THIS IS THE HOLY TRINITY

Today we celebrate the Holy Trinity, one of the most confounding mysteries of our faith. Through this mystery we experience our relationship to God: Creator, Savior, and Holy Spirit. This relationship is not easy to understand or to describe. It does not become clearer through analysis. Its complexity mirrors the complexity of all our relationships. We understand our relationships with our spouses, our children, our parents, and our friends only through daily give-and-take, annual rituals, and the life-changing moments we share. We understand our relationships only as we live them. The relationships we have with those we love, and who love us, sustain us through an uncertain and difficult life. This is the Holy Trinity.

What is striking about today's readings is that each is incomplete. What they do offer is a description of a moment in our relationship, a memory of a time and an event when our relationship made sense even though that sense may be beyond our ability to describe fully. Often that is all that our faith offers, that is, a memory of what is possible, what is promised, what has been given. A memory of eternity, of love beyond understanding is to be cherished and nurtured even if not fully understood. This is the Holy Trinity.

Other notes from the pastor...

****Fortnight for Freedom** The Fortnight for Freedom is from June 21—the vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More—to July 4, Independence Day. Since 2010, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have encouraged dioceses around the country to highlight the importance of defending religious freedom as we approach Independence Day. "Religion [cannot] be relegated to the inner sanctum of personal life, without influence on societal and national life." -Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, 183. If religious liberty is not respected, all people suffer and are deprived of the essential contribution to the common good, be it in education, health care, feeding the hungry, civil rights, and social services that the Church and other people of faith make every day, both here at home and overseas. This will be a special intention at our daily Masses during this stretch and I encourage you to find ways to incorporate this intention in your daily prayers. Also, our daily parish rosary at 11:35AM will include this intention. ****Pastoral Council Members** Congratulations to Stacy Congdon and Kathy Fross who were selected by lot as the two newest members of our Pastoral Council (the main planning/visionary group for our parish). They will have a term of three years. Two other members of the council, Liz Nee (6 years) and

Joanne Bello (5 years) are completing their time with the council and I thank them very much for their extended commitment. Two other updates on membership- council member Lori Dever has agreed to extend service beyond the one year term she served last year and our new officers are: president- Nancy Milkowski; vice-president- Greg Galdon; secretary- Lori Dever.

****Update on Fr. Kyle** Bishop Persico has placed Fr. Kyle, our parochial vicar, on a complete medical leave of absence and therefore he will not be returning to Our Lady of Peace Parish for ministry. Please continue to pray for Fr. Kyle that the Holy Spirit can provide him the grace, strength and healing he needs to return to priestly ministry. And I will certainly keep you updated when I know more about his status or location. I know it is difficult when one of our priests leaves the parish especially when we do not have a chance to say goodbye. But we have to trust that the Holy Spirit can also bring us the healing, hope and strength we need and that He will get Fr. Kyle and us through this.

****Arrival of Fr. Mark Hoffman** Bishop Persico recognizes that a parish of our size needs more than one full time priest, so he has assigned OLP native son, Fr. Mark Hoffman, as parochial vicar here for a term of one year. Fr. Mark most recently served for 6 months as parochial vicar at Notre Dame Parish in Hermitage, PA. His parents are still active parishioners here and so this is a unique opportunity for him to be close to them while helping serve our parish. Fr. Mark's assignment begins on Monday, June 17th. There will be coffee and cookies after all the Masses the weekend of June 22/23 to give us a chance to welcome him and say hello.

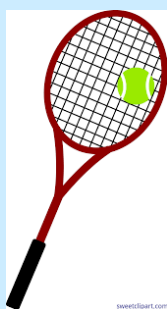

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Peace,

Greetings! I wanted to take the opportunity to write to all of you and tell you a little bit about my experience at St. Luke Institute over the past few months. But before I do that, I want to first congratulate Deacon Kevin Holland, Deacon Glenn Bailey, and their classmates. It was sad and upsetting for me that I could not be there with all of you and with them for their ordinations, but I was lifting them up in prayer and still am. What a great joy the Church has in having them as deacons, and the Church will be blessed again in having Kevin as a priest. May God bless them and keep them on their journeys and grant them many joys in their ministry to Him and His people.

I also want to thank all of you in the parish for your love, your prayers, and your support. I have received so many cards and letters for many of you, and my parents have shared with me the support that you have given them when they came up to Erie for the 12:10PM Mass. My mom and my dad have told me that I have so much support from all of you and that I am missed by you. Thank you so much for remembering me in your thoughts and prayers and for reaching out to me in my time of need. I cannot be grateful enough, not just for your love and support, but also for you, all of you and each of you. I have been so blessed to serve, feed, and shepherd you as a priest of Jesus Christ. As St. Paul often told the people of the churches he established and visited, you are the crown and glory of all my brother priests and me. I miss you all very much, and know that since I have been away from you, you have always remained in my prayers, especially in my offering of the Mass and in my praying the Liturgy of the Hours. Even though we are separated from each other by distance, we remain connected with each other spiritually, in prayer, in the Sacraments, and in sharing one another's burdens.

These last three months have been, without doubt, the hardest months of my life. It has not been a vacation, a pilgrimage, or an adventure. The therapists on staff here have helped me tremendously. They have taught me and given me so much in helping me rise above my depression, but it has been far from easy. They diagnosed my condition as a major depressive disorder, and I realize that I was in my first major depressive episode before and during my first weeks here. I have come out of that episode since then, and the medication I am taking now is working well to keep me from falling back into another one. In addition to my major depressive disorder, I have been battling other health conditions that have surfaced, one of which is mild pancreatitis. I am currently on a special low-fat diet because of this. More than anything, however, my time away from my family, from my brother priests, and from all of you has been very difficult for me, beyond what words can describe.

All of this suffering is why your cards, letters, thoughts, prayers, and love have meant so much to me. This is why I long for the day when I get to come home. By now, all of you know that I will not be continuing at Our Lady of Peace Parish when I return. As much as I am going to miss you all, I understand and agree with the bishop's decision in this regard. It is going to be really tough for me, not being with you, and I know that the news must have been pretty shocking for many, if not most, of you, considering that most of the cards and letters I have received from you here assumed that I was coming back to you. I have been praying for you all every day that I have been away, but since the bishop informed me of his decision, I have been praying in a special way for whatever graces you all might need in this transition of my departure and Fr. Mark Hoffman's arrival to the parish. I don't know what the future holds for me when I get back. Until that day and beyond that day, please continue to pray for me, as I continue to pray for all of you. I miss you, I love you, and I hope that Christ gives you all that you need to continue to follow Him and grow closer to Him over the summer and in all the days and years to come.




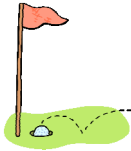
