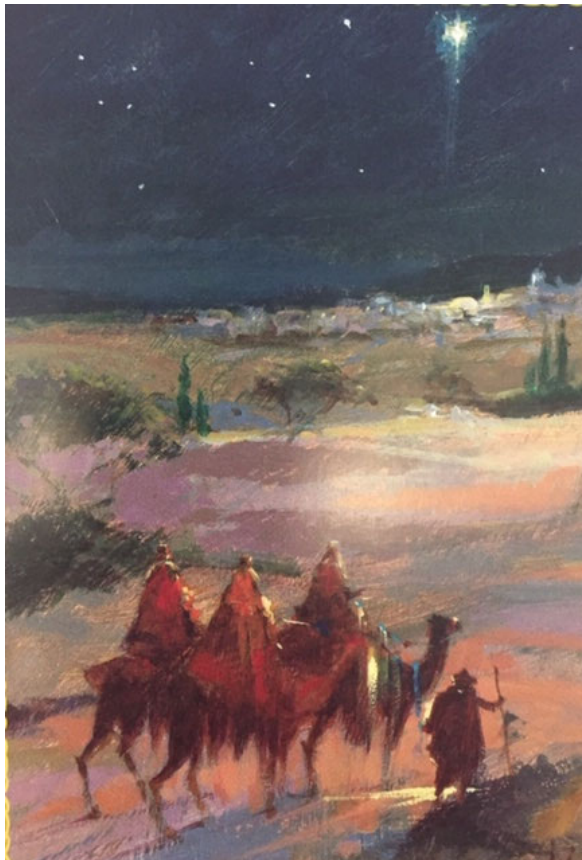

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

A Blessed Epiphany to you! Today we celebrate the Magi's recognition of the manifestation (or epiphany) of Christ to the world. We are reminded by these wise men of the east that Jesus did not just come for the salvation of Israel, but rather came as the universal Savior of the world. If these men that were not Jewish could see the truth and magnificence of the Christ child and be compelled to honor him, how much more should we be compelled to adore him?!

For nearly a half century, the Epiphany has been the start of **National Migration Week in our United States Catholic Church (January 6-12)**. It is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking. **The theme for National Migration Week 2019, "Building Communities of Welcome"** draws attention to the fact that each of our families have a migration story, some recent and others in the distant past. Regardless of where we are and where we came from, we remain part of the human family and are called to live in solidarity with one another.

Additionally, the U.S. bishops continue to encourage advocacy efforts by the Catholic community on comprehensive immigration reform. The Catholic Church's Social Justice Tradition recognizes 3 principles regarding immigration: one- people have the right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families. Two- a country has the right to regulate its borders and to control immigration. And three- A country must regulate its borders with justice and mercy (with a concern for the common good of all people beyond the needs of one's own country). Finding a balance between these principles is a challenging task for our national and international leaders so we must pray for them to find a just and compassionate solution to border control. In addition to prayer, our bishops encourage us to make the effort to utilize the resources from our US Conference of Catholic Bishops to learn more about the principles our Catholic Tradition supports in regard to this important issue. ****Epiphany Concert** I am excited our music ministry has an Epiphany Concert today: Sunday, **January 6th at 2pm**. Recall that the actual date of the Epiphany is January 6th and our liturgical celebration is typically transferred to the closest Sunday. This year it falls on Sunday so we get to celebrate the Epiphany on the true date and the concert will be a great way to extend our celebration at Mass.

****Epiphany Proclamation** *This weekend is the traditional time for the Epiphany Proclamation. See below for the actual proclamation. Make sure you mark the dates on your personal calendar and set aside those most important days of our liturgical year (Holy Week and Easter) for prayer and celebration with your parish family. Do not let those days be an after-thought, but make them a priority around which to plan vacations, events, and other things that can keep us from worshipping.*

****Epiphany Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts (for the year 2019)**

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the **sixth day of March** will fall **Ash Wednesday**, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the **twenty-first day of April** you will celebrate with joy **Easter Day**,

the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the **thirtieth day of May** will be the **Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ**.

On the **ninth day of June**, the feast of **Pentecost**.

On the **twenty-third day of June** the feast of the **Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**.

On the first day of December, the **First Sunday of Advent** of our Lord Jesus Christ,

to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever.

Amen.

****Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction** The Christmas Season will conclude on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Sunday, January 13th when we will have **Solemn Evening Prayer with Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament at 6pm (after Adoration from 5:15pm-6pm)**.

****Christmas Gift "The Real Story: Understanding the Big Picture of the Bible"** If you were not at OLP for Christmas, you are encouraged to take a copy of the book "The Real Story" located in the main vestibule for your household as a small gift from your parish. Edward Sri and Curtis Martin are world renown authors in our Catholic faith and tradition. ****Holy Land Pilgrimage** I will lead a pilgrimage to the Holy Land of Israel from **October 26-November 5, 2019**. Cost is \$4,299 per person and includes 1 night in Tel Aviv, 2 nights in Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee, and 6 nights in Jerusalem with airfare, hotels, breakfast and dinner each day (lunch not included). See the actual locations of almost all of the mysteries of the Rosary: JOYFUL- the Annunciation, Visitation, Nativity, the Presentation and Finding in the Temple; LUMINOUS- the Baptism of the Lord, the Wedding Feast of Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom (Mt. of Beatitudes), Transfiguration and the Last Supper; All the SORROWFUL on the Via Dolorosa; and 4 of the 5 GLORIOUS- Resurrection, Ascension, Pentecost, and Assumption (we will only not get to see the location of the Coronation of Mary since it happened in Heaven!).
