**Bishop Persico's Statement on Racism "On this Pentecost Sunday, we pray that the Holy Spirit enlighten the hearts and minds of all people to see that racism in all forms is an evil. We should not be surprised by the riots that have taken place across the country, as well as here in the city of Erie. I do not condone violence in any form. But the outrage being expressed is the result of decades of oppression and injustice. It is my hope that churches, synagogues and mosques in northwest Pennsylvania can find meaningful ways to collaborate, bringing about real change in our region. People from every background and culture deserve a voice and opportunity. It will not happen unless we work together.

I support the powerful statement made by the bishops of the United States, which says, in part, that racism is not a thing of the past or simply a throwaway political issue to be bandied about when convenient. It is a real and present danger that must be met head on," they write. "As members of the church, we must stand for the more difficult right and just actions instead of the easy wrongs of indifference. We cannot turn a blind eye to these atrocities and yet still try to profess to respect every human life. We serve a God of love, mercy, and justice.

Too many communities around this country feel their voices are not being heard, their complaints about racist treatment are unheeded, and we are not doing enough to point out that this deadly treatment is antithetical to the Gospel of Life. We have much work to do. Let us begin by praying in earnest that the Holy Spirit give us the eyes to see, the ears to hear and the voice we need to speak the truth."

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Thank you to everyone who was able to attend (in person or virtually) our Social Justice Prayer Service this past week. As I have said before, prayer is our first response in dealing with any challenges or issues we have individually, as a parish, or as a country.

The next step in our process of response is repentance. I mentioned at the service the fittingness of the fact that we held that service on the Feast Day of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, who ultimately was a martyr, not for following Jesus, but for standing up against injustice in his country. St. John knew the necessity of transformation of human hearts as a way to true justice and peace in the world, and he knew that transformation started with repentance and forgiveness. St. John's way of "preparing the way for the Lord" was to baptize them for the forgiveness of their sins which opened people to the one who would baptize them in "the Holy Spirit and fire" (Mt. 3:11). So we must repent as a country for the systematic racism that still exists in our nation today and repent individually for any ways we contribute to that systemic racism either through commission or omission.

The next step after that in our process of response is dialogue. We must find appropriate ways to continue to talk about these issues as a way to address them and not ignore them. For that purpose we at Our Lady of Peace will have a "Church in Dialogue" Session about Racism on Wednesday, July 8th at 6:30pm in the church. We have a subcommittee to help plan and lead us in that conversation which consists of Patrice Swick- OLP Parishioner and Director of Social Justice and Life for the Diocese of Erie; Eric Dart- OLP Parishioner and Chairperson of the Theology Department at Gannon University; Fr. Shane Mathew- resident priest at OLP and instructor of Theology at Gannon University; and Joanna Cherpak, OLP parishioner and the Executive Director of the Multicultural Resource Center of Erie.

As part of that dialogue we must also learn more about the issue of racism so our conversation can be informed. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Social Justice Department has the following suggestions from their website: (or re-read) "Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love - A Pastoral Letter Against Racism" using the accompanying Study Guide. Visit usccb.org/racism. 2. Create various large and small group opportunities for family and community members to process their feelings in the midst of news and commentary about vulnerable populations and law enforcement. Encourage participants to reflect or share their own upbringing regarding comments in the home, from parents and individuals, media and entertainment, even practices of the Church about the merits or demerits of certain groups of people made to be "the other." Ask. "How have I knowingly or unconsciously made this formation part of my world view? Where could I have spoken up but didn't?"

Let us keep praying for transformation in our hearts and in our country and may God bless our week ahead! Fr. Rich

**REOPENING MASS First of all, please see elsewhere for the Bishop's Decree on Reopening Public Worship. Second, please note that the Bishop has continued to suspend the obligation of attending Sunday Mass even though Public Masses will resume. So YOU ARE STILL NOT MORALLY OBLIGED TO ATTEND MASS. Third, all those who are sick OR susceptible or vulnerable to illness are asked NOT to come to Mass. This is for your safety and protection. You are encouraged to join us for Mass via the internet and can make a spiritual communion with us from home. If you cannot access our Mass due to technological limitations, you can watch Mass on television as well. EWTN continues to be a great resource in this time of Pandemic!

Here is a summary of the Bishop's comments and what we will be doing here at OLP:

- 1. We have resumed the regular Mass schedule for all weekend and weekday Masses at OLP. Monday-Friday, 7am and 12:10pm; Saturday, 8am and 5pm; Sundays, 7:30am, 9am, 11am and 4:30pm.
- 2. All those attending Mass are required to wear a mask covering mouth <u>and</u> nose.
- All those attending Mass will be asked to respect the guidelines of social distancing- 6 feet from all people other than those from your household. This includes respecting physical boundaries with no hand shaking, hugging or touching in any capacity.
- 4. All participants will be 3 pews apart and are not allowed to exceed one third capacity of our church. Because of this expectation we may have to limit the number of people who can attend each Mass. So we will be asking our ushers and other volunteers to ensure that we do not fail to adhere to this guideline. EVERYONE is asked to respect the judgments and direction of these ushers and volunteers. If you are told you cannot enter the church because we are at capacity- please be cooperative and do not challenge their judgment or make a scene. We will start next weekend with a "First Come, First Serve" approach and see how it goes. If we have problems with having to deny many people from attending Mass, then we will reconsider another approach to rotating our attendance.
- 5. There will be no singing at Mass.
- There are more specific guidelines for the COMMUNION PROCESSION that will be reviewed at each Mass.
- 7. In general, I ask that everyone come with a spirit of gratitude, openness and patience and I am confident the Holy Spirit will take it from there!

Registration forms are due no later than August 1, 2020. You can remit the form without payment by that date. We are not yet certain as to what classes will look like this coming school year so we are not asking for payment at this time. We will keep you informed about Religious Education as information is available to us.

Remember that in order for students to be confirmed in eleventh grade they must have been in a Catholic High School for ninth and tenth grades OR have attended religious education for ninth and tenth grades.

SAINT JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784) July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether different

but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan *padre* who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Saint Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his



doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development.
