
Rescheduled for Father's Day: Our Lady of Peace Pro-Life Committee Mother's Day Carnation Sale



All of us, no matter what path our life's vocation may take us down, have been chosen by God, made holy, and anointed as priests in the high priesthood of Christ through baptism. From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Happy Mother's Day! I know it is difficult to be restricted in honoring our mother's with the circumstances of the pandemic but hopefully we can all be creative as we have been throughout this crisis. We thank our mother's this weekend in a special way for their witness of sacrificial love to their children and families. Let us also say an extra prayer for all mothers we have lost this past year and their families (including mine- Mom (Mary Ann) passed away on January 4th).

Every year I reflect on the appropriateness of celebrating the anniversary of the dedication of our church building at OLP (May 15th) during the same week as Mother's Day since one of the ancient titles for her is "Holy Mother Church." Therefore, on Friday, May 15th we will celebrate the 43rd Anniversary of the dedication of our church (1977). The 9am Mass has special readings and prayers for the anniversary which will also be the focus for our Eucharistic Adoration at 3pm on Friday. Fr. Mark Hoffman will preach at the 9am Mass and speak about his memories of the dedication in 1977 and I will preach at the Adoration in the afternoon to speak about moving forward as a parish in this unprecedented time.

Speaking of anniversaries, I also want to publically congratulate Fr. Mark for his 30th Anniversary of Ordination to the Priesthood which was April 27th. Both as a native son of the parish and as our parochial vicar, we are very proud of him and his faithful ministry to our parish and diocesan church. As part of the May 15th celebrations, I would invite you to be a part of an **anniversary** parade both for Fr. Mark and for OLP Church at 4pm. I am sure some of you have been a part of such parades during this time (we have had 2 family birthday parades) where you drive by and honk, wave, maybe stop and say hello (drop off a card?) and move on. We are encouraging you to drive by between 4-4:30pm on Friday to celebrate Fr. Mark and the Church's anniversary. We ask that you approach the front of the church from the east school parking lot side and drive by the scout house and then in front of the church coming from the east to the west to ensure that we do not back up any traffic on 38th Street. Fr. Mark and I will be out front of the church with the church bells ringing.

****Encouragement for Candidates for the Sacraments** Over the Sacred Triduum I mentioned that I am particularly mindful of all of our candidates for sacraments who are being delayed by our stay at home order this month. First our First Reconciliation children were delayed back in March, then our catechumens and candidates for baptism and confirmation through RCIA were delayed on Easter weekend. Our Confirmation Candidates were delayed (April 20th) as well as our First Communion children April 26th and May 3rd. Our staff and I are praying for all you and your families in a special way that the Holy Spirit of peace, patience and perseverance be with you. And we look forward to when we can gather again to celebrate these special tangible encounters with God's life and grace. As soon as we know the plans for those celebrations we will communicate that information to you.

**Crusader Derby Cancelled (was scheduled for Saturday, May 2, 2020) Due to COVID-19 Restrictions we cancelled the Crusader Derby for 2020. We were hesitant to do so as this is our biggest fundraiser every year, and even more importantly, our biggest community gathering. Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - National CyberTipline: The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children's CyberTipline is the nation's centralized reporting system for the online exploitation of children. Anyone can make reports of suspected online enticement of children for sexual acts, molestation, child pornography, child sex tourism, child sex trafficking (included prostitution), child sextortion and unsolicited obscene materials sent to a child. Misleading domain names, misleading words or digital images on the internet can also be reported to the CyberTipline. NCMEC staff review each tip and work to find a potential location for the incident reported so that it may be made available to the appropriate lawenforcement agency for possible investigation. NCMEC provides resources/help in removing an online image. Reports can be made 24 hours a day, seven days a week online at www.cybertipline.org or by calling (800) 843-5678. Visit https://www.eriercd.org/childprotection/ to see that the diocese is doing to help maintain safe environments for children and youth.



TRY THESE TIPS TO GET OUT OF STRESS FAST.

- 1. Count to 10 before you speak or react.
- Take a few slow, deep breaths until you feel your body unclench a bit.
- Go for a walk, even if it's just to the restroom and back. It can help break the tension and give you a chance to think things through.
- Try a quick meditation or prayer to get some perspective.
- If it's not urgent, sleep on it and respond tomorrow. This works especially well for stressful emails and social media trolls.
- Walk away from the situation for a while, and handle it later once things have calmed down.
- Break down big problems into smaller parts. Take one step at a time instead of trying to tackle everything at once.
- Chill out with music or an inspirational podcast to help you rage less on the road.
- Take a break to pet the dog, hug a loved one or help someone out.
- Work out or do something active. Exercise is one of the best antidotes for stress.




