

IN NEED OF A SHEPHERD

For a while it was very fashionable to own pigs as pets. The publicity surrounding these creatures informed us that they were—contrary to their popular image—very clean animals, and also quite smart. Sad to say, sheep will most likely never enjoy this sort of domestic vogue. They are neither clean nor smart and are largely defenseless when left on their own, even in large numbers. The biblical image of us as the flock of sheep is not a particularly flattering one. Sheep without a shepherd are truly sad, because they most likely will perish either from their inability to fend for themselves or from their lack of defenses against predators. Placing ourselves in the heart of this unflattering image can reinforce our faith. Until we come to a profound realization of how much we need a shepherd, we cannot appreciate how deeply blessed we are to have been given a Shepherd, one who laid down his life for us and was raised to life eternal in the Spirit, so he might guide us and we might follow him in faith forever.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

A blessed Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for Vocations to you! The 4th Sunday of Easter has traditionally been called Good Shepherd Sunday because every year we read an excerpt from John's Gospel in which Jesus refers to himself as the/our Good Shepherd. In 1963 Pope Paul VI designated it also as World Day of Prayer for Vocations and our Popes ever since have asked us to intensify our prayer this weekend that "the Lord will provide laborers for the harvest." So please keep this intention at the forefront of your intentions this week.

We have two groups that embrace this call of Jesus and the church to prayer for vocations in an intensified way- the 31 Club and the Serra Club. The 31 Club invites its members to commit to offering one Mass a month for the intention of vocations to religious life and priesthood. The Serra Club meets once a month and seeks to support vocations in many ways (one of which is to maintain 31 Clubs). I encourage you to formalize your commitment to supporting vocations by joining them- call or email the parish office if you are interested.

Today is the **Good Shepherd Collection for our Retired Clergy**. You can use your specially designated envelope and send it in or drop it off in the money boxes found near the statues at the back of the church. If you do not have an envelope feel free to use a blank one and indicate Good Shepherd Collection on it. Fr. Caz (former associate pastor here at OLP who more recently helped with Mass coverage) is a retired priest of the Diocese and continues to benefit from this collection as well as others who have served our diocesan church over the years.

****West Millcreek Food Pantry in Need** We have recently been told that the Food Pantries are in special need of food donations since some of their normal sources of support are limited due to the Pandemic. If you are unable to shop; but would like to contribute monetarily please place the donation in a marked envelope. ANY MONETARY DONATIONS YOU GIVE will be used to go "shopping" by our staff and volunteers for the needed items.

****Special Masses for Pandemic** Bishop Persico with Permission of the Congregation for Divine Worship gave permission for a special Mass to be said "In Time of Pandemic." We have offered that PURPLE Mass several times over the past weeks and will continue to do so. We also will be offering some traditional Masses that are said for certain members who serve the community. The following is a schedule for those Masses:

Tuesday, May 5th 9am BLUE MASS- A Blue

Mass is a Mass celebrated for those employed in the "public safety field" (i.e. police officers, firefighters, correctional officers, 911 operators and EMS personnel). The color blue relates to the blue-colored uniforms predominantly used by these services. The service honors those who have died in the line of duty and those currently serving as first responders. The Mass is an opportunity for the community to show gratitude to first responders and their families especially in this time of pandemic.

Wednesday, May 6th 9am PURPLE MASS "In Time of Pandemic"

Thursday, May 7th 9am RED MASS- A Red

Mass is a Mass celebrated for all members of the legal profession: judges, lawyers, law school professors, law students, and **government officials**. Through prayerful petition and thanksgiving the Red Mass requests guidance from the Holy Spirit for all who seek justice, and offers the legal community an opportunity to reflect on what Catholics believe is the God-given power and responsibility of all in the legal profession.

Monday, May 11th 9am WHITE MASS-

The White Mass, so named by the color worn by those in the healing profession of medicine, is held in recognition of the dedicated work of healthcare professionals and to ask God's blessing upon patient, doctor, nurse, pharmacist and caregiver.

Tuesday, May 12th 9am PURPLE MASS- "In Time of Pandemic"

Wednesday, May 13th 9am GREEN MASS- This

idea created by the OLP Staff for the intention of the "unheralded" essential workers during the pandemic who work to ensure that the basic needs of our community are met. We will pray for those who help supply our food from the farmers, factory workers and processors AND those who transport our food and other supplies (drivers of all transportation from airplanes to trucks to trains, etc) AND those who stock the food and supplies at grocery stores, soup kitchens and food pantries.

****OLP Needy Fund and Parish Outreach** I mentioned over the last several weeks that our parish staff and Pastoral Council wanted to look at ways we can reach out to members of our parish particularly vulnerable to the Stay at Home Order from our government. So to start, I want to ask your consideration in 3 ways:

ONE- If you are in need of assistance as far as finances, groceries, medicines or other needs please call the parish. We will connect you with local agencies that offer assistance.

TWO- can you donate financially to our OLP Needy Fund? I know it is a difficult time for many of us financially, but if you are in the space to donate please consider helping us build up this fund. Remember that all money in this fund goes toward our fellow parishioners in need and is not used for requests we may receive from people not affiliated with our parish.

THREE- can you volunteer your time to help with grocery, medicine or other essential need deliveries? There are ways that this can be done while still observing the guidelines for social distancing.

Please email the parish at olp@olp.org in response to all three of those questions and we will organize this effort to best of our ability. We hope this can be a way to help us grow as a community in this difficult time and so allow the Paschal Mystery to be alive in us.




