A VISIBLE GOD

We find it difficult to convey ideas to people unless we can actually show them something, demonstrate what we mean. God, who is invisible and truly beyond human understanding, apparently faces the same difficulty. People want to see, not just listen to an idea. So God gave us Jesus Christ, God made visible in the world.

During these past weeks we have seen how Jesus was revealed as an infant to the shepherds and the magi, and then began his adult "public life" at his baptism by John. Today's Gospel reading tells us of his "first sign," providing wine for the wedding guests at Cana.

Of course, even Jesus, God made visible, was not always easily understood in his own day, nor is he even now. So we have to ponder what we see: the poverty and simplicity of his birth, his humility and openness before John the Baptist, his kindness and compassion toward people in their ordinary problems, such as running short of wine at a wedding. Yet it is in coming to know Jesus that we come to know God.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

This week the Roman Catholic Church joins Christians everywhere in a concentrated effort to pray for Christian Unity. The "Church Unity Octave," a forerunner of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, was developed by Father Paul Wattson, SA, at Graymoor in Garrison, New York, and was first observed at Graymoor from January 18-25, 1908. Today, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity invites the whole Christian community throughout the world to pray in communion with the prayer of Jesus "that they all may be one" (*John 17:21*).

In 1966, the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches and the Vatican Secretariat (now Council) for Promoting Christian Unity began collaborating to create a common international text for worldwide usage. Since 1968 these international texts, which are based on themes proposed by ecumenical groups around the world, have been developed, adapted and published for use in the United States by the Graymoor Ecumenical and Interreligious Institute.

The theme of this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is "Justice, Only Justice, You Shall Pursue." (*Deuteronomy 16:18-20*). Christian communities "become newly aware of their unity as they join in a common concern and a common response to an unjust reality. At the same time, confronted by these injustices, we are obliged, as Christians, to examine the ways in which we are complicit. Only by heeding Jesus's prayer 'that they all may be one' can we witness to living unity in diversity. It is through our unity in Christ that we will be able to combat injustice and serve the needs of its victims." Let's respond to the call of our Christian brothers and sisters in Jerusalem (and all over the world) for an end to religious persecution and allow the injustice of Christian persecution unite Christians everywhere in prayer and purpose.

Let's keep this intention of Christian Unity in our prayers at all Masses this week at OLP and in our personal prayer life that God may bless all efforts for Christian Unity and our week ahead!

Other notes from the pastor...****Prolife Issues:**

ONE- thank you to everyone who donated money last weekend for our trip to Washington DC for the March for Life. We raised \$1,864 which covered the parish part of the budget and some of the food expenses as well as allowing us to set aside some money for next year.

TWO- I remind you that **Tuesday, January 22nd** is designated by our U.S. Bishops as a **Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children** (recall that is the 46th anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court Decision that legalized abortion in the United States). I encourage you to incorporate this important intention in your daily prayer and consider adding something to

your prayer efforts that day. Some communal options are to consider: daily Mass at 7am or 12:10pm, daily rosary at 11:40am, daily Divine Mercy Chaplet after 12:10pm Mass or just stop by the church between 6:30am and 8pm (the hours OLP is opened most weekdays).

THREE- the **Annual Erie March for Life is Saturday, January 26th and starts at 11am at Perry Square**. I sometimes unintentionally put more emphasis on the DC March but this is a great way to locally stand up for life and prayerfully witness to our commitment to speaking up for children in the womb.

****Catholic Schools Week/ OLP School Open House** There will be an OLP School Celebration to kick off Catholic Schools Week on Sunday, January 27th. It will begin with the 9am Mass where our school students will join in prayer and lead our liturgical ministries. That will be followed with an Open House from 11am-1pm. If you or anyone you know is considering sending your children to our school, this is a great opportunity to check it out. And please help us get the word out on this and invite your neighbors, coworkers or friends to come. Your efforts to promote our school are invaluable!

****Christmas Thank You's** Now that our Christmas Season is over, I would like to again thank everyone who helped make Christmas at OLP a beautiful celebration and season. I specifically thank our staff members who put in overtime, all of our liturgical ministers, our music ministry (particularly Selah Praise Band, the Cherub Choir, Voice of Peace Choir and the combo group at Midnight Mass- who all put in extra time to practice!) and our environment committee led by Brian Kuzmin and Chris Ehrman and his crew from Allburn Florist who did a wonderful job in decorating the church and getting us in the Christmas Spirit (I received many, many compliments on how beautiful the church looked!). And thank you to the Knights of Columbus and the Boy Scouts who helped decorate and un-decorate the church over the past month. Also thank you to Charlie Rutkowski who donated new shelf racks for storage in the basement. Lastly, on behalf of Fr. Kyle, Fr. ****Holy Land Pilgrimage** I will lead a pilgrimage to the Holy Land of Israel from **October 26-November 5, 2019**. Cost is \$4,299 per person and includes 1 night in Tel Aviv, 2 nights in Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee, 6 nights in Jerusalem with airfare, hotels, breakfast and dinner each day (lunch not included). Highlights include Nazareth, the Jordan River, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem. See the actual locations of almost all of the mysteries of the Rosary: JOYFUL- the Annunciation, Visitation, Nativity, the Presentation and Finding in the Temple; LUMINOUS- the Baptism of the Lord, the Wedding Feast of Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom (Mt. of Beatitudes), Transfiguration and the Last Supper; All the SORROWFUL on the Via Dolorosa; and 4 of the 5 GLORIOUS- Resurrection, Ascension, Pentecost, and Assumption (we will only not get to see the location of the Coronation of Mary since it happened in Heaven!). Human Trafficking and Protecting our Youth: Trafficking of youth is a form of modern slavery. It includes both sex trafficking and forced labor. Any child under age 18 engaged in commercial sex is a victim of sex trafficking, even if the youth's participation is not forced or coerced. Be aware of recruiting tactics. Traffickers target victims through social media sites, telephone chat lines, afterschool programs, at shopping malls, bus depots, clubs/bars or through friends and acquaintances. To help protect your child, ask questions about your child's friends, monitor their computer use and know where he/she hangs out. 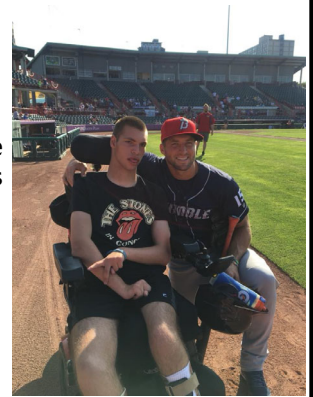

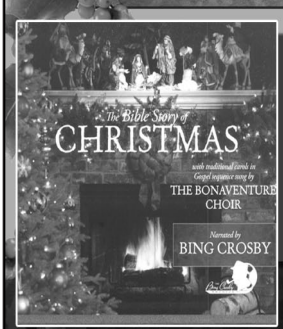
