

Family Discussion of the Week: All Are Welcome

For my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples. (Isaiah 56:7) *Adults:* The women in this story was persistent in prayer. For what do you pray insistently?

Kids: For what do you ask God to give you most often?

WHY PRAY?

The "foreigners" as Isaiah calls them, the "Gentiles" as Paul calls them, or the "Canaanites" as Matthew calls them are called to worship the one true God in prayer. As we listen to today's readings, perhaps we are tempted to ask: Why pray? The question is rhetorical; it is tantamount to asking why should friends talk to one another or people in love kiss one another. Prayer is a way of relating to God, a way of talking to God. The apostles had the opportunity to talk to Jesus in the flesh. We have the opportunity to talk to Jesus Christ in prayer. Our relationship with him must be enthusiastic; it cannot be faint-hearted. John Donne, a fifteenth-century poet, knew what the qualities of good prayer were. Donne asks God to treat him differently from most Christians. The poet does not want God to merely "knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend," but also to "break, blow, burn, and make me new" (Holy Sonnets, XIV).

It takes a dynamic faith on our part to come to God in prayer. As Jesus once said, "Knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). It may take pounding the door down, but if we are as persistent as the woman in today's Gospel, the results will follow. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

It is hard to believe we are five months into the COVID 19 Pandemic. I want to affirm everyone in our parish, community, nation and world for getting this far in a situation that has turned many lives upside down. A few groups for which I wanted to specifically express my support are:

ONE- all those who have continued to support our outreach programs at OLP. The volunteers that have continued to serve through Emmaus Soup Kitchen, the City Mission, St. Patrick Haven (members of the 7am Mass group), and Sunday Suppers (OLP is preparing and serving this Sunday), as well as all who continue to generously give to the Millcreek Food Pantry by brining items to church. THANK YOU!

TWO- all couples trying to get married during the pandemic who have had to reschedule, postpone, and change plans repeatedly. I commend the couples I have worked with for their perseverance and good attitudes and we continue to pray for all couples seeking marriage and all their family members and friends who it affects significantly.

THREE- all school teachers, administrators, staff, students and their parents who are working on the plans for coming back to school. I am sure we have all seen the changes and adjustments they have had to make over the last 2 months and I can only imagine the emotional and physical toil it has on everyone. Let's intensify our prayers and support for them as college academics have begun and the high school and grade school classes approach soon!

FOUR- all those who have been hospitalized or live in nursing homes, and their families and friends. I have walked with many who have had to deal with the restrictions on either end of being sick or supporting the sick and it is so difficult for them. We pray that they can find other ways to support and be supported during this time of separation.

FIVE- all those who have died or lost loved ones during the pandemic. Death is hard enough to deal with without the challenges of COVID so please pray with me for all those who have had to handle this most difficult part of our earthly journey during this time.

SIX- those who live alone. It can be challenging enough to deal with isolation let alone when it is intensified by societal limitations. Look out for those who live alone in your neighborhoods, social circles and families and pray that they know that they truly are NEVER alone with God.

We continue to offer a weekly Mass at OLP "In Time of Pandemic" to reaffirm our commitment to praying for this intention that is affecting everyone. In the imagery that I preached on last weekend, we plead with God to lift us up completely out of this pandemic if possible, but we also pray that we can trust that he is holding our hand if it continues. Let Jesus bring you peace, strength, courage, protection and healing as He walks with us on this hill of Calvary that is COVID.

- **Masks Required in Church Please remember that everyone who comes to church is required to wear a mask. You are expected to keep it over your mouth AND your nose. Please do not be offended if someone reminds you or are asks you to place your mask over your nose as this is important in keeping us all safe and healthy. If you have any concerns in this regard, please let me know.
- **Landscaping/ Memorials In September we will be taking the next step in our landscaping plan made possible by your support of the 2019 CSA. There will be a facelift to the landscaping to the north and west sides of the church as well as planting a new tree near the scout house. The tree near the scout house and the new flowers and plants around the Marian Shrine to the west of the church are available to memorialize for your loved ones. The tree near the scout house will be a magnolia tree at \$300. The plants and flowers around Mary can be memorialized for \$50 per plant from multiple donors. The statue will be placed in a new area with flowering shrubs/plants to honor Mary in a special way. Please call the parish office if you are interested in these opportunities.
- **Campus Clean Up There will be a parish landscaping effort to trim trees and bushes as well as weeding and edging on Friday, August 21st at 6pm and Saturday, August 22nd at 9am and will last for several hours. Volunteers are needed to refresh the look of our campus. If you have gloves, buckets or tools you are encouraged to bring them.
- **Weeding Ministry We invite parishioners to help keep up with the weeding of our grounds throughout the spring, summer and fall on a regular basis. If you are willing, feel free to stop at any time convenient for you and weed away. If you need tools you can call the parish office to arrange it. Accumulated weeds can be disposed in the dumpster near the school building.

On the days of the octave, the live recording will start at 11:40am with the Rosary, followed by the Angelus at Noon and then the Novena to follow (all before the 12:10pm Mass). SAINT PIUS X (1835-1914) August 21

Presidential vetoes we understand. But imagine vetoing a papal election! Yet in the conclave of 1903, the Archbishop of Cracow (ironically, a predecessor in that

office of Karol Wojtyla, the future John Paul II) vetoed the leading candidate on the order of the Austro-Hungarian emperor. Instead, the cardinals elected Giuseppe Sarto of Venice as Pius X, the first pope, after a succession of nobles and diplomats, to hail from humble origins. Nor did the papacy alter his endearing simplicity. Tailors eventually made his cassock cuffs detachable because he absentmindedly wiped his fountain



pen on them, forgetting that his old black cassock had been replaced by papal white! Taking as his motto "To restore all things in Christ" (Ephesians 1:10), Pius condemned the theological innovations called "modernism," yet dramatically altered the then-common practice whereby people rarely received Communion for fear of unworthiness, mandating early First Communion and urging everyone to frequent reception. Refusing to bless troops assembled in Saint Peter's Square—"I bless peace, not war!"—he died brokenhearted as World War I engulfed Christian Europe despite his peacemaking efforts. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. 


