



Family Discussion of the Week: Rich in Love

For you know the generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. (2 Corinthians 8:9)

Adults: When have you felt enriched by a sacrifice you made for another? *Kids:* Whom could you help by your acts of kindness this week?

JESUS' EXAMPLE OF HELPING OTHERS

In today's second reading Paul offers a wonderful argument to his converts at Corinth for seeking to help those in need. He is dealing with a practical problem, arranging a collection for the poor of the church of Jerusalem; but as he often does, he develops an important teaching about Jesus to make his point.

After asking that they show their faith by generous gifts, he reminds them of the "gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). In the Incarnation our Lord assumed our human nature, certainly becoming poor for one who is God. The ultimate gracious act of this poverty was going to the cross with all its terrible sufferings. By this act of poverty we definitely become rich. Now our sins can be forgiven; we can share in the very life of God through the sacraments; we can attain eternal salvation!

From the Pastor's Desk...

Thank you for your prayers for the clergy of our Diocese as we were at our annual Emmaus Convocation last week! I remind you of the latest clergy assignments that affect OLP- Fr. Mark Hoffman was reassigned our parochial vicar for another year, transitional Deacon Chris Wheeler was assigned to OLP through next May (2022- his ordination to priesthood will be Friday, May 27th at St. Patrick Church in Erie) and permanent Deacon Paul McCoy from OLP was assigned to St. Lawrence in Albion.

On another note, since the state of Pennsylvania is lifting the mask requirement on June 28^{th} , we will be making a few more adjustments to our protocols next weekend (July 3/4): ONE- we will now begin singing an opening and closing song at Masses and provide a worship aid each weekend; TWO- there will be one less section reserved for people with masks (the far east section of the pews nearest Pacific Ave). Recall that people with masks can sit anywhere in the church but the reserved section is for masks only; THREE- we will only block off every other pew in the section reserved for people with masks. All other sections will be completely open. FOUR- we will continue to offer Holy Communion in the gym after the 9am Mass (approximately 10-10:15am). FIVE- we will no longer spray the pews after every Mass.

Thank you again for your patience as we have adjusted our protocols and it has been great to see the spiritual and human energy build as we have opened things up more at Our Lady of Peace.

I also thank and ask for your continued prayers for Greg Galdon who was our Vice Facilitator for the Council and passed away this past year during his term. And I also thank Doug White who resigned from the council earlier this year. Our new officers are: Facilitator- Justin Miles; Vice-facilitator- Kathy Fross; Secretary- Jenn Malue.

****"True Reformers"** Faith Formation Series We continue our series called "True Reformers" which is based on 6 significant saints who were part of the Catholic Counter Reformation of the 1500s and 1600s. St. Theresa of Avila and St. Francis de Sales were part of the ways that God helped bring new life and resurrection to the Catholic Church in response to the Protestant Reformation of the 1500s. We will have sessions on July 12 and August 16. They are all Mondays at 6:30pm. These last two saints (St. Theresa and St. Francis de Sales) also advanced the devotion to St. Joseph so they will help us with our focus in this special year to our universal patron as well. You do not have to register for these sessions and can come to one or all.

**Outdoor Masses and Bonfires Thank you to everyone who participated in last weekend's outdoor mass and bonfire. Our other outdoor Masses this summer will be Saturdays, July 10th and August 14th at 5pm. Our other parish bonfire will be on August 14th from 6-9pm. On July 10th there will be the Party at the Pavilion which is an adult social fundraiser. **Party at the Pavilion There will be an adult bonfire social fundraiser on Saturday, July 10th from 6-10pm at the new parish pavilion behind the school. There will be games of chance, a bonfire, music (hopefully live) and other activities Some food and drinks will be provided but you are asked to bring your own adult beverages if interested. This event is being sponsored by the parish and the school Family School Association (FSA).

**Reserve Section for People with Masks We have begun to have a separate section reserved for people wearing masks. Some people have expressed concern about segregating our community but I feel the greater good of allowing everyone to be comfortable is the ultimate goal. I want to maximize the amount of people who are comfortable coming to Mass and it my opinion that having a separate section reserved for masks will accomplish that. People who are not comfortable having people in their approximate vicinity without masks could choose not to come to Mass because of that so having sections will alleviate those concerns. Note that people sitting in the other sections continue to have the option to mask or not mask. Again, if you are concerned with this approach or want to discuss it further, I encourage you to contact me.





FEAST OF FAITH **Preparation of the Gifts**

The altar is prepared, the gifts are received. Several brief rites follow with accompanying prayers, some prayed silently by the priest and deacon and others said aloud. We call this part of the Mass the "preparation." What kind of preparation is happening? First, the presider holds up the paten or bowl containing the hosts, and says words that Jesus must have said many times, since they derive from ancient Jewish meal prayers: "Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation!" We have brought forward our gifts, our offering to God, and now we acknowledge that they are not really ours—the gifts that we give are God's gift to us. It is "through your goodness" that we have gifts to offer. It is significant that we offer not wheat and grapes, but bread and wine; "fruit of the earth and work of human hands." Bread and wine are both God's work, and ours. These preparatory rites also prepare us for what we are about to do in the Eucharist, a mystery in which divine and human meet; a holy collaboration in which our action is caught up into God's divine plan. -Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. The healing of the women and the child in today's gospel is a reminder we are all wounded. We retreat to those we love looking for acceptance, listening, understanding and support. Families must be healing communities where Jesus is present in our care for one another.

FAITH FORMATION NEWS The Faith Formation Office will be switching to a new data base system over the summer. Therefore, registration will be delayed. Registration forms will be emailed in July to families with students going into grades 1-10 next school year. Registration forms with payment must be remitted to the Faith Formation Office no later than August 1, 2021. Faith Formation Office no later than August 1, 2021.

Confirmation registration forms were emailed to parents in mid-May. Forms along with payments must be remitted to the Faith Formation Office no later than August 1, 2021.

In order to be confirmed in eleventh grade students must either attend a Catholic high school OR attend Religious Education classes for grades 9 and 10 before registering for Confirmation classes in grade 11.
