

Family Discussion of the Week: Come Away and Rest

The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while. (Mark 6:30-31a)

Adults: What do you do to rest so that you can return to work refreshed? **Kids:** When will you take time to stop and pray this week?

THE DAYS ARE COMING

Separation, isolation, and hostility are terrible things. We are, sadly, too familiar with all of them in our modern life, whether we look at world events or events in our own neighborhoods and families. All three readings today refer to these same sad human conditions.

The prophet Jeremiah describes world conditions as if the people of his time were sheep who had been scattered by poor leadership and corrupt shepherds. But "the days are coming," he assures us (Jeremiah 23:5), when a new shepherd, a just king, will come. We meet that king in the second reading and the Gospel. Paul reminds us in the Letter to the Ephesians that all divisions can now cease in Christ Jesus, who has brought us together through his blood. In Mark's Gospel we see Jesus himself, looking with pity on those searching for him as if they were sheep without a shepherd.



From the Pastor's Desk...

Congratulations OLP Parish! We began a new fiscal year on July Ist and I am pleased to report that amazingly we came in with a net operating gain of \$43,754 for the time period of July I, 2020 to June 30, 2021. As I do every year, this fall I will provide a summary of our annual report that is sent to the diocese that will explain this gain. We also had a \$74,669 deficit in our offertory income but that was offset by a \$83,790 overage in bequests and special gifts such as Erie Gives and iGiveCatholic. Considering this was an extraordinary year with the pandemic this is great news and you all should be commended on stepping up during this challenging time!

With that being said, there are always more things that need to be done so I want to provide you with a few areas to consider helping if you are able (as I know some people prefer to have special projects to give to).

One- School Gym Restoration (Floor and bleachers)-the floor project has begun and should be completed by the end of July. Remember you can purchase a brick for \$250 in honor or memory of someone (bricks will be displayed on the north wall of the gym) or a corporate sponsorship for \$500 (sponsors will be listed on corporate banners). Also, you could just make a donation to this project for any amount desired. Chris Sirianni will be speaking about this opportunity one last time at Masses this weekend.

Two- Youth Ministry- as you know, we recently hired Sarah Beaver as our new coordinator of youth ministry. Sarah has a lot of great ideas and we would love to raise additional funds that will allow us the opportunity to offer the best ministry to our youth possible.

Three- Erie Gives on Tuesday, August 10th- our designated project will be the Rectory HVAC System. We are still running on the same equipment (more or less) that was here when the rectory was built in 1976-77. More information on how to support OLP through Erie Gives will be coming in the next few weeks.

If you are able or interested in supporting any of these areas of need, please contact the parish office or drop off your donation at the office and designate which area you want the money to go towards with checks being made out to Our Lady of Peace Church.

Thank you for your consideration and again for your generosity this past year! May God bless our parish for its generosity and our week ahead!

Saint Mary Magdalene First Century

July 22—Feast Liturgical Color: White Patron saint of perfumers, converts, and hairdressers **An Apostle to the Apostles first spreads the Good News**

Look for the women in the Gospels, and you will not be disappointed. Search for one woman in particular, Mary Magdalene, and you will find yourself present at all the most important Gospel events: the passion, the crucifixion, the burial, and in a garden for the resurrection, just moments after a huge stone is rolled away from a tomb, allowing the Lord to step forth into a new world. Saint Mary Magdalene is present at key moments, says key things, and is a key witness. She opens the door to Gospel scenes that would otherwise remain hidden from view. Saint Mary Magdalene was among that troop of women who congregated on the outer edge of the twelve Apostles. When these women are named, Mary Magdalene is always named first, similar to Saint Peter's position in the listing of the Apostles. Mary was an extremely common Jewish name. It requires, then, careful attention to the text to sift which Mary is doing what in the New Testament. Magdala was a town on the Sea of Galilee. So when Mary from

Magdala is referenced, the reader can trust that her town is adjoined to her name on purpose to distinguish her from other Marys. An old Christian tradition justly refers to Mary Magdalene as the "Apostle to the Apostles." The resurrected Christ appeared to her first, before all others. She is the proto-witness. Mary and other women go to the tomb of Jesus to anoint His body. They see the stone rolled away and enter. The body is not there. An angel tells them to not be afraid, "But go, tell his disciples and Peter," so Mary dutifully fulfills his angelic orders. It is a woman, then, who tells the men, who spreads the news of all news to everyone else. The men come running and verify her account. The tomb is empty. As usual, Mary respectfully remains on the fringe of the Apostles. She weeps outside the tomb while Peter and John are inside. Time passes as they try to absorb what this all means until, finally, the "disciples returned to their homes." But Mary does not go home. And then it happens. Mary is alone again, crying. She just can't believe it. She has to take another look. So she bends her body in half to peer into the low empty tomb once again. When she straightens up, she notices a man standing just behind her. She thinks he is a gardener. A short, awkward conversation follows and then abruptly concludes: "Mary!" "Rabbi!" Her name is in the mouth of God! A name is enunciated and a new life begins! At Baptism. At Confirmation. At religious vows. May we all hear the voice of the risen Christ speak our name, directly to us, just as Mary Magdalene did, when we hopefully walk for the first time in the garden of paradise: "Ashley!" "Susan!" "Tom!" "Marty!" "Quinn!" "Juliette!"...and on and on and on until the end of time.

Saint Mary Magdalene, assist all who seek your intercession to be humble followers of Christ, doing, from the margins, what is necessary to carry forward the ministry of Christ's Church, quietly accomplishing God's will without recognition except for its eternal reward.

FEAST OF FAITH The Prayer Over the Offerings

In the liturgy of the 1570 Missal, this prayer was called the "secret" prayer. It was "secret" not because its content was mysterious, but because it was prayed in silence by the priest, who only recited the conclusion aloud: . . . per omnia saecula saeculorum. With the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, we again hear these rich prayers spoken aloud. They remind us to prepare ourselves for what is to happen in the Eucharistic Prayer, for it is not only the bread and wine that will be transformed.

The Prayer Over the Offerings is a prayer for transformation, an expression, in a few words, of all that we hope that the liturgy will accomplish in our lives. We ask God to accept the gifts we present, and to change us even as God hallows the bread and wine. As we listen carefully to the Prayer Over the Offerings, we are reminded of what it is that we seek in the Eucharist: to be made holy; to be drawn closer to God; to come to eternal joy, unity, peace, and salvation.




