Family Discussion of the Week: Recognizing the Lord

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." (John 21:15)

**Adults:** In what way have you come to know Jesus better through the breaking of the bread at Eucharist?

**Kids:** When you next join Jesus at the table of the Eucharist, what would you like to thank him for?

#### GOD'S PLAN

Saint Peter speaks to us twice today. In the first reading, we hear an excerpt from his sermon on Pentecost; in the second, part of his first letter. Once a frightened, uneducated fisherman who often said just the wrong thing, now Peter is speaking what he knows to be true. Everything Jesus had said now makes sense. His death and rising were all part of God's plan, and our faith and hope can be centered on God.

Today's Gospel tells the story of Jesus' walk to Emmaus with two of the disciples. Frightened, sad, and confused, the two of them don't recognize Jesus, who tells them what we heard Peter say above: All this had to happen as part of God's plan. #### From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Several times over the Sacred Triduum I mentioned that I am particularly mindful of all of our candidates for sacraments who are being delayed by our stay at home order this month. First our First Reconciliation children were delayed back in March, then our catechumens and candidates for baptism and confirmation through RCIA were delayed on Easter weekend. This past week our Confirmation Candidates were delayed (April 20<sup>th</sup>) and now this weekend our First Communion children are postponed and next weekend will be as well. Our staff and I are praying for all of you and your families in a special way that the Holy Spirit of peace, patience and perseverance be with you. And we look forward to when we can gather again to celebrate these special tangible encounters with God's life and grace. As soon as we know the plans for those celebrations we will communicate that information to you.

I thank all of you who have been so supportive and appreciative of our efforts with social media to bring our liturgies, devotions and stain glass windows to you over the internet. This is definitely an area that our staff will continue to explore moving forward. We are looking at a permanent way (post pandemic) to livestream our Sunday Mass and to have our Sunday homilies online in case you are out of town or not able to attend at OLP.

Also Our "Walk Thru the Windows of OLP Church" will conclude this week (April 30th) and as a way to celebrate their success, I would like to start up a new catechetical walk... through our Catholic Sacraments/Sacramentals. Have you ever wondered why we use incense at Mass and other services? Are you still not sure whether Catholics believe in indulgences? Do you wonder who is eligible for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick? And are you frustrated with still having a middle school level understanding of what we believe about Confession, the Rosary, posture at Mass/ prayer or many other aspects of our Catholic faith? Then our "Walk thru 40 Catholic Customs and their Biblical Roots" is just the thing for you. It will be based on the book, "Signs of Life" by Scott Hahn. We will begin this walk on Wednesday, May 6th with an introduction and conclude on Tuesday, June 16th and each day a video will be posted at 8am (before the 9am Live Mass). Look for more a more detailed schedule of topics next weekend.

fundraiser every year, and even more importantly, our biggest community gathering. The Derby Raffle is also cancelled as part of that and we are offering to reimburse anyone who has bought tickets. For those who are in the financial position to consider it, we are asking you to donate your bought tickets OR to send in a donation as a way to raise part of the money that we usually raised through the Derby. - \*\*OLP Needy Fund and Parish Outreach Recently, I mentioned that our parish staff and Pastoral Council were looking at ways we can reach out to members of our parish, particularly the vulnerable during the Stay at Home Order from our government. Below are some ways we are reaching out:

ONE- If you are in need of assistance as far as finances, groceries, medicines or other needs please call the parish. We will connect you with local agencies that offer assistance.

TWO- can you donate financially to our OLP Needy Fund? I know it is a difficult time for many of us financially, but if you are in the space to donate please consider helping us build up this fund. Remember that all money in this fund goes toward our fellow parishioners in need and is not used for requests we may receive from people not affiliated with our parish.

THREE- can you volunteer your time to help with grocery, medicine or other essential need deliveries? There are ways that this can be done while still observing the guidelines for social distancing.

#### Ways to use this Pandemic Crisis for growth:

- 1. Refocus on what's important: family and relationship with God
- Develop new personal habits and rule of life:

   with more time on our hands we can recommit to the basic things in life that help us fully live- prayer, exercise, reading, relationship with others
- 3. Forcing us to slow down and strip us of our chaotic schedules and maybe consider adjusting them when normalcy returns: -do we really have to be enslaved to the overextended schedules that we try to keep?
- 4. Re-appreciate the Mass, the Eucharist and the community of the Church: As we are prevented from doing the most central and important action in our faith life, can we allow it to renew us in our appreciation of this incredible gift that is the Mass?
- 5. Explore other parts of our tradition: Since we cannot partake in the Mass/Eucharist, what the church calls the "source and summit of our Catholic faith," let's explore the many other dimensions of our Catholic Tradition that can help us grow.
  - a. Our Catholic devotions- Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Novenas, Stations of the Cross, etc
  - b. Devotion to Mary and the Communion of the Saints
  - c. Many different methods of prayer beyond devotional (see below)
  - d. Spiritual Reading- books that are not about learning our faith but that inspire us to live our faith more fully- Lives of the Saints, Writings of the Saints https://www.luc.edu/ccih/CatholicClassicsReadingList.shtml

\*As this pandemic was taking hold of us in the United States, I was struck by the timing of St. Patrick's Day. Recall that Patrick was kidnapped and forced into a life of slavery for 6 years. He was stripped of all the aspects of his life that sustained him- his family, the Church and the Sacraments. Yet it was during those 6 years that he took advantage of his job as a slave as a shepherd to develop his relationship with God through prayer. I believe St. Patrick is a great model for us in how to allow this "imprisonment" of ours through this Stay At Home Order to draw us closer to God.

- 6. Expand our ways of prayer:
  - Liturgy of the Hours- the other public prayer of the church beside the Mass. Get the ibreviary or other Apps for your smart phones or iPads.
  - b. Lectio Divina- prayerful reading of the Bible
  - c. Devotional (see above)
  - d. Journaling
  - e. Silence
- Learn more about our Catholic Faith- utilize our parish subscription to FORMED (Catholic ON DEMAND- see elsewhere for information on how to register) and explore the wonderful material for adults, youth and children.
- 8. Listen to Christian Music- some of my favorite artists are Matt Maher, Newsboys, Hillside United, Rich Mullins
- 9. Consider making visits to the church (a lost art)- I know we are being encouraged to stay at home but the government has kept churches on the "life-sustaining" business list so for those who are able, consider making a visit to church a regular part of your routine.
- 10. At our parish- this situation has forced us to expand more into social media and to work on other things that we have wanted to strengthen like our monitoring of our homebound members of the parish or those in distress. We will continue to explore new ways to minister and communicate which will help us not only now but for the long run.
- 11. Opportunity for our parish to look out for each other-consider ways we can help each other even with our separation. Several of you have contacted me to see if there are ways we can help those in need in our parish and community during this time of crisis. Our staff and pastoral council are exploring ideas so let me know if you have any suggestions or want to be a part of that.
- 12. Walk thru the Windows of Our Lady of Peace Church... I have been talking about learning about our beautiful windows at OLP since my arrival at the parish. So I thought this time of limited freedom would be a great opportunity to finally do that. We are having a 5 minute explanation of each window given by members of our OLP clergy. There are 28 windows throughout the main church, chapel and vestibule and there will be an introduction and conclusion to the series that adds up to the 30 days of April. We not only will explain the window but we will include a spiritual lesson from the window so as to let our windows feed our mind and our soul.

## TRY THESE TIPS TO GET OUT OF STRESS FAST.

- 1. Count to 10 before you speak or react.
- 2. Take a few slow, deep breaths until you feel your body unclench a bit.
- Go for a walk, even if it's just to the restroom and back. It can help break the tension and give you a chance to think things through.
- Try a quick meditation or prayer to get some perspective.
- If it's not urgent, sleep on it and respond tomorrow.
   This works especially well for stressful emails and social media trolls.
- 6. Walk away from the situation for a while, and handle it later once things have calmed down.
- Break down big problems into smaller parts. Take one step at a time instead of trying to tackle everything at once.
- Chill out with music or an inspirational podcast to help you rage less on the road.




