Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

One of the last things Jesus said to his friends before his ascension was, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations..." (Mt. 28:19). Family Discussion of the Week: Come, Follow Me

Then Jesus told his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." (Matthew 16:24)

Adults: In what concrete ways do you take up your cross and follow Jesus?

THE CROSS OF JESUS

The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. As it has been through the ages, it is our perception of the cross that determines how we follow Jesus.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Happy Back to School Week! For most elementary students and families, some type of education experience begins this week with orientations and in person as well as virtual classes. Most college students began two weeks ago and most high schools began last week. As I mentioned several weeks ago, I have a heart for and admiration for all school administrators, faculty and staff who have been working so hard to make plans for reopening schools and for the students and their parents who have had to have great patience, flexibility and trust in this uncertain time. Please know that your priests, deacons, staff and parish family are praying for you in an intensified way in these days. I would like to suggest that our First Friday Adoration be offered for all those affected by reopening schools.

As an update, OLP and all ECSS Schools will have class in person with major adjustments for proper testing, distancing and mask wearing. We have to limit class size so all grades are full except $1^{\rm st}$, $6^{\rm th}$ and $7^{\rm th}$ so it's not too late to register or go on a waiting list.

Also, as far as school Masses go during the pandemic, we will have Mass each week on Tuesdays at 1:30pm. Only the class planning and leading the Mass will come to the church in person while the rest of the school participates virtually online. The doors of the church will be locked and any guests will be asked to enter through the parish office door where you will have to ring the buzzer to be let in. All guests are asked to wear masks and practice social distancing as normally expected at Masses in the church.

The first school Mass will be Tuesday, September 8th at 9am. This is also the Feast of the Nativity of Mary and the 63rd Anniversary of the blessing of Our Lady of Peace School in 1957. (There was a great television piece called "A Celebration of Catholic Education in Erie" shown on WICU several Saturdays ago that tells the history of Catholic Schools in Erie as well as promoting the Erie Catholic School System of which OLP School is part-1 would highly recommend it to you if and when it is available online).

May God bless our school communities in this new academic year and our week ahead!

- **THIS Weekend (August 29/30) is our Diocesan Missionary Cooperative. Each year the Diocesan Mission Office arranges a visit from a foreign or domestic missionary to come to OLP to speak at all the Masses one weekend to encourage our spiritual and financial support for their missionary work. This year, unfortunately, we are not able to host a missionary so the diocese has asked that we designate one weekend to take up a special collection for all the groups that were scheduled to come to our diocese this year. SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT (540-604) September 3

Imagine, fourteen hundred years after death, boasting a best-selling CD! Yet outside the Church and

within, Gregorian chant is enjoying a renaissance. Still, the timeless sacred music that bears his name is but part of Gregory's legacy. Renouncing civic service for monastic life, Gregory's administrative and diplomatic skills prompted continual summons from the cloister. Papal ambassador and advisor, he was eventually elected pope himself, renowned as a wise steward of the church's material possessions, generous benefactor of



the poor, sponsor of missionaries, and promotor of monasticism. His liturgical enrichment of the Church endures not only in Gregorian chant, but in eloquent homilies still gracing the Liturgy of the Hours, the "Gregorian Canon" (Eucharistic Prayer I), and his spiritual classic, *Pastoral Care*, once presented to new bishops at ordination. Of countless impressive papal titles— Supreme Pontiff, Vicar of Christ, Successor of Saint Peter, Prince of the Apostles—the title still so cherished that it heads official documents is the one Gregory coined to describe his papal ideal: Servant of the Servants of God. Together with being designated "the Great," a fitting epitaph.

Even if you are a fully initiated Catholic, we still need your help with recruiting for RCIA. You can help in one of three specific ways:

PRAY! Pray for the Holy Spirit to inspire and convict people to conversion. This Thursday and Friday are a great opportunity to pray on the feasts of Sts. Monica and Augustine. Remember that they are both patron saints of conversion as St. Monica prayed for the conversion of her son, St. Augustine, for 30 years while he explored paganism and philosophy. They are also great intercessors for parents and grandparents who are praying for the return of their Catholic children and grandchildren who have fallen away from the church.

ENCOURAGE! If you know someone in your social network of family and friends who is searching or has been coming to Mass with you or others but has not fully joined, you could be the instrument God wants to use to encourage them and get them to take this important step.

RECOMMEND! If you know someone you would like to recommend to us, the parish staff, for RCIA, call us. Maybe you already encouraged them and they seem open but just will not take that final step or you have observed them from a distance and feel they might be open. We could reach out to them and possibly that could be the moment they respond.

We do not know if we do not ask. We do not want to look back some day and wonder because we never asked or encouraged them. So let's make one last push these next few weeks to see who God might be calling RIGHT NOW to be part of our church family.


