Family Discussion of the Week: Social Responsibility

All that (Jesus) said to them "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that the God's." (Matthew 22:21)

Adults: How much responsibility do you feel the government should take for meeting the needs of the less fortunate in our society? How willing are you to contribute?

Kids: Who needs help in your neighborhood or community? What could you and your family do to help?

IN GOD ALONE

Isaiah speaks to us today of Cyrus, King of Persia, anointed by the Lord. God calls Cyrus by name and leads him in service to the Israelites. In this passage we hear that it is the Lord who gives Cyrus his title, who arms him against his enemies, and who opens doors and unbars gates before him. And God does all of this so that the people will know that "I am the LORD," and that "there is none besides me" (Isaiah 45:6).

Paul opens his letter with essentially the same notion—that in God alone we find our grace and peace. Paul also gives thanks to God on our behalf, calling to mind our work of faith, hope, and love. And in the familiar Gospel reading, Jesus tells the Pharisees to give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's.

****The Beatification of Fr. Michael J. McGiveny** (the founder

of the Knights of Columbus in 1882) will be held on Saturday, October 31st at 10am in Hartford, CT. It will be televised live on EWTN. Join in the celebration of the 4th US born male to become a "blessed."

****Fatima Movie** I have been meaning to encourage you to see the movie "Fatima" that was in some theatres last month. It is now available on Amazon Prime and some other media outlets as well as digitally (October 13) and on DVD (October 27). It is very professionally done as far as cinematography and acting and Andrea Bocelli wrote a new song for the soundtrack called "Gratia Plena." It is definitely worth checking out.

****"Pray" Movie** There is also a movie out right now (in limited theatres and not Erie) called "Pray: the Story of Patrick Peyton" which is only an hour long. It is the inspiring true story of a poor Irish immigrant who sets sail for America in 1928 with dreams of becoming a millionaire but, with the help of the most iconic celebrities of Hollywood, ends up spending his life championing the message, "The Family That Prays Together Stays Together."

****OLP Parish Anniversary: "65 Rosaries of Acts of Kindness and Formation for 65 Years"** Have you completed any "Acts of Kindness and Formation" towards the 65th Anniversary Rosary Challenge? Our parish goal is over 3,900 total acts of kindness and formation! There is no better way to celebrate our parish anniversary than to commit to growing as Christian disciples through acts of prayer, education and community building, and through acts of service to each other and our community as Christ calls us. ****Adjustments to Protocols for Mass and Holy Communion**

The Diocese of Erie modified the protocols for liturgy. Here is a summary of what we will be implementing at OLP:

ONE- The allowable church capacity remains at 1/3 overall. We will continue at every third pew until we fill the church at that level and seating becomes an issue.

TWO- We have been permitted to begin homebound communion ministry. If you or your loved one have not received Holy Communion at home in the past but are now interested, please contact Fr. Mark at 833-7701 x205.

THREE- We will begin to have Lectors and Cantors serve at Mass. We will not have choirs, altar servers, sacristans and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion (minimizing exposure and contact points) at this time.

FOUR- We will gradually introduce more music to the Mass with an emphasis on the regular "Mass parts" and not the congregational hymns.

FIVE- all other protocols remain in place (use of masks, social distancing, reception of communion, etc.). This is a step towards normalcy. Your patience, support and participation in whatever way you feel comfortable continue to be appreciated and encouraged. If you have any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to contact me, Fr. Mark or Brian Kuzmin (Director of Liturgy).

SAINTS ISAAC JOGUES (1560-1646) AND JOHN DE BRÉBEUF (1593-1649) AND THEIR COMPANIONS October 19

Their mission was to New France, but these missionaries found in present-day New York State and the province of Ontario a world wildly different from the homes they left behind. Six Jesuit priests, Fathers Isaac Jogues, John de Brébeuf, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, and Noël Chabanel—and Jesuit lay volunteers René Goupil and John LaLande—shared the gospel with the Native Americans they met, in languages they painstakingly learned, and through images they creatively adapted to the indigenous cultures (for example, John de Brébeuf's "'Twas in the Moon of Wintertime: the Huron Carol"). But their evangelization was caught up in turmoil beyond their control: a smallpox epidemic, battles between French and English trading interests—the traders united only by their willingness to exploit the Native Americans—and conflict among the tribes themselves, Huron, Mohawk, Iroquois. The missionaries' perseverance despite exhausting hardships, their steadfast courage in facing unspeakable tortures, and undaunted love even for those who martyred them, bore fruit, immediately in Kateri Tekakwitha's sanctity, eventually in the Catholicism that still flourishes in the United States and Canada.

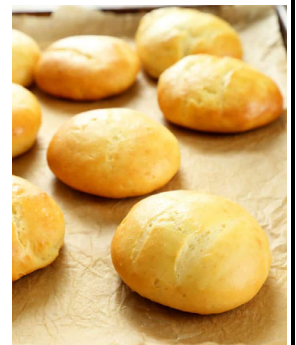

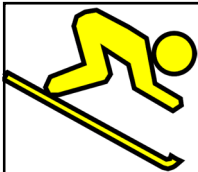

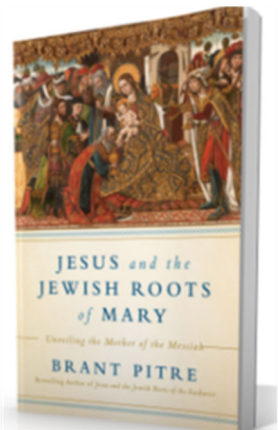
Forms need to be returned by November 11th to the school office or via email. Prices and discounts will remain the same as last year.
