THE DESTINY OF ALL MORTAL FLESH

The celebration of today's feast on a Sunday is unusual on our Roman Catholic calendar. Our observance of the Lord's Day is held in such high esteem that few other feasts replace it. Occasionally there is a feast—usually of one of the saints—in which the saving power of God in Christ is so uniquely focused that the Roman rite deems it worthy of celebration on the Lord's Day. Today is such a feast. Yet some are surprised at the brevity of the dogma in its entirety: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The Roman Catholic Church never defined any specifics or particulars about the event itself. It is not in the scriptures. There are no verifiable eyewitness accounts. At its core, the dogma reveals in Mary the destiny of all mortal flesh, and reinforces our creedal belief in resurrection of the body. This feast strengthens our faith, defined last week in Hebrews as the realization of things hoped for. We find, in Mary, that realization of what we all hope for, what Paul today affirms: "In Christ shall all be brought to life" (1 Corinthians 15:22).

From the Parochial Vicar's Desk...

It is hard to know how to prepare for the upcoming weeks and months. Are we jumping the gun by permitting a more relaxed atmosphere at church? Frankly, it's hard to tell. But it never hurts to be prepared to be welcoming AND to be safe.

From looking at the examples of civic officials and heads of medical groups, our best defense is still a strong offense. With that, **we want to encourage the use of hand sanitizer and common sense.** None of us want to return to the difficult days of the past 16 months.

It is very important that anyone acting in a ministerial role (priest, deacon, ministers of Holy Communion, and servers) be diligent about hygiene. What we do is about service and the example of care. So-- speaking for myself and our pastor, PLEASE be aware of the proven and sensible precautions. This is especially important during the time when we are encouraging people to consider returning to public worship.

I also invite our parishioners to participate in a level of health security by bringing a small personal bottle of hand sanitizer with them and apply it on their hands before you leave your pew to enter the communion line. Maybe when we are finished extending a wave or smile of "peace," get in the habit of pulling out the hand sanitizer and do a quick application.

All of us have an obligation to model healthy practices as we hear more news of "Covid variants." Our parish has worked hard to be a Covid safe place to worship and pray. Let's keep up the good work as we welcome more people to Mass each week.

****Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**

Remember that August 15th is a special Holy Day and even though it falls on a Sunday; we still celebrate it with special readings, prayers, and music. The Assumption of Mary reminds us of the perfect image of God that we are all created to be. Mary is our hope and the model of staying in full communion with God and His will and therefore the consequence of being preserved from death. I like to call the week between the Assumption and the Queenship of Mary on August 22nd a special octave of Mary. Consider saying the rosary every day or going to Mass an extra day or making a stop at church and the Marian Shrine a few times throughout the week.

The diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children and Youth screening guidelines and abuse prevention training programs emphasize the importance of knowing the employees and volunteers who have access to children in our schools and parishes. Parents should remain vigilant in insisting that those with access to their children have gone through an application process and obtained the required clearances and trainings before being granted access to their children.


FEAST OF FAITH

The Shape of the Eucharistic Prayer

Our Eucharistic Prayers originated in the traditional Jewish meal prayers known as *berakah*, which were prayers of thanksgiving used at meals. Over the centuries, the Christian thanksgiving, or Eucharist, gradually took shape. While in the East the Eucharistic Prayers (called *anaphora*) took many forms, in the Roman Church there was for many centuries just one Eucharistic Prayer, called the Roman Canon (now known as Eucharistic Prayer I). Almost all Eucharistic Prayers include the same basic elements. They begin with thanksgiving and acclamation. Then there is an *epiclesis*, as the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the gifts. Then follows the institution narrative and consecration, as the words that Jesus spoke at the Last Supper are repeated. After the consecration, we remember in an explicit way all that Christ has done for us—this is the *anamnesis*, or remembering. The prayer concludes with the offering, the intercessions—prayers for the Church, our leaders, ourselves—and a final doxology of praise.

The reforms of the Second Vatican Council enriched our liturgy with additional Eucharistic Prayers, including both ancient texts (Eucharistic Prayer II is based on the most ancient of all existing Eucharistic Prayers) and new compositions.


