


#### **FAMILY LIFE**

Christmas celebrates the Incamation, the "en-flesh-ment" of God as a human person. In Jesus, God is bodily present in the human story. Today we honor the Holy Family, helping us to see that God is active in daily family life. God is near at hand, amidst the tensions, joys, and uncertainties of family life. As our Gospel passage describes, even with family miscommunications and with limited understanding of Jesus' mission, the Holy Family persevered in their life together. Like many family conflicts, there was no immediate or clear resolution of the issues raised by Jesus and by Mary. God's intentions for the family, and for Jesus, were still unfolding. They continued to stay connected with each other and with God. Within the turbulence of family life, they trusted God to actively sustain and guide them into an uncertain future. 



#### From the Pastor's Desk...

To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

A Merry Christmas Octave and Feast of the Holy Family! This is a special feast to focus on and pray for families in our parish and community. There are many things in our culture that make healthy and holy family life very challenging. We must consistently ask the Holy Family to intercede for families and to inspire our families to follow their example of being communities of persons in love as we are created and called to be.

I see this feast as the one moment in the liturgy during the octave of Christmas to extend our focus to St. Joseph, who is not necessarily an emphasis the rest of the octave days. This year it is even more appropriate having just finished the universal year of St. Joseph on December  $8^{th}$  and participating in the Consecration to St. Joseph as a parish that ended on December  $10^{th}$ .

"Pillar of Families" is one title we used for St.

Joseph in his litany that we prayed throughout the 33-day consecration. In Fr. Donald Callloway's book, Consecration to St. Joseph, it says this about St. Joseph, "A pillar is a foundation. In order for your family to stand on a firm foundation and be unshakable, your family needs St Joseph. He will teach your family the importance of prayer, mutual respect, purity, honesty, forgiveness, love, and, most importantly, placing God above all things." So I encourage all the families of our parish to "go to St. Joseph!" And for all families in our parish to "go to the Holy Family!"

Another feast of the octave of Christmas is the Feast of the Holy Innocents on December 28<sup>th</sup>. The Catholic liturgical calendar (Ordo) says this- "the massacre of the Innocents (by Herod who feared the coming of the Messiah and ordered that all boys under the age of 2 be killed when Jesus was born) bears witness to the blood of Jesus which cleanses us from sin and frees us from death." There are also special prayers that can be said on this feast "for the innocent who have perished through abortion, starvation and war."

On Tuesday, December 28<sup>th</sup>, we will have a "Day of Prayer for the Innocents." The church will be open from 7am to 7pm to pray before the tabernacle for those innocents. We will have copies of those prayers available for you to use. I would ask that on that day we specifically pray for our government to enact laws and policies that will protect these innocents whether it's involving abortion, immigration, poverty or war (and other issues beyond those). In particular I would ask your prayers for the Supreme Court as it considers two cases that could greatly affect or eliminate abortion in our country (one law in Texas and the other in Mississippi). We pray for the wisdom and inspiration of our justices to bring an end to abortion and support the best laws in these other

- \*\*Appreciation Dinner Postponed Due to the present challenges of group gatherings we are going to postpone the annual Appreciation Dinner until the summer when we can possibly go outside or at least be out of "COVID Season." Let me know if you have any questions or concerns; and thank you for your patience and understanding.
- \*\*Please note that the parish office will be closed from Friday, December 24th until Tuesday, January 4<sup>th</sup>. Thank you for understanding the need to give our parish staff a well-deserved break.
- \*\*Masses this Week Monday, December 27<sup>th</sup>, St. John, Apostle and Evangelist; Tuesday, December 28<sup>th</sup>- The Holy Innocents, Martyrs; Wednesday, December 29<sup>th</sup> St. Thomas Beckett. Martyr; Thursday, December 30<sup>th</sup>- 6<sup>th</sup> Day of the Octave within the Nativity of the Lord; Friday, December 31<sup>st</sup>- St Sylvester I, Pope; Saturday, January 1<sup>st</sup>- the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God.
- \*\*The Christmas Season continues for just over 2 weeks this year. Highlights include the Feast of the Holy Family (Sunday, December 26th), Mary the Mother of God (Friday, Saturday, January 1st), the Epiphany (Sunday, January 2nd where we will have the Proclamation of the dates for Easter and other significant dates of the Liturgical Year and hand out the house blessing cards). The Christmas Season will conclude on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Sunday, January 9<sup>th</sup>. On the 9<sup>th</sup>, we will have Adoration following the 4:30pm Mass until Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament at 6pm.
- \*\*Holy Hour for Peace We will continue the recent tradition of ringing in the New Year with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from I I pm-I 2 Midnight on New Year's Eve (Friday, December 31st). What a great way to start the new year by receiving the Blessing (Benediction) of Jesus through His Eucharistic Presence right at Midnight! We will pray for peace in our world though a litany of peace. After the Holy Hour there will be time for some refreshments and fellowship in the rectory.
- \*\*Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God is Saturday, January 1st and is a holy day of obligation and the last day of the Octave of Christmas. It is also designated as the World Day of Prayer for Peace. For all those reasons, it is a great day to participate in Mass which will be held at 5:30pm on Friday, December 31st and 10am on Saturday, January 1st.

I realize with COVID it is hard to commit to the 2022 pilgrimage to England but I wanted to remind you that there is insurance you can purchase for both trips in case you have to cancel. #### \*\*Thoughts on Kneeling after the Lamb of God

Kneeling is a common response when in the presence of the sacred. I would like to review here some of the points I made in my homily two weeks ago when we returned to the posture of kneeling after the lamb of God at Mass. The first two are repeated from previous explanations. The rest focus on the dispositions I encourage to accompany our kneeling. ONE- As was stated before- the Diocese of Erie had been remaining standing after the Lamb of God since 2003 when Bishop Trautman had implemented that posture for reasons I will not get into here.

TWO- The majority of Diocese in the United States kneel after the Lamb of God so Bishop Persico wants us to be united with most of the Catholic Church in the US in this posture.

THREE- Remember a basic tenet of our Catholic spirituality and liturgy is that external expressions and postures encourage interior dispositions which is why we emphasize guidelines about them. However, external postures do not guarantee the corresponding interior disposition so we must be thoughtful and intentional when we do them.

FOUR- Kneeling can be an expression of contrition and therefore is consistent with the congregational response to the presider's statement "Behold the Lamb of God..." which is "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only said the word and my soul shall be healed." I think of the classic painting by Rembrandt of the Prodigal Son that hangs in our office hallway which shows of the younger son kneeling in the embrace of his father as he says he is sorry. FIVE- Kneeling is an expression of adoration. There are 3 moments in the Mass when Christ present in the Eucharist is shown or elevated before the congregation- after "This is my body given up for you," after "This is the chalice of my blood... do this in remembrance of me," and "Behold the Lamb of God." During the first two of these moments the congregation is kneeling and it seems fitting that we kneel in adoration at the third as well. This is not to suggest or minimize the other ways that Christ is present to us at Mass (in the congregation, in the presiding priest, and in the Word of God) but there is something special about the substantial, tangible presence of Christ in the Eucharist which is important to recognize and adore in a special way.

SIX- Kneeling is an expression of humility. Humility is the virtue that is the foundation and beginning of growth in the spiritual life and right relationship with God. This is a moment to reinforce our absolute dependence on God for EVERYTHING and therefore to resist the temptation of the Garden of Eden that is present in our lives every day, which is to make ourselves God. We lower ourselves so that God can raise us in His image and likeness and not our own. If we elevate ourselves on our own, God has to lower us so that he can recreate us. Hopefully we choose humility on our own and do not make God force it out of us and I believe kneeling can be helpful in this.

Now for a few practical clarifications on the process... ONE- If you are unable to kneel it is completely fine to sit but please do not stand for the sake of visibility for those who are kneeling. Please keep in mind the above points even if you are not kneeling- the interior dispositions are more important than the external expression.

TWO- Keep the kneelers down after the Great Amen so we do not have to put them up and down twice (and make more noise (3)).

THREE- It seems easiest to remain kneeling until your row goes to Holy Communion but if you want or need to sit down while waiting that is completely fine.

FOUR- You are encouraged to kneel when returning to your pew but to keep singing either before or after you make a prayer of thanksgiving.

FIVE- Once the music stops, this is your most intimate opportunity for private prayer between you and God so take advantage of it. The image that is powerful for me to consider at this moment is the beloved disciple John laying his head on the chest of Jesus at the Last Supper (Jn 13:23). Let Jesus hold you in the embrace of Mass and Holy Communion, and love and thank him back.

SIX- There is no definite time that the congregation is asked to sit after kneeling after Communion. Personally when I attended Mass before being ordained I liked to remain kneeling until the priest says "Let us pray." I think it is appropriate to wait until at least the tabernacle is closed from reposing the Blessed Sacrament if you are able to stay kneeling until then. Some might wait until the presider sits and others may wait until the Prayer after Communion. I do not think we need to be rigid about this. Let's leave it to you and your preference. The key at this point is not to miss this amazing moment of Communion with our God and the community and to enter into it with heart, body and soul in a way that is best for you.

\*\*Christmas Gloria The Gloria returns to Mass on Christmas Eve as we join the Angels who sang the opening line of the Gloria on that first Christmas Night. Let's prepare to give Glory to God in our Christmas celebrations!


