchen; and the 8 volunteers from our parish who helped staff Our Neighbors Place Overflow Homeless Shelter at Trinity Lutheran Church on December 16/17.

I know this list is not exhaustive but it still gives some insight into the impact that our parish and school are having on those in need in our greater community. I mentioned in my homily last weekend that it is this spirit of charity and generosity that I believe makes this the "most wonderful time of the year." When we live out the sacrificial love that God created us for, we are most fulfilled and so a season when we focus on that as a human family helps our society understand this and brings a joy and peace to our society that is unique.

But this does not have to be a one time a year thing, let's keep this spirit of generosity and charity going throughout the year as parish. One opportunity for this is a request I recently received from St. Martin Center (the main outreach/ministry of Catholic Charities in the city of Erie) for volunteers for their food pantry which serves over 300 families in Erie. May God bless all families as well as our Christmas Octave and Season ahead!

****Parish Calendars** Our parish calendars are in for 2019! ****Holy Hour for Peace** We will continue the recent tradition here at OLP by ringing in the New Year with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 11pm-12 Midnight on New Year's Eve (Monday, December 31st). What a great way to start the new year by receiving the Blessing (Benediction) of Jesus through His Eucharistic Presence right at Midnight! We will pray for peace in our world though a litany of peace. After the Holy Hour there will be time for some refreshments and fellowship in the rectory.

****Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God is Tuesday, January 1st** and is a holy day of obligation and the last day of the Octave of Christmas. It has also been designated for years as the World Day of Prayer for Peace. For all those reasons, it is a great day to participate in Mass which will be held at **5:30pm on Monday, December 31st and 10am on Tuesday, January 1st**.

****Christmas Octave** Every year I emphasize the importance of the entire **Christmas Octave when we celebrate the truth and joy of Christmas in an intensified way for 8 days liturgically (Dec. 25-Jan. 1)**. All the Masses are celebrated as if it is Christmas day with the Gloria, song and all the decorations. Consider going to an extra Mass or two or engage in other spiritual practices during the Octave to say thank you to God for the blessings of Christmas!

****Christmas Season** The Christmas Season lasts for almost 3 weeks. Highlights include the Feast of the Holy Family (Sunday, December 30th), Mary the Mother of God (Holy Day of Obligation, Tuesday, January 1st), the Epiphany (Sunday, January 6th where we will have the Proclamation of the dates for Easter and other significant dates of the Liturgical Year). The Christmas Season will conclude on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Sunday, January 13th when we will have **Solemn Evening Prayer with Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament at 6pm (after Adoration from 5:15pm-6pm)**.

****Epiphany Concert** I am excited that our music ministry will offer an Epiphany Concert this year on Sunday, **January 6th at 2pm**. Recall that the actual date of the Epiphany is January 6th and our liturgical celebration is typically transferred to the closest Sunday. This year it falls on Sunday so we get to celebrate the Epiphany on the true date and the concert will be a great way to extend our celebration at Mass.

****Night to Shine** I am very excited that OLP will be the sponsoring church for "Night to Shine" (NTS) which will be held **Friday, February 9th from 6-9pm at Union Station in Erie**. NTS is a prom night experience that celebrates people 14 and older with special needs. Red carpet welcome with paparazzi, dinner, photos, dancing, crowning ceremony for our guests along with a separate gathering for the caregivers all take place simultaneously at over 600 churches (locations) worldwide!

****Holy Land Pilgrimage** I will lead a pilgrimage to the Holy Land of Israel from **October 26-November 5, 2019**. Cost is \$4,299 per person and includes 1 night in Tel Aviv, 2 nights in Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee, and 6 nights in Jerusalem with airfare, hotels, breakfast and dinner each day (lunch not included). Highlights include Nazareth, the Jordan River, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem. See the actual locations of almost all of the mysteries of the Rosary: JOYFUL- the Annunciation, Visitation, Nativity, the Presentation and Finding in the Temple; LUMINOUS- the Baptism of the Lord, the Wedding Feast of Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom (Mt. of Beatitudes), Transfiguration and the Last Supper; All the SORROWFUL on the Via Dolorosa; and 4 of the 5 GLORIOUS- Resurrection, Ascension, Pentecost, and Assumption (we will only get to see the location of the Coronation of Mary since it happened in Heaven!).
