Bishop Persico has again designated **September 15th (the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows)** as **day of Prayer for Healing** in response to the Grand Jury Report and the misconduct in the church reported there. ***So our church at Our Lady of Peace will be open from 7AM to 7PM to invite everyone to visit a Catholic Church and spend time in prayer in whatever way the Holy Spirit moves them.*** This weekend we will again recite the Litany for Healing at all the Masses. Also, in response to the Bishop's request that we have opportunities for *Eucharistic Adoration* with the special intentions of victim/survivors, the healing of the church and the sanctification of the clergy, we will have a **holy hour of Adoration during the day of prayer from 5:15-6:15PM**. Fr. Hoffman and I will be available for Confession during the Holy Hour and several of the deacons will be available for conversation as well. We will remain available until 7PM when the church will be closed.

***Free Copies of "Letter to a Suffering Church: A Bishop Speaks on the Sexual Abuse Crisis" by Bishop Robert Barron** This book was very helpful to several clergy at OLP and as well as quite a few people I have spoken to in dealing with the Clergy Abuse Scandal. LOST AND FOUND

Welcome to "Lost and Found Sunday"! Just in case being in church makes us proudly consider ourselves especially religious, today's Gospel suggests that we'd be wiser to admit that we're sometimes lost. Then we'll eventually be happily counted among Jesus' "found," because today Jesus focuses on a lost sheep, lost coin, lost son. Jesus does so because the Pharisees and scribes, proudly considering themselves especially religious, "began to complain" that Jesus "welcomes sinners and eats with them." So Jesus warns them—and us—to stop judging others. Marvel instead that God's amazing grace has found us! Indeed, we should become Jesus' friends lovingly trying to find others. So Exodus asks, if God "relented in punishment" and pardoned us, shouldn't we forgive fellow sinners graciously? Even Paul admits his "arrogance" as "foremost among sinners." We too, happy at being "mercifully treated," should share with everyone else Jesus' unflinching patience.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Last weekend we had another Welcome Weekend and 11 new families or individuals registered at our parish which is very exciting news. We continue to look at ways we can grow in hospitality and to help our parishioners, visitors and new comers to feel a sense of belonging at OLP. We also want to work on not forgetting those in our parish who are not able to join us every week at our regular family gathering which is the Mass, i.e. our homebound or those in the hospitals or nursing homes.

Our staff and other volunteers have been working on strengthening our efforts in each of these areas. Fr. Hoffman has been growing our hospital visitation team and working on their training. Parishioner Cathy Merrill is working on building up our home visitation team and communication about those in need of visitation. We are working on a new plan for ministry at the Nursing Homes. Dave Evans has been doing a heroic job of weekly ministry to the Catholics at Walnut Creek Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center on Zuck Road as well as LECOM at Presque Isle on Schaper Ave. Christine Beaver has helped with a monthly service at Niagara Village on Zuck Road. And the priests of OLP presently offer a monthly service at Parkside Senior Living on West 38th Street. We want to create a more consistent plan and will let you know when that has been solidified.

So you can help in two ways. ONE- consider becoming part of the ministry teams to serve the people of these communities. If interested please call Fr. Hoffman at the office. TWO- please let us know if you or one of your family members or neighbors are in the hospital or homebound or in a nursing home and would like to be visited or receive Holy Communion. Another aspect of this ministry that I have mentioned before is that if you or someone you know is going to the hospital for major surgery or enters hospice care, it is best to let us know right away and to be anointed before the surgery or at the beginning of the hospice care rather than wait.

One other dimension of our ministry to those who are not able to come to Mass is a new procedure at our Masses for giving Holy Communion to our ministers visiting the Homebound. Starting this weekend, our ministers will come to the step below the Tabernacle at the end of the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass, and the clergy who is reposing the Sacrament will stop and give them the number of Sacred Hosts required and quietly dismiss them. There are two reasons for this new procedure. One, the diocese has made it clear that we are not to give out extra hosts in Pyxes during the regular Communion Procession in order to focus on the personal reception of Communion and because there is no solid way to monitor those asking for extra hosts. Two, the importance of the visual image for members of the congregation to see that others who are not there are united with them at Mass in a special way and to remind us to pray for them.

May God bless our hospitality efforts, our ministry to the Homebound and Hospitalized at OLP and our week ahead!
