

Family Discussion of the Week: *Laying Down Your Burdens*Jesus said, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. (Matthew 11:28-29)

Adults: When has Jesus refreshed you when you felt burdened by problems?

SHARE THE BURDEN

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). These words of our Savior seem to be in stark contrast to the previous chapter from the same Gospel, when we were told that if we do not take up our crosses, we are not worthy of Christ. Connecting these two messages might help us on our faith journeys. Being a follower of Christ surely means that we must embrace the cross, in its mystery of both suffering and triumph. This is something that we need not do alone, for the burden is often too heavy for us to carry by ourselves. Who, then, do we turn to? We can turn to the Body of Christ—the community of disciples gathered for worship. When we find the burden too heavy, let us remember that we can share that burden with our Christian sisters and brothers, who can help bring us rest.

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Happy July Fourth Weekend! Since 2010, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have encouraged dioceses around the country to highlight the importance of defending religious freedom as we approach Independence Day. "Religion [cannot] be relegated to the inner sanctum of personal life, without influence on societal and national life." -Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, 183. If religious liberty is not respected, all people suffer and are deprived of the essential contribution to the common good, be it in education, health care, feeding the hungry, civil rights, and social services that the Church and other people of faith make every day, both here at home and overseas.

Religious liberty will be a special intention at our weekend Masses and I encourage you to find ways to incorporate this intention in your daily prayers. We pray that our country can value true freedom as the freedom to choose what is right and good and holy and NOT just value the ability to choose as all that matters. As Catholics, we celebrate freedom at every Mass. It is the greatest freedom Jesus won for us on the Cross. It is freedom from sin and death (the ONLY things that can separate us from the love of God). So as we join our country in being grateful for our legal freedoms that she is founded on, let's make sure to not forget to be grateful for the spiritual freedoms that are even more important from the eternal perspective. Also a BIG thank you to our outgoing members-Greg Bosner (6 years), Lori Dever (2 years) and Joe Bello (3 years). I am very grateful for their commitment and service to our parish through this leadership team and I hope you will join me in showing our gratitude next time you see them!
- **"Church In Dialogue- Racial Justice" We must find appropriate ways to continue to talk about the challenging issues of our day as a way to address them and not ignore them. For that

- purpose we at Our Lady of Peace will have our next "Church in Dialogue" Session about Racism on Wednesday, July 8th at 6:30pm in the church. We have a subcommittee to help plan and lead us in that conversation which consists of Patrice Swick- OLP Parishioner and Director of Social Justice and Life for the Diocese of Erie; Eric Dart- OLP Parishioner and Chairperson of the Theology Department at Gannon University; Fr. Shane Mathew-resident priest at OLP and instructor of Theology at Gannon University; and Joanna Cherpak, OLP parishioner and the Executive Director of the Multicultural Resource Center of Erie.
- **USCCB on Racial Justice As part of that dialogue we must also learn more about the issue of racism so our conversation can be informed. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Social Justice Department has the following suggestions from their website: I. Read (or re-read) "Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love – A Pastoral Letter Against Racism" using the accompanying Study Guide. Visit usccb.org/racism. 2. Create various large and small group opportunities for family and community members to process their feelings in the midst of news and commentary about vulnerable populations and law enforcement. Encourage participants to reflect or share their own upbringing regarding comments in the home, from parents and individuals, media and entertainment, even practices of the Church about the merits or demerits of certain groups of people made to be "the other." Ask. "How have I knowingly or unconsciously made this formation part of my world view? Where could I have spoken up but didn't?"
- **REOPENING MASS The Bishop has continued the suspension of the obligation of attending Sunday Mass even though Public Masses have resumed. YOU ARE STILL NOT MORALLY OBLIGED TO ATTEND MASS. Those who are sick OR susceptible or vulnerable to illness are asked NOT to come to Mass. This is for your safety and protection. You are encouraged to join us for Mass via the internet and can make a spiritual communion with us from home. If you cannot access our Mass due to technological limitations, you can watch Mass on television as well Here is a summary of the Bishop's comments and what we will be doing here at OLP:
- Our daily Mass Schedule has resumed for daily and weekend
 Masses.
- 2. All those attending Mass are required to wear a mask covering mouth and nose.
- 3. All those attending Mass will be asked to respect the guidelines of social distancing- 6 feet from all people other than those from your household.
- 4. We are asking our ushers and other volunteers to ensure that we adhere to this guideline. EVERYONE is asked to respect the judgments and direction of these ushers and volunteers. If you are informed that you cannot enter the church because we are at capacity- please be cooperative and choose another Mass time. We will start with a "First Come, First Serve" approach.
- 5. There will be no singing at Mass.
- 6. There are more specific guidelines for the COMMUNION PROCESSION that will be reviewed at each Mass.
- 7. In general, I ask that everyone come with a spirit of gratitude, openness and patience and I am confident the Holy Spirit will take it from there!

Online Safety Tips for Parents & Kids

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Know the Warning Signs: Those who abuse children look like everyone else. They don't look like scary people that we should know to avoid. Rather, most abusers are known to the child, such as the parent, sibling, parent's paramour, parent's spouse, other relative or babysitter. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environment is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with children in areas where no one can monitor the interactions, (2) allows children to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids. SAINT MARIA GORETTI (1890-1902) July 6

Does anything match a mother's pride in her children? First Communions, confirmations, graduations, weddings: how these delight a mother's heart! Imagine, then, Assunta Goretti, the only mother ever to attend her child's canonization! In poverty-

stricken rural Italy, widowed Assunta tended fields for the Serenelli family, whose eighteen-year-old son, Alessandro, propositioned her barely twelve-year-old Maria; then, when she resisted, crying, "It is a sin! God forbids it!" he stabbed her fourteen times. As she lay dying, Maria assured the attending priest, "Yes, I forgive Alessandro! I want him to be in Paradise with me someday." Imprisoned,

unrepentant. Alessandro changed after dreaming that a radiant Maria had offered him fourteen lilies. "I've kept my promise," she smiled. "You'll be here with me someday." Upon release, he rushed to beg Assunta's forgiveness. "Jesus has forgiven you," she replied, "my Maria, too. How can I refuse?" Next morning, mother and murderer walked arm in arm to church and knelt side by side for Communion.




2020 Catholic Services Appeal Forward Together: Doing the Work of Christ
