Family Discussion of the Week: **Time Faith and Works** Faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith. (James 2:17-18) **Adults:** Why should faith always lead to good works? **Kids:** What good works can you do to show your faith in Jesus?

IT'S ALL ABOUT CONTROL

From toddlerhood to old age, we grow in mastery of our own lives, our bodies, and our destiny. This mastery is hard won, and we don't let go of autonomy easily. Much of this self-mastery involves the avoidance of pain or discomfort, so when we hear things like "take up your cross" and "lose your life," we tend to resist the message.

James says that faith without works is dead. Ouch! That is really a direct message! One way to look at this, as well as the part about losing our life to find it, is that faith is a process of more and more openness to God's direction of our lives. It is very hard for us to give up control, but perhaps what we are being asked to do is not to become passive and babyish, but to allow God to direct where our selfmastery will lead and what it will accomplish. We are asked to relinquish the need to control the results of our efforts; to risk, as Jesus did, the loss of everything we are working to achieve. We are asked to let God take the lead and to control the results, even though we may never see those results.



From the Pastor's Desk...

To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

This weekend we recognize the 20th Anniversary of 9 -11, the tragic day that in many ways changed our world forever. Heightened security checks, immigration debates, terrorism concerns, and other real issues and changes have resulted. Many of us would see these as negative results or impacts from this event. But I also remember the ways that many of us were able to see God bring good from this evil day. Americans were united in a way they had not been in years; "God bless America" was sung at games and public events as an apparent sign of our country remembering it's spiritual roots and seeking God's help and blessing in this time of need. There was a healthy expression of pride in our country and the patriotism and responsibility that comes from being a faithful citizen of the United States; an outpouring of support to first responders not only in New York and those who responded directly to the attacks, but also appreciating them in every community. We experienced an overall greater kindness, courteousness and overt willingness to smile at people in the streets that we do not know; and a greater desire to seize the moment and live every day to its fullness including appreciating the most important things in life. Maybe not all of us experienced or witnessed these positives elements of American life after 9-11 but I certainly know that many did in New York and throughout our country.

I would hope and pray that on this anniversary we can be renewed in those positive virtues and focal points that 9-11 originally evoked in us. We know that we have many challenges and significant issues and hurdles to overcome as a country. And we also know that the list above is not a complete answer to some of the deeper issues, but it certainly is a movement in the right direction. It is also about taking time to celebrate the positive in our country while also being realistically critical of areas that need change. Part of what we as Catholics can bring to this conversation is hope and optimism in a very pessimistic and severe political and secular world. If we are not hopeful in the midst of national struggle and darkness, who will be? It is not a blind or ignorant optimism of which I speak, but a Christian hope that with faith and trust in God, that things will be ok, if not in this life, then definitely in the next life (if we maintain that right friendship with God that we should all be seeking!) while also recognizing our call to action to be part of the solution.

I hear many people consistently speak about their frustrations and anger over the political climate in our country and to that I always respond... pray, do what you can (including recommitting to those graces that initially came from 9-11), and then let it go. Act upon it and give it over to God. To not act and yet cling to these concerns and allow them to consume us and distract us from living God's love in the moment is doing no one any good. One of my favorite prayers that is appropriate for all areas of life, but certainly relevant for dealing with our imperfect nation and how we should respond to it, is the serenity prayer. I conclude with it here as a summary of what I have said and my prayer for you... "Lord, grant us the serenity to accept the things we cannot change, the courage to change the things we can, and the wisdom to know the difference."

May God bless America, the victims of 9-11 and our week ahead!

Parish Consecration to Mary On the Sunday of the Queenship of Mary I mentioned consecrating our parish to our Blessed Mother. Initially I suggested this week but since we have a lot going on right now, I would like to commit to having the consecration **October 13th (the anniversary of the last apparition at Fatima in 1917). Pope Francis consecrated the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on October 13, 2013 (and Pope Francis also dedicated his papacy to Our Lady of Fatima that day). Recall, too, that back on May I.

2020, that the US Bishops consecrated our country to Mary and that same day, Bishop Persico led a consecration of the Diocese of Erie to Mary. We will pray a novena to Our Lady of Fatima from October 4th until October 13th. - **Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, September 14th

This feast celebrates a double anniversary. In 335AD, the Emperor Constantine erected a round church (the Anastasis) and a basilica (the Martyrium) above the empty grave of Jesus and in the square between the two churches, a shrine called Calvarium, marking the place where Jesus was crucified. These buildings were destroyed by the Persians in 614AD. The two churches were rebuilt but then destroyed in 1009AD. The present church of the Holy Sepulcher, rebuilt by the Crusaders, was dedicated in 1149AD. This feast also commemorates the discovery of the Lord's cross by the empress, St. Helena, in 320AD.

We will have a blessing of our Catechists at the 11am Mass and all Faith Formation families are encouraged to attend this Mass. Also, next weekend will be the Catholic Education Second Collection. Please be prepared to support this collection next weekend.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Diocesan Child Protection Policies: The Diocese of Erie., along with all other dioceses in the United States, has policies and procedures in place to address the national problem of child abuse and to aid in maintaining safe environments. The three main components of the Policy for the Protection of Children are: screening of all employees and volunteers who work with minors. training of all youth, parents, .employees and volunteers, and reporting all suspected child abuse. The diocese is committed to promptly reporting any suspected child abuse directly to ChildLine or law enforcement. The diocese requires on-going screening and training of all personnel, paid or unpaid, who have regular contact with our children and youth under the age of 18. The diocese also requires yearly safe environment training of our children, youth and parents regarding touching-safety and safe environments.
