

### Family Discussion of the Week: Childlike Faith

Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.". (James 5:4)

Adults: What could keep you from embracing the kingdom of God like a little child? Kids: How do you feel when you hear the wonderful stories of God's love for you?

### THE BARRIERS THAT SEPARATE US

We live in a society that has many technological avenues for stimulation and entertainment, one in which the urban population exceeds the non-urban. It is curious that loneliness is a prevalent malady. It is easy to reach out and touch someone, we are told. But-in truth-it is not all that easy, and statistics from the mental health field will reinforce that opinion. Today's readings are about the ways in which we can authentically reach out: God touches Adam to create a mate and end his solitude; God-in-Jesus takes on human flesh and death in order that we might come to glory; Jesus reaches out to the children whom the disciples had tried to keep away, showing us the manner in which we must approach the loving embrace that awaits us in heaven. Until that day, however, we must remember that ours is a sacramental church, a church of signs of the love of God. And so we are called to reach out continually to ease the loneliness and the barriers that separate us from one another and, therefore, from the love of Christ.



### From the Pastor's Desk...

To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

In October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is designated as Respect Life Sunday. To support these annual observances, the USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities provides materials to help Catholics understand and value the gift of human life and help build a culture that cherishes and protects it. Our parish staff would like to share some of these resources with you throughout the month both in the bulletin, at church and on our social media. Below I share with you the reflection from the website...

"The infant Christ "came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph" (Patris Cordae 5- Pope Francis' Pastoral Letter on St. Joseph). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come. While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God's plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, "God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child" (PC 5).

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, "in every situation, Joseph declared his own 'fiat'" (PC 3). His "yes" to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph's devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him "an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble" (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say "yes" to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was "chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true 'miracle' by which God saves the child and his mother" (PC 5). May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. Dear St. Joseph, you who were "able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence" (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage."

A few special opportunities for prayer during Respect Life Month include:

ONE- First Friday Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on October 1<sup>st</sup> from 7:30am-3pm including a Rosary at 11:35am and Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3pm followed by Benediction. TWO- the Pet Blessing held this Sunday, October 3rd at 1pm in the school parking lot. The last few years we have held the blessing on the Sunday closest to the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi (who is the patron saint of animals and the environment) which is October 4th.

 $\underline{\mathsf{THREE}}$ -Respect Life Holy Hour on Monday, October 18<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.

FOUR- Anointing of the Sick Mass on Sunday, October 24<sup>th</sup> at 11am. We will administer the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick while also offering a blessing to all Medical Professionals and Care Givers.

There is a prayer card for Respect Life Month that includes a prayer to St. Joseph, the Defender of Life, at the doors of the church. Feel free to take one and share with others.

Francis of Assisi; Tuesday, October 5<sup>th</sup>— Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, Priest (19<sup>th</sup> Century German Redemptorist who came to the United States and served in Pittsburgh and Buffalo before dying in New Orleans); Wednesday, October 6<sup>th</sup>—Blessed Marie Rose Durocher, Virgin (19<sup>th</sup> Century Nun from Quebec who founded a religious order serving in Canada and the United States); Thursday, October 7<sup>th</sup>—Our Lady of the Rosary; Friday, October 8<sup>th</sup>—Purple Mass in Time of Pandemic; Saturday, October 9<sup>th</sup>—St. John Leonardi, Priest (16<sup>th</sup> Century Roman Priest who was part of the Catholic Counter Reformation and established the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) that continued to be used into the 20<sup>th</sup> Century).

\*\*Pilgrimages to England (2022) and the Holy Land (2023) Last week we celebrated the Feast Day of St. John Henry Newman and the two-year anniversary of his canonization. He was a former Anglican priest, who became a Roman Catholic in 1845 and eventually a Cardinal; and is regarded as one of the most influential figures from his era for both Anglicanism and Roman Catholicism. In an unprecedented move, Pope Francis chose the date of his conversion to Catholicism rather than the typical date of his death for his feast day which is October 9th. It is in this context that I am excited to announce that I will be leading a pilgrimage to England next summer with Fr. Nick Rouch, the Vicar for Clergy in the Diocese of Erie and a Newman Scholar. The pilgrimage will be July 18-28, 2022 and more information can be found at the pilgrimage website- https:// www.pilgrimages.com/frtoohey/england/ There are pamphlets also available in the vestibule of the church or the parish office. The cost of the pilgrimage is \$4,799 which includes everything (transportation, accommodations, food) except



### FEAST OF FAITH The Sign of Peace

"Greet one another with a holy kiss," wrote Saint Paul to the Corinthians (1 Corinthians 16:20), and he said the same thing to other communities as well. The holy kiss, the sign of peace, has been a hallmark of Christians from the very beginning. In giving and receiving the sign of peace, we are not giving something of our own, but something that Christ has given to us. "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you," Jesus told his disciples (John 14:27). Jesus comes to us when we gather together in community. We celebrate the Eucharist not just to receive spiritual nourishment to help us on our solitary way to salvation, but to be transformed into one body, the Body of Christ in the world. As we receive the Eucharist, we are not only united to Christ; we are united to each other. It is never easy to live in community, and we hurt each other on the way. So we need to turn to each other in a sign of reconciliation and forgiveness, to look into each other's eyes, and give and receive the peace that is not ours, but Christ's.


