To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

A blessed Palm Sunday and beginning of Holy Week to you! We join those who honored Jesus during his triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We take palms as a symbol of the ways that we can honor and adore Jesus more in our lives and to reaffirm our desire to welcome Him and never take Him for granted. I like to walk you through Holy Week to reinforce its importance and help you understand the significance of this week; Holy Week should not look the same as any other week of the year. PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL COMMENTS IN CAPITAL LETTERS INDICATE ADJUSTMENTS DUE TO THE PANDEMIC THAT ARE REQUIRED BY THE DIOCESE.

Monday (March 29<sup>th</sup>) is the Mass of the Sacred Chrism at St. Peter Cathedral in Erie (at Ipm). Bishop Persico will bless the holy oils for the entire Diocese for the new year (the Oil of the Catechumentate, the Oil of the Infirmed, and the Sacred Chrism). Also at the Chrism Mass the priests of the diocese will renew their promises with the Bishop to serve the spiritual needs of our diocese and parishes as ordained clergy. UNFORTUNATELY, THIS MASS WILL NOT BE PUBLIC. IT WILL BE AVAILABLE TO WATCH ON THE DIOCESAN WEBSITE (www.eriercd.org/livestream.html).

On Holy Thursday (April 1<sup>st</sup>) we gather for Morning Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours at 7am (YouTube). Then at 7pm we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper as we remember the first Mass that Jesus celebrated at the Last Supper with the apostles. This year Mass will NOT INCLUDE THE SIGNIFICANT RITUAL OF THE WASHING OF THE FEET where the clergy wash the feet of members of our parish community in imitation of Jesus' washing of the apostles' feet. All are reminded to keep that image in mind to remind us that we are all called to serve each other. We conclude that Mass with a Eucharistic procession which concludes in the School Cafeteria where we "go to the garden" with Jesus. THIS YEAR THE PROCESSION WILL NOT BE IN THE CHURCH OR COMMUNAL AS IT NORMALLY IS. The ministers will process with the Blessed Sacrament directly out of the church and over to the gym; after which everyone else will be dismissed. Those desiring to then head over to the cafeteria individually. There the Eucharist will be reposed in the tabernacle until 11pm at which time we will say the Night Prayer of the church with those who are present (livestreamed on Facebook).

**Good Friday (April 2<sup>nd</sup>)** is our most somber day of the whole year and we should all make an extra effort to be prayerful and quiet, especially during the hours of Noon-3pm (the traditional hours that Jesus spent on the cross). Morning Prayer is at 7am (Youtube). We will gather for our celebrations of the Passion of the Lord at 1:30pm AND 7pm. Recall that this is the only day in the whole year that we have no Mass and the tabernacle is empty (extra hosts are consecrated at the Holy Thursday Mass and are reserved privately for distribution during the Good Friday Service). The service also includes special intercessions and the veneration of the cross (THIS YEAR WILL NOT INCLUDE A PROCESSION FOR ADORATION OF THE CROSS WHERE PEOPLE COME UP INDIVIDUALLY. THERE WILL BE A COMMUNAL MOMENT WITH EVERYONE REMAINING IN THEIR SEATS). Please note that the church will be open Friday from 7am to 8:30pm for those who may want to stop and pray or meditate on the Way of the Cross privately (there will be copies of the Stations of the Cross at the doors).

On Holy Saturday (April 3<sup>rd</sup>) we will have Morning Prayer at 8am (YouTube) and the traditional food blessing at Noon (PARISHIONERS WILL BE ASKED TO KEEP THEIR BASKETS OF FOOD IN THE AISLES NEXT TO THEIR PEW). The highlight of this special week and the whole liturgical year is the Great Easter Vigil which will be held Holy Saturday night at 8:30pm. It starts outside with the Easter fire and candle procession (THIS YEAR ONLY THE MINISTERS WILL GO OUTSIDE WHILE THE REST OF THE CONGREGATION WILL REMAIN IN THEIR SEATS AND EACH GROUP WILL HAVE ONE PERSON HOLD A CANDLE FOR THEM). It continues with a special Liturgy of the Word which walks us through salvation history and then leads up to the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation for our RCIA candidates. It is the most unique and powerful liturgy of the year in our Catholic Tradition and everyone should experience it.

Then of course we have our **Easter Sunday Masses (April 4<sup>th</sup>)** with incense, special music (the Gloria and Alleluia return), and floral decorations. We will talk more about the significance of Easter next week but I wanted to outline Holy Week as a way to inspire you to participate in part or all of it. If you do, I guarantee that Easter will be more meaningful for you.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Good Friday, April 2nd, Catholics throughout the world are asked to give generously to the Pontifical Good Friday Collection in support of our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land. In addition to ensuring the guard of the shrines, the Good Friday Annual Collection allows Christians, the living stones, to inhabit the Holy Places and in so doing bear witness to the Resurrection of Christ.

The collection also helps the Franciscans and others to minister in parishes, provide Catholic education, and aid the Catholic community with housing, food, health care and employment. In these times of crisis, it also brings aid to refugees, as well as the sacraments to Christians in places like Syria.

Among other things, last year's Pontifical Good Friday Collection supported 23 parishes, 3 academic institutions and 120 men preparing to be priests or brothers. It provided funds for the restoration and maintenance of over 1,000 houses and apartments for Christian families and it created 1,200 jobs for Christians in the Holy Land.

Christians in the Holy Land have great need of your prayers and financial help. The wars, unrest and instability there have been especially hard on them. Please take this opportunity to reach out to those Christians who suffer persecution and hardship in the very land where Jesus lived.

## **FEAST OF FAITH** The Liturgies of Holy Week

Holy Week is the culmination of the liturgical year. During these holy days, the liturgy will lead us, with Jesus, to the depths and to the heights.

It begins with a harsh juxtaposition, as we carry palms in remembrance of Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem and then listen to the Passion according to Matthew, as the King is handed over for crucifixion. Then, on Holy Thursday, we remember the night Jesus was handed over-the night he gave himself for us and to us, to live in our midst forever in the sacrament of his Body and Blood. On Good Friday, we touch with our hands the mystery of the Lord's cross, the instrument of torture that has become the tree of life. Then, at the great Easter Vigil, the lighting of the paschal candle speaks to us of the triumph of light over darkness, of life over death. The resurrection of the Lord becomes a living reality in our midst as the catechumens for whom the Church has prayed throughout Lent are plunged into the mystery of Christ's death and share in the glory of his resurrection. 
