Family Discussion of the Week: Through the Eyes of Faith

Jesus said to Nicodemus, "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:17)

Adults: Do you see the world as basically evil, or as good? What difference does this make in the way you live?

Kids: Where do you see goodness in God's world?

GOD'S MERCY

Today's reading from the second book of Chronicles contains a sort of "mini-history" of Israel. It highlights God's mercies in choosing Cyrus the Persian to be an instrument of deliverance when the people were in captivity in Babylon. Despite their sinfulness and the deserved punishment they were undergoing, God's mercy was lavished on the people in the form of a miraculous act of liberation.

The Letter to the Ephesians, in much more theological terms, gives a similar account of a God "who brought us to life with Christ—by grace you have been saved." The author stresses that it was when we were "dead in our transgressions" that God saved us, an act of pure grace. He emphasizes that it is not our own efforts that freed us from sin ("this is not from you"); rather, "it is the gift of God." This, of course, is the heart of the entire Pauline corpus, that salvation comes to us by faith in God's mercy, revealed in the death of Jesus.

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Laetare Sunday to you (the traditional name of the fourth Sunday of Lent which is Latin for "rejoice")! We are three and half weeks of Lent down with two and half weeks to go. We wear Rose this Sunday and add a little decoration and joy to celebrate that we have passed the halfway point in Lent. It is a good reminder that our Lenten efforts in prayer, fasting and almsgiving have the purpose of helping us grow in the Holy Spirit and its fruits of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, goodness, faithfulness, and self-control. It is also a good time to recommit to our Lenten initiatives if we have gotten away from them.

Speaking of joy and celebrating, we have two big feasts coming up for our diocesan and universal church this week. **This Wednesday, March 17th is the Feast of St. Patrick who is the patron saint of the Diocese of Erie** [recall that St. Patrick Church is the pro-cathedral (first) of the Diocese of Erie]. We will celebrate our 12:10pm Mass that day with extra solemnity and song and the Gloria and pray for our Diocesan Church and Bishop Persico in a focused way. Then **Friday, March 19th is the Solemnity of St. Joseph who is uniquely the universal patron of the entire Catholic church.** Because of this significance, this feast is still a holy day of obligation for most of the church throughout the world. Unfortunately, since it is not a HDO in the Catholic Church in the United States, it has lost a sense of importance. However, with Pope Francis declaring this the Year of St. Joseph, that importance has been renewed this year. So Friday, March 19th we will have a **special Mass at 6pm with full solemnity and music** (in addition to our regular 7am and 12:10pm Masses). Parishioners at all the Masses that day are invited to bring non-perishable food donations to church (or a monetary donation) for the West Millcreek Food Pantry. **Also, since this is a special feast, called a Solemnity, there is no abstaining from meat this Friday.**

On Friday the 19th our school community will have a special prayer service on at 1:30pm where we will dedicate a statue of St. Joseph to be placed in the school in honor of the Sisters of St. Joseph and the many years they served at OLP School. That service will live on the Our Lady of Peace School Facebook page. I encourage you to join us as we seek St. Joseph's intercession for our school community and mission.

May God bless our Diocesan Church and parish as we prepare for 24 Hours with Him... as well as our week and our Lent ahead!

****"Year of St. Joseph" Parish PLAN** This special year will continue until December 8, 2021 and I wanted to share you with here some of our plans here at OLP.

ONE- The statue of St. Joseph has been moved into the front of the church to remind us to honor St. Joseph and to encourage veneration and seeking of his intercession.

TWO- Our parish is participating in the **Novena to St. Joseph which started on Thursday, March 11th and ends on March 19th** (the Feast of St. Joseph). The novena prayers will be said in the church immediately after the Angelus at 12 Noon each day. On those days, the parish daily rosary (11:35am), the Angelus (Noon) and the St. Joseph Novena will be livestreamed on our parish Facebook page.

THREE- Saturday, May 1st is the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker and we will have a special Mass at 8am. Also that day is the **ordination as a transitional deacon, of our seminarian, Chris Wheeler, at 10:30am at St. Mark Catholic Center.** That mass will be available online and more details will be shared as we get closer to that date. Please continue to keep Chris and his two classmates, Nick Fratus and Ben Daghir, in your prayers.

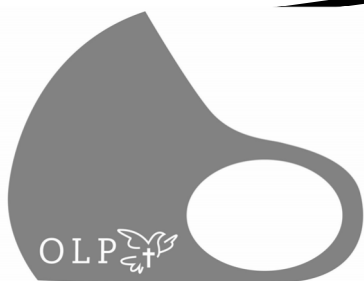

FEAST OF FAITH

Lent, a Season of the Word

Each year on the First Sunday of Lent we hear one of the Gospel accounts of the temptation of Jesus. In Luke's account, the devil cites the scriptures repeatedly, urging Jesus to interpret them in a false, self-serving way—if God sends angels to protect those whom God loves (as it says in Psalm 91), then prove it! But Jesus resists this insidious temptation by turning to scripture passages that tell of right relationship with God—living by God's word, trusting in God, and worshipping God alone.

Jesus himself listened to the inspired word of God and let it shape and form him. Through the liturgy, we do the same. The readings we hear at Mass can teach us, but that is not their primary function. Rather, the scriptures are meant to reveal the Lord to us, to let us experience his presence, and to form us in our Christian identity. Christ's presence is realized by his spoken word, "since it is he himself who speaks when the Holy Scriptures are read in the Church" (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, 7). In the readings proclaimed at Mass, we hear the voice of Christ himself.

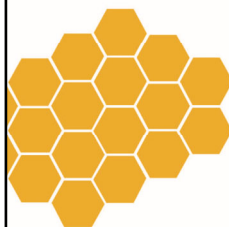
