From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

As we start a new fiscal year (July 1) I thought I would give you an update on our financial status during the pandemic as well as ongoing work to the property and campus facilities. As far as the finances are concerned, over the 3 month period of not having public Mass, we ended up with a NET loss of \$841. TOTAL REVENUES were \$344,903 and TOTAL EXPENSE were \$345,745. Before we get too excited it is important to note that we were awarded \$71,000 from the government through the Payroll Loan Program. Also, the diocese suspended all Diocesan Assessments including CSA and the School. The OFFERTORY comparison over those 3 months is- ACTUAL= \$206, 581 vs.

BUDGET=\$259,000. So the \$53,000 offertory deficit was made up mostly by the government aid. Regardless of the details, this is still good news to see that we were able to keep our financial head above water with the help of our diocese, our government and most importantly all of YOU... keep up the good work!

One way we were able to handle the pandemic financially was those who committed to Electronic Fund Transfer (in the past or since the pandemic started). This is a way to pre-plan your church giving which is then automatically transferred at a time you pre-determine. Please consider signing up for EFT. The link on our web page is <https://www.olp.org/about/electronic-giving-and-envelope-cards>.

In regard to the campus property and facilities, we have finished all the restoration of the liturgical vessels and items, and purchased new altar server albs and cinctures, which were all part of the CSA 2020. The only parts of the CSA liturgical projects that we have not completed are the purchase of new sanctuary banners and altar cloths and the rehanging of the tabernacle crown. The chains for the tabernacle crown have been delayed due to the pandemic and once we see that cost we can determine what money is left for the altar cloths and banners.

In the last few months we have also replaced all the outside bollard lights around the sidewalks of the church (used to call them mushroom lights because of the shape of the old ones) and have had sidewalks replaced in the front of the church and the school gym.

Regarding the landscaping, the weeping cherry trees by the southwest corner of the church have been damaged by snow the last few years so two have already been chopped down and the third will be removed in the fall. All three will be replaced with new trees in the fall as well. Two trees to the west of the scout house (the former rectory) have been removed over the past year and they will be replaced by a tree in the fall as well. Also, the landscaping to the north and west of the church will be redone in the fall. Recall this landscaping was all part of the CSA 2019 project as well as the bollard lights.

In the next few weeks, work will begin on repaving part of the school parking lot furthest east on Pacific Avenue. We will also seal and recoat the entire lot. And in the next 6 months or so we plan to replace all the lights in the church with LED bulbs which will require a retrofitting process (you'll hear more about this as Erie Gives gets closer).

Hopefully this gives you a good idea of where we stand as a parish regarding our property. There will be a full

Annual Report for the Fiscal Year July 2019 to June 2020 given to the diocese in August and I will communicate the summary of that report to you in September.

****REOPENING MASS- Protocol Reminders** Thank you for all your patience and cooperation with the new protocols at Mass. A few areas I would like to review. **ONE-** Remember at Holy Communion that you are asked to stay 6 feet from the household or individual in front of you in line (especially right in front of the minister where people tend to bunch up) and that an usher will dismiss your pew to proceed forward for communion; **TWO-** please remember to keep your mask on as you receive the Sacred Host in your hands and then to remove the mask once you step to the side to consume the Host; **THREE-** for those who would like the minister to come to them due to physical limitations, please stand in the middle of the aisle next to your pew to let the minister know; **FOUR** - Low gluten hosts are available at every Mass and if you wish to receive one, please proceed to the step of the sanctuary near the piano and one of the ministers will bring the host to you there at the end of the Communion Procession; **FIVE-** when departing please wait to be released from your pew by the usher and keep the 6 feet social distance to your car. **PLEASE NOTE** that you are asked not to congregate inside OR outside of the church before or after Mass. I know that this is contrary to what it means to be a community but for the sake of everyone's well-being and to allow us to continue to celebrate public Mass, please make that sacrifice!

SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA (1656-1680)

July 14

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville—Ossernon to Native Americans—in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions. Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of "Christian" traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity. Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri's faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young "Lily of the Mohawks" drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. Through us, does "the aroma of Christ" (2 Corinthians 2:15), attract others to the beauty of his gospel?

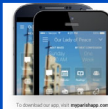

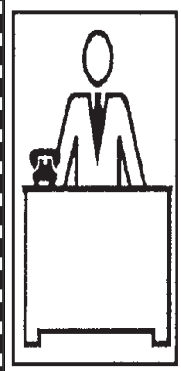

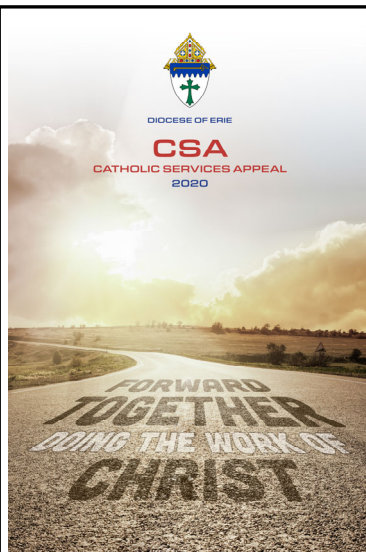
