SAINT THÉRÈSE OF THE CHILD JESUS (1873-1897) October 1

"The cornerstone's dated 1872, but the stained glass is much later," explained the pastor, astonished when his visitor accurately dated it to just before the Great Depression, explaining, "The window for the Little Flower"—

Thérèse's nickname—"gives it away."

From her canonization in 1925, her statues and windows adorn most churches where European immigrants worshiped. Entering Carmel at fifteen, victim of tuberculosis at twenty-four, Thérèse proposed her "Little Way" to sanctity: doing ordinary tasks with extraordinary love. Thus ordinary Catholics, many of whom had lost loved ones to tuberculosis, embraced her. Though she never left her cloister, this Carmelite's spiritual communion and devoted correspondence with missionaries earned her the title Patroness of Missions. Her autobiography, *Story of a Soul*, continuously in print since her death, chronicles her prayerful perseverance through doubt and caused her to be the youngest person ever named a Doctor of the Church. Countless physical healings and spiritual conversions testify to her fulfillment of her deathbed promise: "After my death, I will let fall a shower of roses. I will spend my heaven doing good upon earth!"

Family Discussion of the Week: The Challenge to Forgive

A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, "Son, go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not; but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, "I go, sir," but he did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father? They said, "The first." (Matthew 21:28-31)

Adults: When have your actions not measured up to your promises? What was the outcome?

Kids: Why is it important to follow through on your promises to others?

FAMILIAR INSIGHTS

Spiritual teachers tend to repeat themselves, and to repeat other teachers. Maybe there really aren't that many different truths to tell. Just a lot of slow, sleepy human beings—like us—who need to hear the basics over and over. Consider today's readings.

People complain God isn't "fair," and Ezekiel answers that God is more than fair. People choose their own fates, and people can change. Even evildoers can turn, do right, and live. "Actions speak louder than words." A fresh new insight? Hardly.

Paul tells the Philippians that he would truly be encouraged if those who claimed to be believers would, in fact, look to others' interests and not their own. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." A novel idea? I don't think so.

In Jesus' story of the farmer and his sons, everyone knows that the one who said he wouldn't work—but did—is way ahead of the one who said he would work—but didn't. "Talk is cheap." Heard that before?

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

Happy 65th Anniversary of Our Lady of Peace Parish! Allow me to quote the 2005 Parish Pictorial Directory on some of our history at OLP... "On an early fall day in 1955, Father James F. Daily stood just outside the city of Erie and surveyed nearly 10 acres of land which one day would grow a community of faith. All he saw was open land and an unfinished four-room house. He had more questions than answers. Where would he celebrate Mass? How would he bring people together? What would he do first?"

"In September 1955, Archbishop John Mark Gannon had purchased a tract of land on the south side of West 38th Street in Millcreek Township. Always the visionary, Archbishop Gannon created Our Lady of Peace Parish anticipating the spiritual needs of people who would be moving into the area. On September 23rd he issued a decree establishing the parish on September 30th. Fr. Daily was appointed the founding pastor effective October 1st. His mission: establish both the physical and spiritual makings of a parish."

Other highlights of the first decades of the parish and school:

October 17, 1955- First Parish Masses held at McDowell High School Auditorium with 150 people

November 1, 1955- the unfinished house becomes the parish rectory (now the scout house)

August 19, 1956- Groundbreaking for the school

August 23, 1956- Fr. Daily moves into the rectory with the basement converted into a chapel for daily Mass
September 8, 1957- first Sunday Masses in OLP cafeteria

September 9, 1957- first day of school at OLP and 9am school Mass (388 students)

1965- School Gym/Auditorium built and Masses moved there

January 12, 1976- groundbreaking for the parish church

February 5, 1977- first Mass in the new church

May 15, 1977- dedication of the new church by Bishop Watson

I am so grateful for the commitment and dedication of all the living and deceased members of Our Lady of Peace Parish who have brought us to this 65th anniversary. I hope and pray that as we celebrate our anniversary, we are renewed in our appreciation for our past as well as our commitment to continue the legacy of OLP; a legacy that serves the needs of our community, bringing the light and love of the Gospel to the Erie area. We invite you to participate in the 65th Anniversary Acts of Kindness and Formation Challenge, showing the Erie community just what OLP is all about.

May God bless our parish and the upcoming anniversary celebration, during our week ahead!
