screening of all employees and volunteers who work with minors, training of all youth, parents, employees and volunteers, and reporting all suspected child abuse. The diocese is committed to promptly reporting any suspected child abuse directly to ChildLine or Law Enforcement. The diocese requires on-going screening and training of all personnel, paid or unpaid, who have regular contact with our children and youth under the age of 18. the diocese also requires yearly safe environment training of our children, youth and parents regarding touchingsafety and safe environments. Family Discussion of the Week: Forgiveness and Mercy Then Peter came and said to him, :Lord, if another member of the church sins against you, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but I tell you, seventy-seven times." (Matthew 18:21-22) Adults: When someone hurts you, how do you forgive them? *Kids:* When have you forgiven someone who treated you unfairly?

FORGIVENESS

Nearly ten years before, a son and father had parted ways when the business they shared went bankrupt. The son blamed the father. They did not speak to each other again.

Then the father became seriously ill. The mother called the son and told him he had better come soon. The son walked sheepishly into the hospital room. The father motioned his son to him and whispered: "Did you ever think you could do anything that would keep me from loving you?"

Resentment and anger are foul things, the first reading from Sirach tells us. Remember the last things. Stop hating. Live by the commandments. As St. Paul writes to the Romans, we are to live for the Lord and die for the Lord.

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

The 65th Anniversary of our parish is approaching on September 30, 2020. We had planned to have a special picnic/party to celebrate but the pandemic has made us adjust (what else is new??). Our plan is to have an **outdoor Mass on Saturday, September 26th at 5pm in the parish parking lot** (like we have done for the picnic the last several years). At that Mass we will have a commissioning of our pastoral council members and focus on asking God's blessings on our parish in the year ahead. However, we will NOT have the great meal and activities we have had in the past.

Our picnic committee came up with a great way we can still celebrate our anniversary. We will attempt to "say" 65 Rosaries of Acts of Kindness and Formation between September 30th (the anniversary) and January 1, 2021 which is the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God and World Day of Prayer for Peace. For every act of Kindness or Formation that parishioners record and hand in, we will color in a bead of the Rosary on display in the church. Our goal is to fill in 65 rosaries (60 beads each) over the 3 months of this effort; that means 3,900 total acts of kindness and formation! There is no better way to celebrate our parish anniversary than to commit to growing as Christian disciples through acts of prayer, education and community building, and through acts of service to each other and our community as Christ calls us.

I will be sending out a letter to further explain this anniversary effort and provide a list of ideas for acts of kindness and formation, as well as a form to use to record these acts. For now, get yourself in the proper physical and spiritual frame of mind to celebrate who we are as a parish by seeking to be the best version of ourselves!

The specific intention of our Eucharistic Adoration will be the victim/survivors of abuse (especially at the hands of the church), the healing of the church and the sanctification of the clergy. The Holy Hour will be Monday, September 14th (the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross) at 7pm. May Jesus helps us find healing and peace through the intercession of our Patroness, Our Lady of Peace and Our Lady of Sorrows!

****Season of Creation** Tuesday, September 1st was the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation and kicked off the Season of Creation which spans five weeks between the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation (September 1) and the Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi (October 4). This "time for creation" offers, in the words of Pope Francis, "individual believers and communities a fitting opportunity to reaffirm their personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation as well as his pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live. #### SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM (c. 344-407) September 13

"Speaking truth to power" may have become just another cliche, but doing precisely that cost John "the

Golden Mouth" (Chrysostom) his diocese and, after exile and a forced march, his health and life. "Renowned for eloquence, heroic in suffering" (Sacramentary), John's scriptural insights still comfort and challenge. Mystical theologian, he bids Eastern Christians, whose principal Divine Liturgy bears his name, to lift up their hearts to "God ineffable, beyond comprehension,



invisible, beyond understanding, existing forever, always the same." Model pastor, he warns Roman Catholics in the Liturgy of the Hours not to neglect God-in-the-flesh: "Would you honor Christ's body? Do not scorn his nakedness, honoring him here in church with silken robes, while neglecting him cold and naked outside. What use to burden Christ's altar with golden chalices, while Christ himself starves to death? What use dressing the altar with gold-woven cloths, while denying the shivering Christ the clothes he needs? Do not adorn the church while ignoring your needy brother: he is the most precious temple of all!" (Saturday, Twenty-first Week in Ordinary Time).
