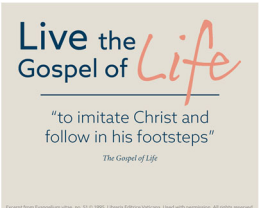

POPE MOVES THE DATE OF THE PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION TO 4 OCTOBER, DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

On 29 April 2020, the Director of the Holy See Press Office, Matteo Bruni, announced that: "Considering the current health emergency, the Holy Father has established that, for the current year 2020, the Peter's Pence collection, which traditionally takes place around the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on 29 June, will be transferred throughout the world to the 27th Sunday of Ordinary Time, 4 October, memorial of Saint Francis of Assisi".

The Peter's Pence Collection is a worldwide collection that supports the activities of the Holy See through which Pope Francis governs the Church and exercises his charitable works. When used for charitable outreach, funds from this collection help those most in need. Take this opportunity to join with Pope Francis and be a sign of mercy.

SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI (1182-1226)

October 4

When Franco Zeffirelli's *Brother Sun, Sister Moon* was released (1972), people were shocked by the movie's graphic nudity in the dramatic conversion scene. Son of a wealthy merchant, Francis' aimless adolescence ended when a failed military expedition led to his imprisonment and complete breakdown. Once home, Francis rediscovered God in the beauty of nature and the ugliness of human suffering, caring for lepers, praying in the little church of San Damiano,



whose crucified Jesus he heard calling, "Repair my house, Francis, which is falling into ruins." Francis sold his possessions—and his father's—to fulfill this command. When his father objected, Francis disrobed: "I return the clothes, your name, and all you gave me: God alone is my Father now." Later, the pope would dream of a ragged friar stretching forth a single hand to prop up the crumbling papal Cathedral of Saint John Lateran. Francis indeed helped rebuild the universal Church, founding the Friars Minor (Franciscans), dying at a young forty-four, bearing the stigmata of the Christ whose living icon he remains—in the Church and far beyond it.

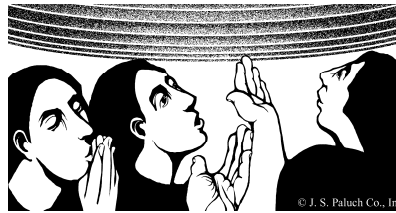

Family Discussion of the Week: Dealing with Injustice

Jesus said, "Therefore I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit." (Matthew 21:43)

Adults: How have you used your talents and abilities well for the Reign of God?

Kids: What can you do in your week to help the love of God grow in the world?

THE GIFT OF THE REIGN OF GOD

Matthew's Gospel today expands on Isaiah's ballad considerably. A comparison with the same story in Mark's Gospel clearly shows us that here the author is busy teaching this community of Jewish Christians: "This is a story about Israel a long time ago; this is also a story about Jesus and the skeptical leaders."

Jesus as much as told these Jewish leaders that they were the tenants who first stoned their own prophets. And he told the leaders they were the tenants who would soon even dispose of him—Jesus—and, in doing so, would forfeit their privileged place of presenting to the world the promised Messiah.

"And this," says Matthew's Gospel, "is a story about you, the inheritors of what was first offered to Israel." The reign of God was first opened to Israel and is now given to the whole world, but it must be received as a gift. The first Christians are the new tenants in the vineyard. The deeper reality of the reign or kingdom of God is that it is available to everyone on the face of the earth—Israel included.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

A blessed Feast of St. Francis of Assisi to you! Remember that when a feast falls on a Sunday we do not celebrate it liturgically. Nevertheless, here are a few things to keep in mind to pray for on this feast- (1) Pope Francis who was the first pope to honor this great saint by choosing his name; (2) proper care for God's creation as this is the last day of the "Season of Creation" and St. Francis is the patron saint of the environment; (3) pets on this traditional day for pet blessings (see below); (4) peace as we think of the great prayer of St. Francis; (5) and for all Franciscans throughout the world who continue in the spirit of their patron.

Speaking of liturgy, the Diocese of Erie updated the protocols for liturgy last week. Here is what we will be implementing at OLP the weekend of October 16/17:

ONE- Although we have been permitted to open up to every other pew, we will continue at every third pew until we fill the church at that level and seating becomes an issue. The allowable church capacity remains at 1/3 overall.

TWO- We are permitted to begin homebound communion ministry. Fr. Mark will be contacting our ministers and homebound to find out who is comfortable visiting the homebound and if the homebound are comfortable receiving visits. If you or your loved one have not received Holy Communion at home in the past but are now interested, please contact Fr. Mark at 833-7701 x205.

THREE- We will begin to have Lectors and Cantors serve at Mass. We will not have choirs, altar servers, sacristans and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion (minimizing exposure and contact points) at this time.

FOUR- We will gradually introduce more music to the Mass with an emphasis on the regular "Mass parts" and not congregational hymns.

FIVE- All other protocols remain in place (use of masks, social distancing, reception of communion, etc.)

This is a step towards normalcy. Your patience, support and participation in whatever way you feel comfortable continue to be appreciated and encouraged. If you have any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to contact me, Fr. Mark or Brian Kuzmin (Director of Liturgy).

May God bless our parish liturgy and our week ahead!

Other notes from the pastor...

****Respect Life Month** October is Respect Life Month, and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas and

chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities has issued a statement encouraging Catholics to allow "the Gospel of Christ to touch and transform our own hearts and the decisions we make."

New resources have been developed around the theme of "Living the Gospel of Life" and are available at www.respectlife.org. Respect Life Sunday falls on October 4. Archbishop Naumann's full statement follows:

"As Catholics in the United States, we will soon mark our annual observance of October as Respect Life Month. It is a time to focus on God's precious gift of human life and our responsibility to care for, protect, and defend the lives of our brothers and sisters.

"This year's theme, 'Live the Gospel of Life,' was inspired by the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of Pope John Paul II's encyclical, The Gospel of Life. Pope John Paul's masterfully articulated defense of the right to life for children in their mothers' wombs, the elderly, persons with disabilities, and the marginalized is more relevant today than ever before. "Last November, the U.S. bishops reaffirmed that 'the threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed.' While we noted not to 'dismiss or ignore other serious threats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty, and the death penalty,' we renewed our commitment to protect the most fundamental of all human rights – the right to live.

"This past January, I shared with Pope Francis that the bishops of the United States had been criticized by some for identifying the protection of the unborn as a preeminent priority. The Holy Father expressed his support for our efforts observing that if we fail to protect life, no other rights matter. Pope Francis also said that abortion is not primarily a Catholic or even a religious issue, it is first and foremost a human rights issue.

"The Gospel of Life provides a blueprint for building a culture of life and civilization of love. The important work of transforming our culture begins by allowing the Gospel of Christ to touch and transform our own hearts and the decisions we make. May we strive to imitate Christ and follow in his footsteps, caring for the most vulnerable among us. Through the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe, may Our Lord grant us the grace to live courageously and faithfully his Gospel of life."

****Respect Life Holy Hour** There will be a Respect Life Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration this Monday, October 5th at 7pm in the Church. We will pray for the respect of all life from conception to natural death and for an end of abortion, racism poverty. Euthanasia, human trafficking, capital punishment, embryonic stem cell research, and all offenses to life.

****Pet Blessing on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi** Our OLP parish pet blessing is **Sunday, October 4th at 1pm** in the parking lot between the school and church. Please join us in seeking his intercession for your pets.

****Last Supper Display Case** I want to express a big THANK YOU to Frank and Kathy Eberle who donated the time, labor and materials for the new handmade cabinet stand for the Last Supper Olive Wood Carving in the back of the church in between the statues of St. Joseph and St. Peregrine. They are also working on a clear cover that will protect this beautiful piece of art. The Last Supper carving was a gift to the parish from the pilgrims on the 2019 Holy Land Trip.

****Faithful to the Finish 5K** We are on the cusp of the “official” Fall Season and that means our “Faithful to the Finish 5K Run/Walk” is in the air. Like most things, we are doing it a little differently this year. Our run/walk will be virtual, allowing you to have from the time of registration through October 17th to complete the 5k on your own and send in your results. This is an important fundraiser for our school tuition assistance program and I am very glad we are able to make it happen. Not only does it support our school, it also promotes community and encourages exercise and physical health. I hope you can support the race and that the flexible “virtual” structure will encourage even MORE participants. ****Happy 65th Anniversary of Our Lady of Peace Parish!**
“In September 1955, Archbishop John Mark Gannon purchased a tract of land on the south side of West 38th Street in Millcreek Township. Archbishop Gannon created Our Lady of Peace Parish anticipating the spiritual needs of people who would be moving into the area. On September 23rd he issued a decree establishing the parish on September 30th. Fr. Daily was appointed the founding pastor effective October 1st. His mission: establish both the physical and spiritual makings of a parish.”

October 17, 1955- First Parish Masses held at McDowell High School Auditorium
September 8, 1957- first Sunday Masses in OLP cafeteria
January 12, 1976- groundbreaking for the parish church
February 5, 1977- first Mass in the new church

May 15, 1977- dedication of the new church by Bishop Watson

I hope and pray that this anniversary can renew us all in our gratitude for our past as a parish as well as renew our commitment to continuing the legacy that we have received in serving the needs of our community and bringing the light and love of the Gospel to the Erie Area.
