



## Family Discussion of the Week: The Eyes of Faith

So they said to Jesus, "What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing? (John 6:30)

**Adults:** When has your faith helped you believe without "seeing signs" from God? Kids: Who helps you believe in things you cannot see?

## THE BREAD OF LIFE

Today's Gospel has the crowd asking Jesus three questions. First, "When did you get here," to which Jesus responds by rebuking them for their failure to grasp his miracle as a "sign," an occasion to put faith in him. Their second question about accomplishing the "works of God" has Jesus respond that faith is the "work" that God wishes. Many scholars believe this is John's answer to the faith-works dichotomy emerging in the early Christian community. Faith is the work of God in the believer, John would have us understand. The third question asked by the crowd is a request for a "sign" that would allow them to put faith in Jesus, as the manna in the desert allowed the Israelites to put faith in the Lord God. 

## \*\*Return of the obligation to attend Mass August 14/15

Fr. Mark had a great article about how to understand and approach the obligation to attend Mass. I have included it in my notes here in case you missed it. Next weekend (August 7/8) we will focus our homilies on this as well as some bulletin resources so please join us next weekend and pick up a bulletin as well.

- \*\*Special Masses this Week Monday, August 2<sup>nd</sup>- St. Peter Julian Eymard (French priest of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century who promoted Eucharistic Adoration and established a women's religious order and other groups devoted to Adoration); Wednesday, August 4<sup>th</sup>- St. John Vianney, Priest (19<sup>th</sup> Century French Pastor who is the patron of parish priests); Thursday, August 5<sup>th</sup>- Dedication of the Basilica of St. Mary Major in Rome (first church dedicated to Mary in the Western Church); Friday, August 6<sup>th</sup>- the Transfiguration of the Lord; Saturday, August 7<sup>th</sup>- St. Sixtus II, Pope, and Companions, Martyrs (caught celebrating Mass in the catacombs of Rome in 258 AD and killed).
- \*\*Vacation Bible School (VBS) Last chance to register! I am excited and grateful to be able to offer VBS at OLP; and thank Sarah Beaver and Tammie Mang for organizing it. VBS is open to children entering grades I-5 and takes place on August 2nd to August 6th from 8:45am-12:45pm. I am looking forward to a great week and encourage you to register your children and grandchildren!
- \*\*Parish and School Movie Nights Outdoor movies will be shown on the south wall of the school gym each month this summer. Families are welcome to gather at 8pm and the movies will start at dusk. You are asked to bring your own chairs and blankets and there will be drinks and popcorn available for purchase. The August movie is Wednesday, August 30th- Toy Story 4.
- \*\*Outdoor Mass and Bonfire Our remaining outdoor Mass this summer will be Saturday, August 14<sup>th</sup> and is held in the parking lot between the school and scout house. Bring a chair and plan to join us for hotdog, chips and smores at the bonfire immediately following Mass from 6-9pm.
- \*\*Parish Picnic The parish picnic will take place on Saturday, September I I<sup>th</sup>. It will begin with an outdoor Mass at 5pm in the parking lot. Dinner and festivities including a bonfire will be held on the campus following Mass.
- \*\*OLP Raffle We are almost there, help us make the goal. Currently we are at 83% of the goal with 2,084 tickets sold and 307 families participating. Thank you to all who have supported the raffle in buying or selling tickets. The next early bird drawing is Saturday, August 14<sup>th</sup> for your chance to win the "Back to School Survival Kit."
- \*\*"True Reformers" Faith Formation Series Our last session of "True Reformers," which is based on significant saints who were part of the Catholic Counter Reformation of the 1500s and 1600s, is on St. Francis de Sales. It will be held on Monday, August 16 at 6:30-8pm. St. Francis also advanced devotion to St. Joseph and therefore will help us with our focus to our universal patron in this Year of St. Joseph. You do not have to register, and I hope to see you there.

One- Gym Restoration (Floor and bleachers)- the floor project has begun and should be completed soon. Remember you can purchase a brick for \$250 in honor or memory of someone or a corporate sponsorship for \$500 or you can make a donation to this project for any amount desired.

<u>Two- Youth Ministry-</u> as you know, we recently hired Sarah Beaver as our new coordinator of youth ministry. Sarah has a lot of great ideas and we would love to raise additional funds that will allow us the opportunity to offer the best ministry to our youth possible.

Three- Erie Gives on Tuesday, August 10th- our designated project will be the Rectory HVAC System. We are still running on the same equipment (more or less) that was here when the rectory was built in 1976-77.

#### \*\*FR. MARKS ARTICLE FROM LAST WEEK

The idea of the church going "back to normal" as we near the end of the pandemic has been just that... a <u>process</u> over time. There is no start button to turn everything on at full throttle. Returning to <u>normal needs</u> to be a gentle and intentional progression. Bishop Persico and the other bishops of the Catholic dioceses of Pennsylvania have decided that on the weekend of August 14/15, the next step towards normal will take effect: The obligation to attend Mass will resume. We are opening our arms and affirming that the presence of our entire membership is welcomed and important every week of the year!

But, the word "obligation" often bothers modern ears. We, as a society often avoid words such as "mandatory" or "obligatory" because our sensitivities tend to gravitate towards <u>us</u> making our <u>own</u> decisions about what <u>we</u> want---- or not want to do. But, by our baptism, we entered into a relationship with Jesus Christ <u>and</u> the Catholic Church herself. Baptism entails a mutual responsibility to be present to and with one another. We need to support one another in prayer and service not unlike our need to care for our own family. Like it or not, no words seem to best describe the situation better than a 'holy' obligation.

So just what "obligation" does this entail? We need (and appreciate) prayer. We all need support if we are to be spiritual healthy. Thus, our obligation is that we will celebrate the Eucharist with and for one another because Jesus Christ desires us to be together. As a parent feeds their child every day, so too is regular worship needed to nourish our souls.

Families of registered campers will receive an email with further details.


The journey to heaven is not a path we walk alone.

More specifically, our normal obligation is to attend and participate in the Liturgy of the Mass faithfully on the Lord's Day, (weekends) and all Holy Days. By this, we follow the example of Jesus and the Apostles who met to pray regularly and publicly on the Sabbath. This obligation is normally only lifted when we are ill, or physically unable to come to church. But, are we not struck when we see elderly or physically disabled people join us at Mass when they could easily excuse themselves—especially in the snows of winter? Yet they would never consider missing Mass. What inspiring people!

Are we obliged to pray only at our home parish? Not really- but it is important to consider. You may attend Mass at any Catholic Church. However, please remember that your home parish is where you are a family within a family. It is at home where we know names, faces and yes... even the seats of one another. You are indeed free to attend at any Catholic Church, but when you are not here, we miss you!

I make a special plea to our parish teens and young adults to consider re-committing themselves to Our Lady of Peace Parish as <u>your</u> place to pray. You may not have realized it, but the little children do look up to you when they see you at Mass. You make the weekly discipline of Mass very important to the youngest members of our family. (Or to put it another way... when a grade school student sees a middle or high school student praying, you make Mass 'cool.') Youth and young adults secure the strength of our parish. Consider it a gentle mission of presence.

Please don't be afraid of the concept of an "obligation" of going to Mass. All it means is that we make our public prayer a priority because we take our baptismal commitments seriously. Move from the "have to" to the "want to" and be with your family of OLP every week. This is where you are wanted--- and belong!
