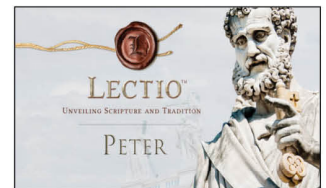

BLESSED

When we think of the word "Beatitude" we think of today's discourse from Luke's Gospel, or the more familiar one from Matthew (which begins "Blessed are the poor in spirit . . ."). Actually, beatitudes occur throughout the prophets and Gospels. Today in Jeremiah (with an echo in the psalm) we hear, "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord" (Jeremiah 17:7). Following his resurrection in John's Gospel, Christ proclaims, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29). The evangelists placed these sayings throughout the Gospels as short reminders about the characteristics that one will find in a follower of Christ, characteristics that will help spread the Good News in this life and lead to eternal blessings in the next. In Latin, the saints are called the *Beati*, the "Blessed," for they are the ones who lived the "blessed" life as described by Jesus throughout the Gospels. How blest are we, when we also strive to make our own days a living beatitude!

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Happy Valentine Day Octave! (there really is not an octave for Valentine's Day but why not?) Recall that this holiday of last week was originally the Feast of St. Valentine (although it was removed from the universal calendar in 1969). Legend holds that Valentine was a priest and martyr in the 3rd century. He was killed on February 14th, a day that the Romans had typically honored Juno, the queen of all gods and the goddess of women and marriage. The emperor Claudius had forbidden marriage, thinking it was a deterrent for young men to serve in his army which was involved in many unpopular wars. St. Valentine, along with St. Marius, secretly helped the Christian martyrs and witnessed marriages. He was eventually apprehended and killed. The Church established St. Valentine's Day in the 5th century to off-set the Roman tradition of pairing up young men and women randomly on that day to honor Juno.

It's a good day to recommit to "agape," the Greek word for "sacrificial love," in our relationships and marriages. This sacrificial love, which was most fully expressed by Jesus on the cross, is the deepest and most fulfilling human love there is. By living it out, we remind our world that the love of the cross is real and possible. So this Valentine Octave, let's seek to be better lovers, and therefore better Christians!

Other notes from the pastor...

****Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2019** Next Sunday, February 24th will be Promotion Sunday for the CSA and the following Sunday, March 3rd will be Commitment Sunday. You should have already received Faith Magazine from the Diocese which gives an in depth look into the appeal. Also expect a letter from me this week to explain the process and our parish project. Please read both of these sources and be ready to hear more about it next weekend. Most importantly, let's be prayerful in our discernment of what each of us can do in this year's campaign.

***OLP Trip to Sight and Sound Theatre in Lancaster, PA for Production of "Jesus"** Our parish will take a pilgrimage to see the production of Jesus from June 12-14, 2019. Mark your calendars now and more information will be coming in the weeks ahead.

****Men's and Women's Conferences** OLP will again be hosting the Diocesan Men's (March 2nd) and Women's (March 30th) Conferences. The benefit of these conferences is that they can target male and female spiritualities and provide a great chance to be uniquely challenged and to come together to support each other in that way. I cannot encourage enough ALL the men and women of our parish to be a part of these days of grace! Look elsewhere in the bulletin for more info on both of the conferences. 

****Mardi Gras and St. Joseph Table** We have two opportunities to

come together as a community in the next month. We will have our annual **Mardi Gras Party on Tuesday, March 5th from 6-8pm**. And our **St. Joseph Table will take place on Tuesday, March 19th after a 6pm Mass for the feast of St. Joseph**. Keep an eye out in the bulletin for more information on both Mardi Gras and the St. Joseph Table. Mark your calendars and be a part of strengthening our parish family's bond.

****Paschal Candle Memorial** The Paschal Candle, also called the Christ Candle or Easter Candle, is one of the great liturgical symbols we have in our church and represents Jesus as the Light of the World. It is blessed at the great Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday Night and then leads the procession into the dark church as we start the celebration of Christ's Resurrection. We light our candles from it as a reminder that we first received the light of Christ at our Baptism and as the light spreads throughout the church we see a living manifestation of Christ's light breaking the darkness of this world of sin. The candle then takes a primary spot in the sanctuary throughout the Easter Season. After the Easter Season, the Paschal Candle is placed next to the Baptismal Font where it is used for all baptisms and funerals throughout the year. Every year the parish purchases a new paschal candle at the cost of \$500. If you would be interested in donating the candle in memory of a loved one, call the parish office and we can arrange the details.

****Anointing of the Sick** Last Monday, February 11th was the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and the World Day of the Sick. This is a good time to encourage all those who are sick in our community or who work or live closely with those who are sick, to take advantage of a great source of God's grace and support which is the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. We have **2 anointing Masses a year here at OLP (the next one is Saturday, May 18th at 5pm)** and Fr. Kyle and I regularly visit the hospitals in Erie to offer this sacrament but we do not always know when people need the sacrament. So we need you to communicate with us when you need to be anointed so we can come to your home or arrange a time at church where we can administer the sacrament. Recall that it is not just the "Extreme Unction" or "Last Rites" of 75 years ago. Vatican II renewed an understanding and use of the sacrament which allows God to accompany us in our times of serious illness or surgery and allows us to receive the anointing multiple times throughout our lives. Also, if you or your loved one experience a significant decline in health, it is better to receive the anointing of the sick sooner rather than later. I encourage you to not wait until death is imminent or you are dealing with a major crisis to be anointed (although I know sometimes these things cannot be predicted or anticipated) but always err on the side of receiving the anointing earlier than later in the process. If you have questions about this or are in a situation where you are not sure if anointing is appropriate, please do not hesitate to call me or Fr. Kyle to discuss your question or situation.

****OLP School Registration for 2019/20** Please consider Our Lady of Peace School as an option for your children or encourage your family to consider our school. There are great things happening at our school and we need your help to get the word out! I also want to say there is financial aid available to families for whom the cost of tuition is prohibitive. Contact our Director of Advancement, Kathy Grisier or our Principal, Lisa Panighetti to set up a tour and see what options are available.

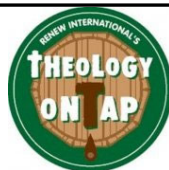

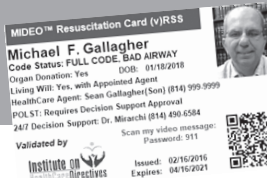
