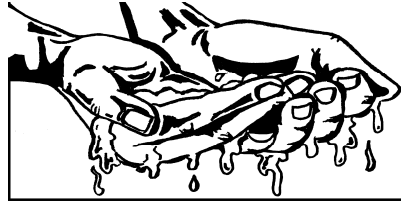

**OUR DEEPEST NEEDS**

The word of God serves up a tremendous feast for us today. Isaiah beckons all who hunger and thirst to come to the Lord for satisfaction. The psalmist cries out, "The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs" (Psalm 145:16). Saint Paul tells us that nothing can separate us from the love of God. Finally, in the Gospel, we hear the story of the miraculous feeding of over five thousand people from a mere five loaves and two fish. Most of us have our material needs met on a day-to-day basis. These scriptures, nevertheless, have much to say to the contemporary believer. We must ask ourselves, "Where are my deepest hungers? Where are my thirsts?" After material needs are satisfied and, in some cases, over-satisfied, many people still experience a deep longing for spiritual balance and well-being. As the loaves and fish are multiplied in today's Gospel, perhaps our prayer can be a longing for the satisfaction of the deepest needs that only God can fill.

**\*\*Fr. Mark Hoffman Reassigned to OLP** Fr. Mark Hoffman was assigned as the parochial vicar of Our Lady of Peace Parish last summer (2019) for a one year assignment. I am glad to announce that Bishop Persico has decided to extend Fr. Mark's assignment for another year. This is good news for us as Fr. Mark has blessed us with his good nature, dedicated ministry and love of the church, his priesthood and our parish. It also brings some more stability to our clergy presence at OLP.

**\*\*We welcome the CROWN** for the tabernacle back after being down for 6 months to be refinished. Thank you to all who participated in CSA 2020 that helped make that happen. If you have not made a pledge to the CSA please prayerfully consider making a donation.

**\*\*OLP Men's Picnic cancelled this summer due to COVID-19 concerns**

**\*\*2-Part Series on the Eastern Catholic Church and the Byzantine Rite** Chris Wheeler (Seminarian at OLP this summer) has posted a 2 Part Series on the Eastern Catholic Church and the Byzantine Rite. Check out our Parish Facebook Page and website to watch the videos.

**\*\*Seminarian Chris Wheeler Status** Chris has been assigned to OLP for another summer (2021) after his ordination as a transitional deacon. Chris is celebrating the next step in his preparation for diaconate and priesthood this weekend in a ceremony called "Candidacy." In that rite, Chris will make a public profession that he is committed to being ordained a priest and the church will continue to commit ourselves to praying for him. **The liturgy is this Saturday, August 1<sup>st</sup> at 5pm at St. Gregory Church in Northeast and led by Bishop Persico.** Please keep Chris and all our seminarians in your prayers this weekend in a special way.

**\*\*PARISH CENSUS RESULTS** We began our parish census in November of 2019. Our current results of the census show that we have 1,816 actively registered families/households (4,605 total members) which includes 46 new families/ households since the beginning of the census. 565 families/households were designated inactive due to no response to the census. The census team reached out to each family at least four times via letter or phone call/email. I hope to have some demographic breakdown of those numbers in the next few weeks.

**\*\*REOPENING MASS- Protocol Reminders** Thank you for all your patience and cooperation with the new protocols at Mass. A few areas I would like to review. **ONE-** Remember at Holy Communion that you are asked to stay 6 feet from the household or individual in front of you in line (especially right in front of the minister where people tend to bunch up) and that an usher will dismiss your pew to proceed forward for communion; **TWO-** please remember to keep your mask on as you receive the Sacred Host in your hands and then to remove the mask once you step to the side to consume the Host; **THREE-** for those who would like the minister to come to them due to physical limitations, please stand in the middle of the aisle next to your pew to let the minister know; **FOUR-** Low gluten hosts are available at every Mass and if you wish to receive one, please proceed to the step of the sanctuary near the piano and one of the ministers will bring the host to you there at the end of the Communion Procession; **FIVE-** when departing please wait to be released from your pew by the usher and keep the 6 feet social distance to your car. **PLEASE NOTE** that you are asked not to congregate inside OR outside of the church before or after Mass. I know that this is contrary to what it means to be a community but for the sake of everyone's well-being and to allow us to continue to celebrate public Mass, please make that sacrifice!



## FAITH FORMATION NEWS

We are working to finalize plans for Religious Education classes for your student. All students in **grades K-10** will be learning at home, online, beginning in October. Textbooks will be provided with access to the publisher's online content. We are planning that students will receive assignments that are to be completed and emailed back to their teacher. As we are still working with the book publisher to get the best rate, the fee for the 2020-2021 year is not final. Once we have the new rates we will let you know. Watch for an email toward the end of August with complete information.

**Confirmation students** will have online assignments beginning in October. Face to face classes will begin in January. We will be sending an email to parents at the end of August with complete details. ## SAINT JOHN MARY VIANNEY (1786-1859)

August 4

A busy pastor jokingly suggests the secret of John Vianney's holiness: "He died seventeen years before telephones!" Call they didn't, but visit they did, keeping Vianney eighteen hours a day in the confessional. Stories abound of reading hearts and exorcisms, but Vianney's first miracle was getting ordained. Difficulty with studies delayed him, prompting the rector's apology to the bishop, "So far to ordain just one, especially *this* one!" The bishop, who could not know he was ordaining the future patron saint of parish priests, replied, "No burden to ordain one good priest!" In Ars, only an elderly handful attended Mass, "praying," one told Vianney, "for a priest with brains." But he stayed forty-two years, fulfilling the promise he made the day he arrived. In a sculpture just outside the village Vianney points skyward: "Show me the way to Ars," he tells a boy, "and I'll show you the way to heaven." To someone who feared there was no heaven beyond the grave, Vianney smiled, "My child, it would have been heaven enough to have lived as Jesus' disciple on earth."
