

So the only reasonable way to approach a wedding is with a sense of humor, to realize that something probably will go awry, and, when that happens, to smile about

Jesus tells this funny story to encourage us to be watchful, yes; to be ready, yes. But he doesn't tell it to make us dour and somber. The heavy-hearted tremble, waver, lose sight of their place and purpose, and fall asleep. 

From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings from your spiritual home! I hope and pray that you continue to know the peace, protection and grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. I write to you at this time of year to share the annual report; but two other purposes as well. First is to provide you with the parish annual report that we are required to submit to the Diocese of Erie every August. Please see the back page of this bulletin to review. Second is to announce that we are again participating in iGiveCatholic. Third is to inform you about special Anointing of the Sick Prayer Services we are offering on Saturday, November 21, 2020.

ONE- Annual Report Summary- Fiscal Year from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020

INCOME:

Offertory Income (our parish's main source of income for general operating expenses) was 87% of our budgeted amount. This is not surprising as last quarter of the fiscal year began as the COVID-19 Pandemic hit the country creating financial difficulty for us and many organizations.

The Bequests/Gifts variance between actual (\$112,519) and budget (\$39,000) included the donations we received from Erie Gives 2019 (\$9,638) and iGiveCatholic 2019 (\$25,196). Also included are two bequests totaling \$25,000; which I am extremely grateful for these generous donations!

EXPENSES:

The \$7,208 overage in Altar/Sanctuary/Liturgical expense was offset by our plant maintenance coming in \$11,482 under budget thanks in part to a mild winter.

Between Utilities and Insurance/Taxes we came in \$13,804 under budget which is great.

In Capital Expenditures we were \$48,483 over budget (\$198,283 actual versus \$149,800 budget) due to the transfer of restricted school technology funds used for technology in OLP School to Erie Catholic School System.

As I have said the last three years, our biggest challenge continues to be in the area of our offertory. You may recall that last year I mentioned that we would be conducting an increased offertory drive in the spring of 2020. Due to the pandemic, we had to change that plan. We also decreased the budgeted offertory income for this year (2020/2021) because of the pandemic, yet we still find ourselves under budget for offertory for this year after the first quarter (\$244,500 budget versus \$214,458 actual).

<u>TWO-</u> iGiveCatholic, national day of Catholic giving, from November 16- December 1, 2020

Like last year at this time, our Finance Council, Pastoral Council and staff have decided to utilize the iGiveCatholic Campaign in hopes to address our offertory deficit of \$30,042. We have set a goal of \$30,000. Last year we were blessed to received \$25,196 from 103 donors. This year our goal for iGiveCatholic is \$30,000 and 130 donors. Our

kickoff date will be Saturday, November 21st (the Feast of the Presentation of Mary) which we designate as OLPGives.

Donations are accepted until midnight on Tuesday, December $I^{\rm st}$ which is the National iGiveCatholic day. See the enclosed materials for more information.

<u>THREE</u>- Anointing of the Sick Prayer Services on Saturday, November 21, 2020

Since my arrival at OLP we have had an Anointing of the Sick Mass on one of the weekends in the Fall and the Spring. Due to the pandemic we did not have an Anointing of the Sick at Mass in the spring and wanted to offer parishioners a way to take advantage of this special sacrament during COVID. Therefore, on Saturday, November 21st (the Feast of the Presentation of Mary and our OLP Gives Day) we will have short prayer services with the Anointing of the Sick at 12 Noon, 12:45pm and 1:30pm. Parishioners are asked to make a reservation as we will be limiting each service to 25 people. Each service should last approximately 20 minutes. Please call the office at 814-833-7701 or email olp@olp.org and indicate which service you will attend and how many total people will be in your group (not to exceed 3 including you).

**OLP Parish Anniversary: "65 Rosaries of Acts of Kindness and Formation for 65 Years" Our rosary continues to fill up with beautiful acts of kindness and formation. The parish goal is to fill the rosary with more than 3,900 total acts of kindness and formation and we are well on our way! Please turn in your completed acts and pick up a new form to continue the challenge. OLP is bringing the "light of Christ" into the Erie Community and beyond during this difficult time.

Two weeks ago Pope Francis caused a stir in the media over comments that were made in a film that was released on October 21st. I have included an article from Catholic News Service that is on the Diocese of Erie Website that summarizes the situation well. I am asking you to read that article to get the basic facts of the situation and not going to repeat them here. There are a few observations that I would like to add here.

One- never get your information about what is happening in the Catholic Church from the secular media. Make sure to utilize reputable Catholic sources to try to fully understand what is being said or done (Catholic News Service, the Catholic News Agency, the USCCB, the National Catholic Register, the Knights of Columbus- to name a few).

Two- when Pope Francis speaks to the media or in other informal settings, it does not hold the weight of official teaching, like Encyclicals, Apostolic Exhortations or Solemn Declarations EX CATHEDRA (from the chair of Peter). The Pope is giving personal opinions usually about pastoral areas of concern. I agree with those who say that it is not particularly helpful when the Pope does that since most people, media and even some Catholics do not make that distinction and it seems to lead to more confusion than anything else, but nonetheless it is part of his approach so we have to figure out how to deal with it.

Three- Pope Francis has NOT changed the churches definition of marriage or its' understanding of the sacrament of Matrimony. No church doctrine is being changed or proposed to be changed, the Pope is asking us to look at how we pastorally deal with the issue of homosexual relationships and the questions of justice that surround that issue.

Four- Pope Francis is NOT approving homosexual acts or suggesting the Catholic Church change her moral stance on that. Again, he is looking at the pastoral and justice issues involved.

Five- I am not convinced this is a translation issue as some church commentators and leaders have suggested. Yes, things can get lost in translation; but I believe that focusing on the translation is missing the Pope's ultimate point.

Six- I believe that Pope Francis wants to consider how to seek justice and love for all people, regardless of their way of life and regardless of what implications that gives to other dimensions of Catholic doctrine (one implication that

SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI (1850-1917) November 13

Burly longshoremen glared at the woman in widow's dress who interrupted their drinking to beg money, in broken English, for her orphanage. The bar exploded in laughter as one man responded by spitting in her face. "That was for me," the woman smiled. "Do you have

anything for the children?" Given today's national debate, could it be as much God's sense of humor as God's will for our sanctification that our first American saint should be an immigrant and naturalized citizen? Frances Cabrini, adopting the name Xavier, confided to Pope Leo XIII her longing to follow her Jesuit patron to Asia. But the Pope replied, "Not East—West!" So she and her Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart exchanged exotic dreams of



China for the impoverished reality of Italian ghettos across the United States and Central and South America. Before her death, Frances had founded seventy educational, health care, child, and family service institutions. Today, from Siberia to Ethiopia, in sixteen countries, Mother Cabrini's sisters and lay associates embody her practical spirituality: "Let's get to work! We'll have eternity to rest!"

some have raised is that if we seek justice for homosexual unions then we are implicitly approving this way of life). My sense of what the Pope is saying (and this is just Fr. Rich's take) is that while the church upholds her traditional view of marriage, he thinks it could still be acceptable for the church to seek justice and desire communion with our brothers and sisters in same sex relationships. I believe he is proposing that these 2 perspectives can coexist in a continued dialogue with one another and do not have to be mutually exclusive. I understand where the Pope is coming from and the pastoral challenges that come from this issue. Our church has much work to do (led by the Holy Spirit) to continue to process this issue and its challenges. I do not claim to have the answers but pray that we can all be open to this process and have faith that the truth will prevail through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Let us all seek to grow in relationship with Jesus Christ, who is the Way, the Truth and the Life, and from that, our path as a church will become more and more clear.






