Family Discussion of the Week: **Bread for Others**

While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take; this is my body." (Mark 14:22)

Adults: In what ways have you practiced the words of Jesus and been bread for others? **Kids:** What can you do to prepare to celebrate Holy Communion with your parish family?

SACRIFICE

Today the Church focuses on the Eucharist. Today's readings remind us how connected to ancient blood sacrifices we are when offering our unbloody sacrifice. The reading from Exodus describes a solemn ritual designed so the Israelites would never forget their covenant with God.

The reading from the Letter to the Hebrews turns us from those ancient animal sacrifices, the first efforts to worship the living God. Our sacrifice is the body and blood of the Son of God. Because of Christ we have a new covenant.

The Gospel from Mark retells the establishment of that covenant, the familiar story of the Last Supper. Juxtaposed with the story of animal sacrifice as it is here, we are challenged to listen with new attention, to remember the great price paid for our salvation. 



****New Permanent Deacon** Congratulations to the McCoy family on Paul's ordination to the permanent diaconate this past Friday here at OLP! Paul and his wife Joanie, and their children Bennett and Courtney, have been active parishioners at OLP for 15 years and this is a great moment for them and us. Paul's first Mass as Deacon is this Sunday, June 6th at 9am where he will serve and preach. Following

Mass you will have an opportunity to greet and congratulate the McCoy's with light refreshments outside the main entrance of church. Since my arrival at Our Lady of Peace I have had a chance to work with Paul and Joanie in their formation and I have been inspired by their faith and commitment. They have great hearts of compassion and desire to serve the church in whatever capacity is needed. Please keep Paul and his six classmates in your prayers and congratulate them when you see them. We are not sure where Paul will be assigned (parish or other apostolate) or when that will happen; but I will be sure to inform you as soon as we know.

****We welcome back Deacon Chris Wheeler** who was ordained a transitional deacon at the beginning of May. Chris arrived this past Tuesday and will be with us through mid-August. Make sure to congratulate him and welcome him back when you see him as well.

****Boy Scout Troop 59 Annual Garage Sale** will be next weekend. Look elsewhere in the bulletin for information on how to donate items and the hours of the sale so that you can support the scouts who do much for our parish community!

**"True Reformers" Faith Formation Series Over the summer, we are continuing to engage in the series called "True Reformers" which is based on six significant saints who were part of the Catholic Counter Reformation. St. Charles Borromeo, St. Theresa of Avila and St. Francis de Sales were all part of the ways that God helped bring new life and resurrection to the Catholic Church in response to the Protestant Reformation of the 1500s. We will have sessions on June 14, July 12, and August 16. They are all Mondays at 6:30pm. You do not have to register for these sessions and can come to one or all.

****Sections for Masks and No Masks** This weekend (June 5/6) we will begin to have separate sections for masks and no masks. Some people have expressed concern about segregating our community, but I feel the greater good of allowing everyone to be comfortable is the ultimate goal. I want to maximize the number of people who are comfortable coming to Mass and it's my opinion that having separate sections will accomplish that goal. People who are not comfortable having someone in their approximate vicinity without masks could choose not to come to Mass because they are now uncomfortable. Again, if you are concerned with this approach or want to discuss it further, I encourage you to contact me.

**In addition to the new masks policy here at OLP, here are the other adjustments that we will begin to incorporate this weekend:

One- We have reopened the south west door of the church. **Two-** Altar servers help assist at Mass in the sanctuary again. **Three-** Processions with our lector and servers resume.

Four- The priest or deacon invites us to offer each other a sign of peace. You are asked not to shake hands or embrace those who are not in your household.

Five- Everyone is reminded that you are asked to sanitize you

hands before coming forward in the communion procession. **Six-** The incorporation of more music, most notably the Gloria.

I remind you that we will stay with the use of every other pew until our numbers require us to open up every pew. The ministers will continue to wear masks during Holy Communion and the goal is to have a contactless distribution in the hand but the option to receive on the tongue remains. We will continue to have a single file communion line with one section going at a time. The clergy will continue to handle most of the distribution of Holy Communion through July.

We are still being asked to wipe or spray the pews after each mass so please consider volunteering for this task after the Mass you attend. If you can help, please report to the ushers room near the restrooms and someone will instruct you.

****The "OLP Raffle"** is our new annual parish fundraiser. If you have not already picked up your tickets, they are in the back of church. Every ticket sold helps to fund ministry and programming for the parish. Our parish goal is 2,500 tickets, will you help us? Make sure you don't miss out on the early bird drawings this summer on June 19th, July 10th and August 14th and remember if you sell or purchase your pack of 10 tickets you receive a "BONUS" ticket for the cash prize drawings at the parish picnic on September 11th. I am grateful for all of your support; but especially during these difficult times.

FEAST OF FAITH The Corpus Christi Procession

In the thirteenth century, a Belgian nun by the name of Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's feast of Corpus Christi-the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ-grew from Juliana's vision.

On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional Corpus Christi procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The Corpus Christi procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day. among those who know him but yearn to know him better, and among those who do not know him. A Family Perspective

One gets the impression there was always a lot of sharing, discussion and learning during the many meals Jesus and the disciples ate together. How does this compare to the meals in your home? Today's gospel challenges us to make our meals more than physical functions and more a time for sharing.

Registration forms with payment must be remitted to the Faith Formation Office no later than August 1, 2021.

Confirmation registration forms were emailed to parents on May 18. Forms along with payments must be remitted to the Faith Formation Office no later than August 1, 2021.

In order to be confirmed in eleventh grade students must either attend a Catholic high school OR attend Religious Education classes for grades 9 and 10 before registering for Confirmation classes in grade 11.


