Family Discussion of the Week: Following the Example of Jesus

Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul; no one claimed private ownership of any possessions; everything they owned was held in common. (Acts 4:32)

Adults: What could you do this week to inspire your family to resemble the early Christians more closely?

Kids: What could you and your family do to help others who are in need?

DOUBT

The desire to be able to prove the existence of a divinity has troubled humanity since human consciousness first became aware of the divine. To this very day we are fond of saying that any number of things—from sunsets to hot fudge sundaes—are “proof that there is a God.” We get so caught up in the story of “doubting Thomas” that we fail to notice that today’s Gospel gives us John’s account of Pentecost, the bestowing of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples following the Resurrection. Thomas, evidently, missed out not only on seeing the Risen Christ, but receiving the Holy Spirit as well. This is not to be taken lightly and, perhaps, makes Thomas’ disbelief a bit easier to comprehend. It also makes his professing that Jesus is his Lord and God—the only time the New Testament explicitly refers to Jesus Christ as “God”—more remarkable.

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Divine Mercy Sunday to you! This is the last day of the Easter Octave which St. John Paul II established as Divine Mercy Sunday in 2000 when he canonized St. Faustina. **This Sunday we will have a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration which will include the singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet from 3-4pm.** Confessions will also be available from 2-3pm.

The devotion of Divine Mercy started in the 1930's when Jesus appeared to St. Faustina who was a sister of Mercy in Krakow, Poland. She wrote a voluminous diary of all the appearances and dialog with Jesus (which is available from any Catholic publisher). Below is a summary of the (7) main elements of the devotion that Jesus asked St. Faustina to promote:

ONE- the Feast of Divine Mercy, or Divine Mercy Sunday. "On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy."

TWO- the Image of the Divine Mercy. The Lord directed Sr. Faustina to have it made in the image of how he was appearing to her. It was to be signed, "Jesus, I trust You!" and was to be venerated. We have the image of Divine Mercy in our chapel to the right of the tabernacle but it will be in the main sanctuary this weekend for the feast so all can venerate it.

THREE- the Divine Mercy Novena. Ideally, the novena is to begin on Good Friday and completed the Saturday before Divine Mercy Sunday, though it can be prayed at any time. The novena divides souls into different groups, which are prayed for on a specific day. Categories of souls include souls who are "lukewarm," "priests and religious," "devout and faithful," "sinful," and the "souls of little children."

FOUR- the Hour of Great Mercy, also known as the three o'clock hour. This is the hour that recalls Jesus' death on the cross. Saint Faustina records in her Diary that "It is the hour of great mercy for the whole world. It is Jesus' desire that the moment of His Death on the Cross (3 p.m.) be venerated."

FIVE- the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy. Prayed on ordinary rosary beads, the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist. It may be said at any time, but Christ specifically told St. Faustina to recite it during the nine days before Divine Mercy Sunday. It is also appropriate to pray the chaplet during the Hour of Great Mercy. The chaplet is especially recommended to be said for those who are dying. There are pamphlets with instructions on how to pray the chaplet at the doors of the church.

SIX- the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion through which we meet our Lord Jesus Christ and are enveloped in oceans of His Divine Mercy.

SEVEN- the deeds of mercy in answer to Jesus' call to mercy. In her Diary, entry 742. St. Faustina records Christ's words, "I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your

neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to excuse or absolve yourself from it." Christ continued, "I am giving you three ways of exercising mercy toward your neighbor: the first - by deed, the second - by word, the third - by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy, and it is an unquestionable proof of love for Me. By this means a soul glorifies and pays reverence to My mercy."

With that in mind, it is helpful to recall that there are seven spiritual works of mercy and seven corporal works of mercy. They are:

Corporal Works of Mercy: 1. Feed the hungry; 2. Give drink to the thirsty; 3. Clothe the naked; 4. Shelter the homeless; 5. Comfort the prisoners; 6. Visit the sick; 7. Bury the dead.

Spiritual Works of Mercy: 1. Teach the ignorant; 2. Pray for the living & dead; 3. Correct sinners; 4. Counsel those in doubt; 5. Console the sorrowful; 6. Bear wrongs patiently; 7. Forgive wrongs willingly.

This is such a beautiful devotion so let's embrace it this Divine Mercy Sunday so that we can grow in God's love and mercy and invite others to be transformed by it as well!

May God bless our world with divine mercy and peace... and our 2nd week in Easter ahead!

Other notes from the pastor...

****Spring Cleanup** We will have a workday on the church and school grounds on **Saturday, April 17th at 9am.** Projects will include raking, weeding, possible mulching and whatever is needed to help beautify the grounds. ****Please note the Crusader Derby scheduled for April has been cancelled.** This is our biggest social event and fundraiser of the year; however we are planning some other community gatherings throughout the summer and other fundraiser opportunities as well. Keep your eyes open for a full schedule in the next month or so.

****The Pro-life Breakfast of Erie County** has also been cancelled that was scheduled for April 24, 2021. The next breakfast will be January 15, 2022.

****Special Masses this Week** Monday, April 12th and April 14-17- Easter Weekdays; Tuesday, April 13th- St. Martin I, Pope and Martyr (7th Century, combatted Monothelite Heresy that Jesus only had divine will (church teaches that Jesus had 2 wills, divine and human), died in exile and last pope martyred).

****Easter Season** This Sunday is the final day of the Easter Octave BUT the Easter Season continues for 6 more weeks until the feast of Pentecost on Sunday, May 23rd. We keep the decorations up in the church and incorporate the sprinkling rite at Masses as a few ways to remember we are still celebrating the joy of the Resurrection.

****Need Help** A year ago as we started the shut down from the Coronavirus Pandemic, we asked the following questions to see who needs help in our parish and those able to provide help. I would like to ask them again as we still deal with impact of the pandemic:

ONE- are you in need of assistance as far as finances, groceries, medicines or other needs that our parish could possibly help with? As before, I am not guaranteeing you that we can provide what you need but we can connect you with the local agencies that may also be able to help.

TWO- can you donate financially to our OLP Needy Fund? I know it is a difficult time for many of us financially, but if you are in the space to donate please consider helping us build up this fund. Remember that all money in this fund goes toward our fellow parishioners in need and is not used for requests we may receive from people not affiliated with our parish.

THREE- can you volunteer your time to help with groceries, medicine or other essential need deliveries? Deliveries would be done in accordance with current guidelines and social distancing.

sign up for EFT you do not have to worry about that; but I know many people still use envelopes and I wanted you to be aware of that option.

****St. Mark's Auxiliary Raffle** St. Mark's Auxiliary is an organization committed to supporting the seminarians of the Diocese of Erie. 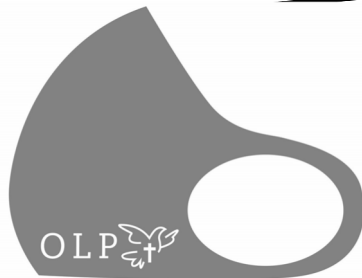

FEAST OF FAITH The Psalms in the Liturgy

The book of Psalms is a prayer book, hymnal, and anthology of verse all rolled into one. It contains one hundred fifty ancient songs—poem-prayers that express the joys and sorrows of the Hebrew people and their longing for God. The psalms are incredibly varied in tone. Some are solemn anthems of praise that once accompanied processions of great multitudes to the temple; others record the lonely cries of a faithful soul who feels abandoned by God.

This ancient prayer book of the Hebrew people is our principal prayer book as well. The psalms are everywhere in the liturgy—in the antiphons and acclamations of the Mass, and most particularly in the responsorial psalm that follows the first reading. The psalm that is sung at Mass usually echoes the themes of the first reading, and sometimes even comments on it. On this Third Sunday of Lent, we listen to the Exodus account of the stubbornness of God's people in the desert, and then the psalm comes to remind us: "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts" (Psalm 95:8). In their wonderful variety, the psalms teach us how to pray.

**Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Child Abuse
Prevention Month: Be Vigilant** - It is important that

we are constantly vigilant concerning the behaviors of those who interact with children. And we must always communicate our concerns to the appropriate parties. Sometimes this means communicating our safety concerns to our children. And sometimes this means communicating our concerns about seemingly inappropriate behavior to those who are in a position to intervene. Parents must also listen carefully to their children and observe both their children's activities and the behavior of older children and adults who interact with them. When children exhibit dramatic behavioral changes, adults must find out what caused the changes.
