SEEDS OF FAITH

There is a brevity, a certain terseness, in the scripture readings for Easter Sunday. Peter's speech in Acts is built of direct, pointed sentences. Paul's letters are based on straightforward creed-like statements. Even the Gospel story only briefly recounts what will turn out to be one of the most remarkable events in human history—the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Advertising agents call these encapsulated points of information "bullet points." Scripture scholars call them kerygmata, or "kernels" of our faith. Actually, "kernels" or "seeds" are good terms for these statements, since throughout the Easter season, we will hear in the Acts of the Apostles, the Letters of Paul, and the Gospel accounts of the days following the Resurrection exactly how these kerygmata began to flower, how they continued to grow through the life of the early church. May these Easter "seeds" of faith serve a similar purpose for us, too, so that the life of the Risen Christ will flourish in us and through our witness in the coming days. Copyright © J. S. From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Happy Easter! I continue to hope and pray for the peace and safety of everyone. This is obviously a different experience of Easter for us but God's grace and love are not limited; even by a crisis of this magnitude. We have to allow the Holy Spirit to inspire us to celebrate fully the truth that Easter is all about... that Jesus has conquered everything that can separate us from the love of God-sin, death and yes, the corona virus! Let the peace and joy that God desires for us and for which He sent His Son, Jesus to save us, be yours this Easter.

I recently heard some of our leaders and others talk about something that has been discussed for decades but now has new relevance. When we talk about the "greatest generation" of Americans who lived in the early 1900's through the mid 1900's, we recognize a significant part of what made them great were the hardships and crisis' they endured- World War I, the Great Depression and World War II. These events formed them in perseverance, courage, hope, and strength, and the need for community to help them through. It remains to be seen how our Pandemic Crisis will compare to those enormous events but I believe this crisis will help form us in those same virtues. As I said two weeks ago in my letter, that's how the Pascal Mystery works- God brings new strength, growth and life from the suffering and even death that sin and darkness create and this is another way He will do that in our situation.

On another note, I recently mentioned that our parish staff and Pastoral Council wanted to look at ways we can reach out to members of our parish; particularly the vulnerable during the Stay at Home Order. If you would like to support this mission here are ways to consider helping:

ONE- If you are in need of assistance as far as finances, groceries, medicines or other needs please call the church and we will connect you with the local agencies that may be able to help.

TWO- Consider a donation to our OLP Needy Fund. I know it is a difficult time for many of us financially, but if you are in the space to donate please help us build up this fund. All money in this fund goes toward our fellow parishioners in need.

THREE- Can you volunteer your time to help with grocery, medicine or other essential need deliveries? There are ways that this can be done while still observing the guidelines for social distancing.

Please email the parish at olp@olp.org if you would like to aid in this ministry. We hope this can be a way to help us grow as a community in this difficult time and so allow the Paschal Mystery to be alive in us.

Other notes from the pastor...

**We are now live-streaming daily Mass at 9am and Sunday Mass at 10am during the Stay at Home Order. All livestreaming is done through our Facebook page (www.facebook.com), Our Lady of Peace Parish (look for our dove logo). Once on the page, if you "like" the page it is often easier to find it later. The Videos link can be found on the left hand side; this is where our previous livestreamed services are saved as well as our live events.

The website (www.olp.org) is updated regularly with spiritual resources as well as the recorded services. **ALL** these resources are under the Faith Formation tab, Spiritual Resources page. Click on the Daily and Sunday Mass Videos on the right hand side to link directly to our Facebook page.

- **Bishop Persico has suspended all Scheduled Confession Times. Confessions are available by appointment only. Call Fr. Rich or Fr. Hoffman to make an appointment.
- **Easter Greeting "Christ Is Risen....He is Risen Indeed!" Every Easter I talk about this traditional Paschal greeting which is still used in many Eastern Catholic and Orthodox churches, and some Roman Catholic Churches. This greeting goes back to the early church and reinforced the ultimate significance of what we celebrate on Easter Sunday... that the resurrection of Jesus Christ is the defining truth for all Christians. It was said in a dialogue form in which one Christian would greet another with "Christus resurrexit!" (Latin for Christ is Risen!) and the other would respond "Vere resurrexit!" (He is Risen Indeed!). This form of greeting reminds us that our identity as Christians should be the first and most significant dimension of who we are.
- **Easter Octave The celebration of Easter (like Christmas) cannot be limited to one day, so we as Catholics reserve 8 of them, the OCTAVE of EASTER, to celebrate as Easter Day. The celebration of this most central part of our Christian faith, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, reminds us that the resurrection of Jesus, and its result, the conquering of sin and death FOREVER, requires a full week, plus one, to celebrate. We know that the celebration of the hope and joy the resurrection brings is what we celebrate EVERY SUNDAY (and what we celebrate for the 50 days of the Easter Season), but in these 8 days we amplify the FESTIVE REALITY of Easter. The most concrete way we celebrate the octave is at daily Mass where the prayers for Easter Sunday are said every day and we incorporate song throughout the liturgy. The Gospel readings at Mass recount many of the post resurrection appearances of Jesus to the apostles and disciples. Also, the Easter dismissal at Mass ("Go in Peace, Alleluia, Alleluia") is used all week. So consider celebrating Easter all week at daily Mass (through livestreaming of course!).
- **Divine Mercy Chaplet Novena During the Easter Octave we will live-stream the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3pm each day as part of the Novena leading up to Divine Mercy Sunday next week. As part of the devotion of Divine Mercy, St. Faustina was told by Jesus to promote 3-4pm as the Hour of Mercy since that is the hour that Jesus died on the cross. If you are unable to join us at 3pm, the video of the daily chaplet will remain available to watch on our parish Facebook page as well as on our website page.

**Walk Thru the Windows of OLP/Christian Song Recommendation

I have been talking about learning about our beautiful windows at OLP since my arrival. I thought this time of limited freedom would be a great opportunity to finally do that. For the 30 days of April we will have a 5 minute explanation of each window given by members of our OLP clergy. There are 28 windows throughout the main church, chapel and vestibule and there will be an introduction and conclusion to the series to complete the 30 days. Each video includes an explanation of the window as well as a spiritual lesson; may our windows feed our mind and our soul. In connection with my encouragement last week to utilize this time of isolation to get more exposure to Christian music, I am recommending a Christian song with each window that will also be posted on Facebook. Keep an eye out for those recommendations and I hope they will inspire you as they have inspired me. **Divine Mercy Sunday Next Sunday, **April 19**th is the last day of the Easter Octave and the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday (St. John Paul II established that feast back in 2000 when he canonized St. Faustina). We will hold our normal Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration virtually and it will include the singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet from 3-4pm. As we are not be able to have our normal confessions before and during the Holy Hour you are

- encouraged to call one of our priests to make an appointment.

 **Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2020 So far we have received 453 pledges for \$176,016. Thank you to all who have responded! Our parish goal is 700 pledges for \$200,000. Every dollar raised over our assessment from the Diocese (\$151,719) stays in our parish to fund the project identified by our parish leadership, liturgical renewal. More specifically a new gold processional cross; restoration of the church tabernacle, crown, all our candle stands, holy water fonts, and other items for the sanctuary; replace the altar server albs; and acquire new altar cloths and banners for our sanctuary.
- **Parish Needs We know these are difficult times for everyone, including you and your family. Our Lady of Peace is committed to the spiritual care of our parishioners and the faithful in our community. We operate solely on your generosity which enables us to meet our financial obligations. Request Regarding Convalescent Home Residents

In an effort to have the most up-to-date information regarding OLP senior parishioners who now reside in Nursing / Convalescent / Rehabilitation centers, we ask that either the person or their next of kin please let us know of their location information. Our parish has been trying very hard to stay connected to our elders as a serious part of our mission to minster to parishioners in special living facilities. We want them to know they are not forgotten.

The situation is that many of the community living centers do ask for the resident's "religion", but few, if any ask their "parish." That makes a quick phone call or roster of OLP residents very difficult to produce. If and until that changes, we ask that a designated person please phone our office or drop us an email with the elder parishioner's name, facility, room number, and room phone number (if applicable).




