Family Discussion of the Week: True Wisdom

He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." (Mark 9:35)

Adults: What evidence do you see in the world around you that many do not accept Jesus' teaching on power and ambition?

Kids: Why do you think Jesus says if you want to be first you should take care of others?

THE MEANING OF DISCIPLESHIP

The geography of today's Gospel is significant. Jesus is completing his ministry in Galilee and beginning his journey to Jerusalem, where he will meet both death and resurrection. The prediction of his death placed here is the second of three in Mark's Gospel, and as usual it is the occasion for an important teaching on the part of Jesus. Today that lesson is tied to the need for his disciples to embrace a ministry of service. A play on words in Aramaic would have linked the words "child" and "servant," thus turning Jesus' gesture of placing a child in their midst into an illustration of his understanding of himself as the Servant of the Lord. It is that same awareness of the meaning of their ministry that Jesus (and Mark) wishes to instill in the disciples. Theirs must be a ministry of service if they are to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. And that service might even require of them that they be "handed over" to death. What would have been—in the culture of Jesus' day—an ordinary discussion of social status ("who is the greatest") becomes in Mark's context a key insight into the meaning of discipleship for the disciples and for us.

We estimated that we had between 350-400 for the outdoor Mass and between 400-500 for the picnic (which were not all the same people!) so approximately 600-700 people participated in some part of the evening which is awesome!

Special thanks to our Families Together Ministry, our picnic committee, and our staff, who all put in much effort. We have been meeting since the spring to plan this and the hard work paid off. I also thank the scouts who helped with set up and had several activities at the picnic (including those incredible homemade donuts which were delicious!), Casino Tuesday (the band who provided music- including my nephew Gabe), Magic Steve (who made balloon figures for 2 ½ hours- 45 minutes longer than we had asked because of the demand!), the West Ridge Fire Department, and the crew of my relatives who stepped up to set off the firework.

Another big thanks to all who donated baskets and liquor for our raffles and for all who participated in our parish raffle. We far exceeded our goal of 2,500 tickets sold (ended with around 3,300) and were able to raise \$49,000 for our parish.

All of this points to a great movement of the Holy Spirit at Our Lady of Peace which is building energy and investment in our community due to your participation and support. So let's keep cooperating with the Holy Spirit in inspiring us to bring the light of Christ and His hope, peace and joy to our Erie community and world!

****Location of Processional Cross Moved**

The

Liturgy Committee has been studying the documents that provide the instructions for celebrating Mass. Part of the goal of this process is to evaluate our liturgy at OLP as to whether we are celebrating in the manner that the church intends and to understand the reasons why the church instructs us in these ways. When studying the section on the set up of the sanctuary (the area in the church that includes the altar, ambo and presider's chair) we found that number 308 in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (the GIRM) states "...either on the altar or near it, there is to be a cross, with the figure of Christ crucified upon it, a cross clearly visible to the assembled people. It is desirable that such cross should remain near the altar even outside of liturgical celebrations, so as to call to mind for the faithful the saving Passion of the Lord." For this reason, on Tuesday, September 14th, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, we moved the location of our processional cross next to the altar. This also reinforces our belief that every Mass is a participation in and continuation of the offering/sacrifice of the Son to the Father in the Holy Spirit which manifested itself in time almost 2000 years ago on Calvary. We are not repeating the sacrifice or adding to it as some Protestant critics claim, we as the Mystical Body of Christ on earth are participating in the eternal offering and thus extended it into the present earthly moment.

****Liturgical Ministers to Wear Masks at Mass**

In consultation with the Liturgy Committee and Parish Staff, I have decided to ask all liturgical ministers to wear masks at Mass even if they have been vaccinated. This is in response to Bishop Persico's request that all people wear masks at Mass (unvaccinated are expected to wear masks to begin with). Clergy, lectors and cantors who have speaking/singing roles can remove their masks when speaking but are asked to mask at all other times in the Liturgy. Musicians that are part of choirs are expected to mask even when singing due to their proximity to each other with the understanding that singing increases the distance of transmission of germs/ COVID. I do this in order to create the safest environment which maximizes everyone's comfort and peace in celebrating Mass at Our Lady of Peace.

****Parish Consecration to Mary POSTPONED to make way for the Consecration to St. Joseph** On the Sunday of the Queenship of Mary I mentioned consecrating our parish to our Blessed Mother and last weekend in the bulletin I suggested we do that in October. After further consideration and consultation with the staff, I would like to postpone that consecration to Mary until next May so that we can focus on the end of our year of St. Joseph (ends on December 8th). We encourage everyone in the parish to participate in the 33 day consecration to St. Joseph. There will be more information on this in the coming weeks but for now know that the consecration to Mary will not be taking place in October. Thank you for your patience as things continue to be adjusted due to COVID and other circumstances.

A Family Perspective

Disagreements are common in families. But what would you say if Jesus posed the same question "What are you arguing about? Is it silly and Petty? Is it an attempt to impose your will and control on another, or to really solve a problem?

Today Jesus tells us and his disciples to give it up.

We are meant to serve each other, not control.

FEAST OF FAITH Doxology and Amen

"Doxology" comes from a Greek word meaning "words of praise." The Eucharistic Prayer ends with a doxology addressed to the triune God: "Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever." It is an exclamation of praise, honor, and glory to God, reminding us that we receive everything from God through the Son, in the power of the Spirit. At the consecration, the priest held up the host and then the chalice for us to see and adore. During the doxology, the host and chalice are held up again, but this time they are held up and offered to God the Father. With the doxology, the Eucharistic Prayer ends, as it began, with words of praise addressed to the Father: truly, it is right and just to give God praise, and we assent to this in our whole-hearted acclamation, "Amen." Never was more meaning packed into so short a word. This "Amen," sometimes and fittingly called "the great Amen," is our response to the entire Eucharistic Prayer.


