SAINT TERESA OF JESUS (1515-1582) October 15

Let nothing disturb you; let nothing frighten you. Gifted with a passionate spirit, young Teresa dreamed of converting Muslims and becoming a martyr. All things are passing; God never changes. But her mother's death when Teresa was fourteen inspired lifelong devotion to

Our Lady, and Teresa entered the Carmelites, Mary's order, despite her father's objections and her own fragile health. *Patience gains everything*. Initially, she enjoyed her lax convent's sociability and "busyness," but mystical prayer and John of the Cross's collaboration inspired her to reform the Carmelites. *Whoever has God, lacks nothing*. When her ideals encountered resistance and brought



suffering, she maintained her peace—and humor. Discovered devouring leftovers, she told her mildly scandalized nuns, "When I fast, I fast! When I eat, I eat!" To nuns demanding less work and more prayer in the convent schedule, she retorted: "What we really need around here are fewer starry eyes and more strong arms!" *God alone is enough!* The italicized sentences here are her "Breviary Bookmark," the simple, profound prayer of Teresa, the first woman Doctor of the Church. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. 

Family Discussion of the Week: **Living Our Faith** Jesus said, "Many are invited, but few are chosen." (Matthew 22:14) **Adults:** How do you translate your faith into the work of the Reign of God? **Kids:** What three things can you do this week to show that you are a follower of Jesus?

GOD REVEALED TO THE NATIONS

What wonderful images we have today of the reign of God! Isaiah speaks to us of a great feast—a heavenly feast—a feast of abundance with rich foods and choice wines. It is the Lord's own affair, Isaiah explains, when God will unite all nations, dry every tear, and destroy death forever. Then, too, will the entire earth rejoice in the Lord and bask in God's saving grace.

Jesus speaks of heaven in terms of a feast as well. Here, the kingdom of heaven is likened to a king's wedding feast given for his son. This is a feast of abundance also, with the fattened cattle prepared just so. But many of the people invited don't want to come, so the king invites anyone who would honor his son by their presence there. And Paul tells us that whether we live abundantly or in humble circumstances, we can do all things in the Lord who strengthens us.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my Spiritual Family of Our Lady of Peace-

As we continue in this Respect Life Month, I wanted to share with you a reflection on "Living the Gospel of Life" from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

"Twenty-five years ago, Pope St. John Paul II wrote that the Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' saving message to the world (Evangelium vitae 1). In taking on human flesh, dwelling among us, and sacrificing his very life for our redemption, Christ reveals the profound dignity of every human person. This God-given dignity does not change with our stage of life, abilities, level of independence, or any other varying circumstance.

Rather, it is rooted in the permanent fact that each of us is made in the image and likeness of God, created to share in the very life of God himself. The human person is a "manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory" (EV 34). And we must reflect this truth in how we act and how we treat one another.

The truth of the Gospel of life is at the foundation of who we are as followers of Christ. In his earthly life, Jesus provided the perfect model for how we are to love our neighbor and live out the Gospel call: "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt. 25:40).

Jesus calls each of us to "care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible" (EV 87). The Gospel of life is intrinsic to the whole Christian life and foundational to the decisions we make on a daily basis. For, "the Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel" (EV 2, emphasis added).

In his encyclical on the Gospel of life, Pope St. John Paul II recognizes the full range of threats against human life, from poverty and malnutrition to murder and war. He places particular emphasis, however, on threats to life at its beginning and end—precisely when it is most in need of protection. In modern times, children in their mothers' wombs and those approaching the end of their lives are certainly among the "least of these" in our world's estimation. Practices such as abortion and assisted suicide tragically reject the truth that human life is always to be cherished and defended with loving concern.

As the Church celebrates the 25th anniversary of Pope St. John Paul II's prophetic encyclical, let us reflect on how we personally live out the Gospel: Do I talk about and act towards others as I would talk about and treat Jesus himself? Do I inform myself of the Church's teachings and engage in the civic arena as first a follower of Christ? Do I support and advocate for laws and policies that protect and defend human life? Do I help pregnant and parenting mothers in need? Am I ready to support a loved one nearing death?

Through the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe, may Our Lord grant us the grace to truly and courageously live his Gospel of life."

**Adjustments to Protocols for Mass and Holy Communion

The Diocese of Erie modified the protocols for liturgy last month. Here is summary of what we will be implementing here at OLP the weekend of October 16/17:

ONE- Although we have been permitted to open up to every other pew, we will continue at every third pew until we fill the church at that level and seating becomes an issue. The allowable church capacity remains at 1/3 overall.

TWO– We have been permitted to begin homebound communion ministry. Fr. Mark will be contacting our ministers and homebound to find out who is comfortable visiting the homebound and if the homebound are comfortable receiving visits. If you or your loved one have not received Holy Communion at home in the past but are now interested, please contact Fr. Mark at \$33-7701 x205.

THREE– We will begin to have Lectors and Cantors serve at Mass. We will not have choirs, altar servers, sacristans and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion (minimizing exposure and contact points) at this time.

FOUR– We will gradually introduce more music to the Mass with an emphasis on the regular "Mass parts" and not the congregational hymns.

FIVE- all other protocols remain in place (use of masks, social distancing, reception of communion, etc.).

This is a step towards normalcy. Your patience, support and participation in whatever way you feel comfortable continue to be appreciated and encouraged. If you have any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to contact me, Fr. Mark or Brian Kuzmin (Director of Liturgy).


