The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish but all to come to repentance. (2 Peter 3:9)

GOD'S DELAY

In times of great difficulties scoffers taunt us, "Where is God? Why hasn't your Lord come to save you now?"

And we of faith respond much in the same way as Peter did in today's second reading: the "delay" of the Lord's second coming is not any type of punishment or failure to keep the divine promise, but a loving sign of God's patience. God is giving everyone the chance to seek repentance.

God does not make life more difficult. Rather, God lessens our burdens as once before for the Jewish exiles returning home to Judea after captivity in Babylon. It was God who personally led them, making a "straight highway" for them across the desert.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy Feast of St. Nicholas! I share with you an article from the Catholic News Agency about this beloved saint. "Every year on December 6th, the faithful commemorate a bishop in the early church who was known for generosity and love of children. Born in Lycia in Asia Minor around the late third or fourth century, St. Nicholas of Myra is more than just the inspiration for the modern-day Santa.

As a young man he is said to have made a pilgrimage to Palestine and Egypt in order to study in the school of the Desert Fathers. On returning some years later he was almost immediately ordained Bishop of Myra, which is now Demre, on the coast of modern-day Turkey. The bishop was imprisoned during the Diocletian persecution and only released when Constantine the Great came to power and made Christianity the official religion of the Roman Empire.

One of the most famous stories of the generosity of St. Nicholas says that he threw bags of gold through an open window in the house of a poor man to serve as dowry for the man's daughters, who otherwise would have been forced into prostitution. The gold is said to have landed in the family's shoes, which were drying near the fire. This is why children leave their shoes out by the door, or hang their stockings by the fireplace in the hopes of receiving a gift on the eve of his feast.

St. Nicholas is associated with Christmas because of the tradition that he had the custom of giving secret gifts to children. It is also conjectured that the saint, who was known to wear red robes and have a long white beard, was culturally converted into the large man with a reindeer-drawn sled full of toys because in German, his name is "San Nikolaus" which almost sounds like "Santa Claus." In the East, he is known as St. Nicholas of Myra for the town in which he was bishop. But in the West he is called St. Nicholas of Bari because, during the Muslim conquest of Turkey in 1087, his relics were taken to Bari by the Italians. St Nicholas is the patron of children and of sailors. His intercession is sought by the shipwrecked, by those in difficult economic circumstances, and for those affected by fires. He died on December 6, 346."

I hope the holy man behind the Santa story can inspire all of us to keep "Christ" in Christmas and never forget the true reason for this time of year. In our Advent Faith Formation program last Monday, Bob Rice spoke about the practice in his home growing up of placing a piece of straw in the empty cradle of Jesus in your manger scene every time you do an act of kindness or charity. I love that idea, especially great for the children. Let's create a comfortable cradle for the baby Jesus this Advent by imitating St. Nicholas with love for others in need this Advent Season.

**The Value of a Spiritual Communion One big sacrifice that some of us are making is not going to Mass in person and therefore not receiving the gift of the Eucharist, the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ. It is important for those who are in that situation to remember that they are not sacrificing all the grace of being physically at Mass and receiving Holy Communion. Our Catholic Tradition has always taught the value and grace of making a Spiritual Communion if we cannot receive the Eucharist. Whether someone is in a marriage situation that prevents them from going to Holy Communion, or they have not been going to Mass regularly, or they have committed a grave sin, or they have a physical condition that prevents them from receiving Communion, or whatever the case may be, there is still much grace in going to Mass or participating virtually.

Pope Francis says it this way, "United to Christ we are never alone, but instead form one body, of which he is the head. It is a union that is nourished with prayer and also with spiritual communion in the Eucharist, a practice that is recommended when it isn't possible to receive the sacrament." We are truly not alone, and at this time of pandemic it is most important that we join together in prayer and community. I remind you of one prayer for Spiritual Communion from St. Alphonsus Liguori that the Diocese recommended at the beginning of the pandemic and we have been saying it at Communion time for all of our live-streamed Masses. I hope you will join with us in reciting this prayer when we say it during Mass, and it's a great prayer to consider saying every day.

**PRAYER FOR SPIRITUAL COMMUNION: "My Jesus, I believe you are really present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you more than anything in the world, and I hunger to receive you. But since I cannot receive Communion at this moment, feed my soul at least spiritually. I unite myself to you now as I do when I actually receive you. Never let me drift away from you. Amen."

FEAST OF FAITH Watching for Christ's Coming

In the season of Advent, we look to the coming of Christ at the end of time, and we prepare ourselves to celebrate his first coming among us at Christmas. Remembrance of the past is combined with preparation for the future. Memory meets action.

In a certain sense, the Mass is an Advent prayer. At the Last Supper, Jesus did not tell his disciples, "Never forget what I did for you." Instead, he said, "Do this in remembrance of me." He calls us to remember by doing, to combine memory with action. In the celebration of the Eucharist, remembering and doing become one. Jesus is as present in our midst as he was in that upper room, breaking the bread and sharing the cup; but it is a new kind of presence, seen only with the eyes of faith. In the heavenly liturgy, there will be no need of sacraments, for there, "celebration is wholly communion and feast" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1136). Here, things are different. We have only glimpses and flashes of the beauty that is yet to be. And yet, in the liturgy, we truly participate in the heavenly liturgy. 
