

Family Discussion of the Week: Pleasing to God

And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3:2)

Adults: Do you think that God was "well pleased" by your actions in recent weeks? Why?

Kids: What good thing could you do this week that would be pleasing to God?

BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

Merry Christmas for the last time this year! Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord which brings to an end the season of Christmas. The Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation or epiphany which occurred on the occasion of His baptism in the Jordan. Jesus descended into the river to sanctify its waters and to give them the power to beget sons and daughters of God. The event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity intervenes.

In the Eastern Church this feast is called Theophany because at the baptism of Christ in the River Jordan God appeared in three persons. The baptism of John was a sort of sacramental preparation for the Baptism of Christ. It moved men to sentiments of repentance and induced them to confess their sins. Christ did not need the baptism of John. Although He appeared in the "substance of our flesh" and was recognized "outwardly like unto ourselves", He was absolutely sinless and impeccable. He conferred upon the water the power of the true Baptism which would remove all the sins of the world: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him Who takes away the sin of the world".

Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism are symbolical of what happened at our Baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become the adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we must pray to avoid actual sin.

May God bless our last weekend of Christmas and our first week of Ordinary Time ahead!

****Appreciation Dinner Postponed** Due to the present challenges of group gatherings we are going to postpone the annual Appreciation Dinner until the summer when we can possibly go outside or at least be out of "COVID Season." ****Epiphany Home Blessing Cards** The House Blessing Cards have arrived. Recall that the "20+C+M+B+22" on the cards stands for the present year with the first letter of the 3 magi, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, which can also stand for the first letters of the Latin phrase "Christus Mansionem Benedic" which translates to "Christ bless this home/dwelling." There is a prayer that you are encouraged to say on the back of the card as you place them over the main door to your house on the inside. It says- "May all who come to our home rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve Christ in everyone we meet. Amen." Every year I say what a great year we will have if we can allow God to accomplish that prayer in us in our homes as well as our parish family here at Our Lady of Peace. So let us focus on that this last week of the Christmas Season and in 2022.

****Christmas Gift "Living Joy" by Chris Stefanick** If you were not at OLP for Christmas, you are encouraged to take a copy of this book located in the main vestibule for your household as a small gift from your parish. Chris Stefanick is a world renown author in our Catholic faith and tradition. You can also watch him on FORMED which our parish has a subscription to. I thank Warren and Christine Beaver and Mike and Mary Beth Whitman who generously covered the financial cost of the books.

****Pilgrimages to England in July 2022 and the Holy Land in November of 2023** I realize with COVID it is hard to commit to the 2022 pilgrimage to England but I wanted to remind you that there is insurance you can purchase for both trips in case you have to cancel. My hope is to stick with both trips regardless of whether we reach our goal of 40 pilgrims for each. 206 Tours who is handling the organization of both pilgrimages has said they hope to run both and want to wait until spring to see where things stand for England.



It is important for parents to talk to their child about safety in online gaming. Some important questions to ask are: Have you ever been cyberbullied while gaming? Do you know what information is OK to share about yourself while gaming? Has anyone talked about sex while you were gaming or asked you to send pictures of yourself?
