

Family Discussion of the Week: Bread for Others

I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh. (John 6:51)

Adults: What does it mean for you right now to be bread for others as Jesus was?

Kids: In what ways can Jesus' presence in the Eucharist help you do good things for others?

FOOD FROM HEAVEN

God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. And Moses tells them—twice—that the food that God sent was a food that neither they nor their ancestors before them had ever experienced before.

Jesus too speaks of food come down from heaven, food that the Jewish people had never experienced before. Recalling the manna in the desert, Jesus doesn't want them to forget it either, explaining that he is the food and drink of eternal life. And Paul reiterates to the Corinthians and to all of us that in the bread and in the cup, we share in the body and blood of Christ.

****Emmaus for Priests and Deacons** This week would have been the Annual Diocesan Emmaus Convocation for Priests and Deacons. Due to the pandemic it is cancelled; however, we will be connecting virtually for some reflection and fraternity. I ask for your prayers for the clergy of the Diocese of Erie this week in a special way and at OLP we will say a **special Mass for our clergy on Tuesday at 7am and 12:10pm** since that is the day of the virtual events.

****Pastoral Council Nominations** Nomination forms for Pastoral Council are being accepted. We are replacing 2 members who are completing their terms. You are asked to write a statement to the council outlining your reasons for nominating your candidate (or yourself) and then your nominee is asked to sign it as an indication that they accept the nomination. **The letters of nomination are to be turned into the parish office or submitted online by Monday, June 15th.** **Sacred Heart Novena for End to Violence and Racism in our Country The Holy Spirit is the key to our country moving forward in any effective way. Humanity is fallen and the division and inability to communicate and commune seen at the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1-9) after the fall can only be overcome by Pentecost... the transformation, metanoia (change of heart), healing, reconciliation, renewal growth, and LOVE made possible by the Holy Spirit. Join the parish prayer novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus which began on June 10th (the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is on June 19th) to pray specifically for our country and an increase of love and an end to the prejudice and racism that are opposed to that love of the Sacred Heart. I will live-stream the praying of the Angelus and Novena to the Sacred Heart each day at Noon on our Facebook page.

****Bishop Persico's Statement on Racism** "On this Pentecost Sunday, we pray that the Holy Spirit enlighten the hearts and minds of all people to see that racism in all forms is an evil. We should not be surprised by the riots that have taken place across the country, as well as here in the city of Erie. I do not condone violence in any form. But the outrage being expressed is the result of decades of oppression and injustice. It is my hope that churches, synagogues and mosques in northwest Pennsylvania can find meaningful ways to collaborate, bringing about real change in our region. People from every background and culture deserve a voice and opportunity. It will not happen unless we work together.

I support the powerful statement made by the bishops of the United States, which says, in part, that racism is not a thing of the past or simply a throwaway political issue to be bandied about when convenient. It is a real and present danger that must be met head on," they write. "As members of the church, we must stand for the more difficult right and just actions instead of the easy wrongs of indifference. We cannot turn a blind eye to these atrocities and yet still try to profess to respect every human life. We serve a God of love, mercy, and justice.

Too many communities around this country feel their voices are not being heard, their complaints about racist treatment are unheeded, and we are not doing enough to point out that this deadly treatment is antithetical to the Gospel of Life. We have much work to do. Let us begin by praying in earnest that the Holy Spirit give us the eyes to see, the ears to hear and the voice we need to speak the truth."

****VIRTUAL OLP Vacation Bible School** Due to health and safety concerns we are not able to conduct the normal VBS as we have done the last few summers at OLP. **We will be using an online program beginning June 22nd**. Those who sign up will be sent daily activities to do at home that will be complimented with a 15 minute live video each day from OLP at 9am that will include prayer, an introduction to the themes of the day and other activities. We hope that many of our OLP families join in taking advantage of this opportunity to continue faith formation at home.

Friday, June 19th is the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. We will have a solemn Mass with music at 12:10pm Mass that day and the Litany of the Sacred Heart will be recited after both Masses that day. The following day, **Saturday, June 20th is the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary which we will celebrate at the 8am Mass and there will be a communal rosary after Mass.

**Evening Prayer for Social Justice and the end of Racism and Violence in the USA Wednesday June 24th at 6:30pm we will have a prayer service for the end of Racism and Violence in our country. We will follow the protocols for COVID-19 being used for Mass. More details will be in the bulletin next week.

**REOPENING MASS The Bishop has continued the suspension of the obligation of attending Sunday Mass even though Public Masses have resumed. YOU ARE STILL NOT MORALLY OBLIGED TO ATTEND MASS. Those who are sick OR susceptible or vulnerable to illness are asked NOT to come to Mass. This is for your safety and protection. You are encouraged to join us for Mass via the internet and can make a spiritual communion with us from home. If you cannot access our Mass due to technological limitations, you can watch Mass on television as well Here is a summary of the Bishop's comments and what we will be doing here at OLP:

- 1. Our daily Mass Schedule has resumed for daily and weekend Masses.
- 2. All those attending Mass are required to wear a mask covering mouth and nose.
- 3. All those attending Mass will be asked to respect the guidelines of social distancing- 6 feet from all people other than those from your household.
- 4. All participants will be 3 pews apart. Because of this expectation we may have to limit the number of people who can attend each Mass. So we will be asking our ushers and other volunteers to ensure that we adhere to this guideline. EVERYONE is asked to respect the judgments and direction of these ushers and volunteers. If you are told you cannot enter the church because we are at capacity- please be cooperative and choose another Mass time. We will start with a "First Come, First Serve" approach and see how it goes.
- 5. There will be no singing at Mass.
- 6. There are more specific guidelines for the COMMUNION PROCESSION that will be reviewed at each Mass.
- 7. In general, I ask that everyone come with a spirit of gratitude, openness and patience and I am confident the Holy Spirit will take it from there!



SAINT ROMUALD (c. 951-1027) June 19

"God so loved the world," declares John 3:16. "Do not love the world," warns 1 John 2:15. The "world" to

love: this planet, entrusted to our stewardship, and its people, God's children all. The "world" to flee: "sensual lust, enticement for the eyes, and a pretentious life" (1 John 2:16). Born in nobility, Romuald's conversion followed the shock of witnessing his father murder an enemy. Renouncing his privileged world, Romuald sought God's world in



monastic life. Its winding turns and several dead ends make Romuald's journey resonate with all who find life more maze than superhighway. Both the hermit's solitary struggle and community life's unique challenges shaped Romuald's legacy: his vast Camaldolese Benedictine family of monks, nuns, and lay associates who, these thousand years later, from the mountain solitude of Camaldoli, Italy to an urban monastery in Berkeley, California—in Asia, Africa, South America, Europe integrate Romuald's experience into their witness of solitary prayer, communal charity and worship, and promotion of contemplative spirituality in this world that can so easily distract us from the God who loves it still. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright [©] J. 


